1. Introductions and welcome

- Welcome from Cllr Martin Veal, Cabinet Member for Community Services Bath & North East Somerset Council
- Setting the scene background & context
- Video about Connecting Communities the importance of local engagement.
- It was asked how a Bathavon Forum might overlap with the Valley Parish Alliance which
 includes parishes from Wiltshire. Agreed it was important not to duplicate efforts so
 minutes from all meetings of both bodies should be available online to members. B & NES
 officers will contact Wiltshire CC to see how they want to collaborate.
- Somer Valley Forum was named as being a good example of successful partnership working across boundaries.

2. Introduction to the Facilitated Workshop – Rowena Harris

Purpose – the Forums have been designed to provide a stronger voice for the community and help improve engagement with the public sector partners. The workshop aimed to help the Forums consider different ways of working together on specific ideas, gain a better understanding of what partners can offer and review the influence and effectiveness of the Forums for the future.

- **a. What's already happening?** The Forums could provide ways of exchanging information: people were asked to bring posters or a pre-written postcard/notes to tell other people in the area about things planned or underway to improve things in their community.
- **b. What issues concern you NOW and what ideas do you have to make a change?** People were encouraged to write on post it notes under the following headings:
 - 1. Health & Wellbeing
 - 2. Transport
 - 3. New housing and infrastructure developments
 - 4. Environmental Sustainability & Climate Change
 - 5. Skills and Jobs
 - 6. Stronger and Safer Communities
 - 7. Education
 - 8. Young people
 - 9. Older People

These post it notes were typed up and are included in the next section of this report. Transport is clearly the priority issue for Bathavon as well as a need for better information sharing and community engagement.

- **c. Action Planning**: the attendees were asked to propose what they wanted to discuss further in small groups. Three themes were suggested and a lead was nominated for each to ensure action is taken forward:
 - Influencing Transport Decisions leads: Dave Dixon, Andrew Pate, David Trethewey (B & NES)
 - Getting more input from our communities: how to improve communication between Parish Councils and parishioners lead: Robert Law
 - Better communication with B & NES, training and development for new Parish Councillors & Clerks - lead: David Trethewey & Andy Thomas - Strategy and Development B & NES Council

Detailed notes and actions agreed in each discussion are included in the next section of this report. The 'Lead' will report back on progress at the next Forum meeting.

3. Closing words

- Attendees were urged to ensure a meaningful agenda for the Forum by becoming active members (not waiting for B & NES to lead), also to invite others to attend the next meeting
- B & NES will support the formation of the Forum by organising the next meeting at the end of September and developing a communications plan to ensure key agencies are invited

What's already happening in Bathavon?





What issues concern you most at the moment and what ideas do you have to make a change?

Post - it notes as follows

Health & Wellbeing

- suggest improved integration in delivery of health promotion activities (currently within Healthy Lifestyles) & other agencies
- encourage more referrals to healthy lifestyle services to reduce ill health and improve well being
- take opportunities to encourage use of cycling and of river for canoeing
- we are lucky to have a village surgery and NHS dentist
- excellent health care system in Bathford via Coalpit Road Surgery

- encourage others to meet together
- there's a new Wellbeing College run by CURO and Sirona to reduce mental health admissions





• Transport

- can we have contact points in B & NES e.g. I want to discuss a highways issue
- need more affordable public transport and a more regular reliable service
- encourage use of public transport
- subsidise taxi fares for elderly & unemployed to keep appointments
- bus fares in B & NES are inconsistent e.g. it costs more for a family to travel from Peasedown to MSN than from Peasedown to Bath
- action on bus fares too high for families
- affordable public transport would significantly reduce car use in & out of Bath, cheaper than park & ride
- worried that valley will be sacrificed to help Bath traffic problems without proper consideration of evidence
- speed limits along Warminster Road A36. No repeater signs are lighting therefore most lorries & cars speed
- problems on the London Road lorries, bikes, danger zone area

- A36 open after 2nd slippage closure in 10 years so do not consider A36/A46 link - alternative A350
- Batheaston: major problem of heavy goods vehicles accessing Colerne airfield warehouses in Wiltshire - Wiltshire CC not sympathetic historically
- Batheaston: traffic having to use London Rd into Bath enroute from North & east towards Southampton area

New housing and infrastructure developments

- concerns over student housing in Bath. Residents affected maybe feeling left out & going to other areas like Trowbridge
- no mechanism for low cost housing to be allocated to local people with connection to the Parish. People have to learn about community and support mechanisms
- more affordable housing, control student housing
- developments including affordable houses eleven planning permission s----not return to DCC to reduce no (sorry hard to read this writing!)
- infill housing rather than 'developer' led wholesale coverage of land infrastructure must include good road links, housing should be varied in
 design
- Foxhill development: 700 houses? Combe Down traffic

Environmental Sustainability & Climate Change

- Bath City Farm & Sirona run growing & horticulture course & there are volunteer opportunities
- Forest school available: outdoor/growing education
- Bath Area Growers education about growing food
- we should encourage sustainable energy but it should be from commercial companies (apologies could not read rest of message)

Skills and Jobs

- we are a dormitory village: no real jobs, hard to keep shop open, do we just accept this?
- jobs and apprenticeships for adults change of career or for those who have been unemployed
- children's centres can offer volunteer opportunities for individuals looking to enhance skills BUT a coordinated approach with other agencies to support this is needed
- 2 universities, low paid jobs (could not read rest of writing)
- use people who have practised skills of all types to pass on to others skills audit

Stronger and Safer Communities

- improved information sharing between agencies is needed to support understanding of work being done, greater efficiency & savings
- sharing of information/issues between partner agencies and public
- need much better information on works planned by B & NES Highways so that we can influence & communicate to the community
- our community is ageing but young families are coming in how do we connect the two befriending? Adopt a Granny?
- actively look out for your neighbours get to know them, even if you are chalk & cheese!

- Bathford PC last year held a speed watch programme although did not catch any one speeding it was worthwhile as cars slowed down when they saw a speed gun
- 2 tunnels open lots of cyclists in country lanes crash hats, parents ahead, behind, on the right please

Education

- Children's Centre interested in offering placements to Secondary School children for work experience e.g. admin, child care
- not all children should attend school on the other side of the city TRAFFIC
- boat population are full time residents especially if they have children in school.
 Do they count when we decide on resources e.g. schools, doctors etc
- Batheaston: village school unable to admit some local children while others are driven into village from Wiltshire - more traffic!!
- Bathampton: village school can't accommodate all local children

Young people

- village facilities for young people so they can meet. Villages seldom have a cafe/bar for them
- Batheaston PC stepped in to increase support for youth club when B&NES withdrew support in 2011 but major commitment from precept. Over 1000 young people use the facility twice a week
- concern that some young people heading down the wrong road and could do with early intervention
- Bathford have club for young people held in church, also hoping to make use of the school

Older People

- health visitor service has a new preventative role for elderly
- Bathavon North lots of elderly people could do with support could provide a 'village agent' to support and signpost to services
- we have venues which could be used for gatherings: tea & cakes, bingo etc

Other

- Bathford shop is hoping to have a cycle rack outside
- Valley Parish Alliance (VPA) works well because we have a shared interest in protecting the valley
- if easier to access river moorings will benefit all
- there is a training programme for new Parish Councillors which I enjoyed 2 years ago
- how about inductions for Parish Councillors (not ALCA/ how to be a PC) ie how
 B & NES works, these are the people you can contact etc
- can we have newsletters for Parish Councils so we know what is coming up
- is there a central register of organisations & companies who offer volunteers for community activities?

The issues raised on the post it notes could be reviewed at a future meeting of the Forum.

Further comments:

- problem of division in villages always the 'usual suspects' turn out for meetings
- Batheaston PC changed from 'public may attend and may speak' towards actively inviting local groups and encouraging more discussion
- go to where people already meet don't expect them to come to you until they know it's worth it
- knock on doors have face to face conversations about issues
- get a list of contacts of all group leaders in the Parish
- use social media
- map it out: work out who needs to have a greater voice on a particular issue and how best to involve them (different strokes for different folks)
- give people a chance to submit questions before the meeting as many fear speaking out in public
- provide cards to fill in a personal view so it can be taken into account even if they can't attend the meeting
- B & NES is looking at developing an online Connecting Communities Forum- could be useful but face to face communication is less open to misunderstandings
- in larger Parishes PC'S have asked Councillors to take on representing a specific area (usually not where they live)
- at the other Connecting Community Forums there is an open session at the beginning of each meeting when anyone can ask a question in advance. There are templates that all Forums can use

2. Better communication between B & NES and Parishes and better induction for new councillors

What benefit will this idea bring to the community?

- improved connection between B & NES & PC's
- greater awareness of issues
- knowledge and information sharing
- best practice

- more information to PC's from B & NES show-casing good projects, clarifying lines of communication

- need further discussion about transport with the right people at a strategic level

- there are other specific issues in Bathavon which are not covered by VP
- should be a B& NES rep on the VPA
- address high bus fares increase bus use, reduce traffic

Draft Terms of Reference Bathavon Forum

1. Name and Area of Benefit

- 1.1 The name shall be the Bathavon Forum
- 1.2 The Bathavon Forum will cover the twenty-one Parishes of:-

Bathampton, Batheaston, Bathford, Camerton, Charlcombe, Claverton, Combe Hay, Dunkerton, Englishcombe, Freshford, Hinton Charterhouse, Kelston, Monkton Combe, Newton St Loe, North Stoke, Priston, Shoscombe, South Stoke and Midford, St Catherine, Swainswick, Wellow

1.3 Corresponding Members will be:-

Limpley Stoke, Winsley, Westwood

2. Background

- 2.1 The Bathavon Forum is part of an initiative that aims to improve the external engagement of the Council and its partners by bringing together neighbourhoods, villages and towns to reflect local issues and priorities.
- 2.2 Whilst creating operational boundaries, it is also important in identifying local priorities and bringing together local communities where there are shared and common issues.
- 2.3 Each area of the initiative will be supported by a local 'Forum' that will work together to improve local engagement, join up services and foster communication so local people receive better outcomes.
- 2.4 Each Forum may collaborate with other Forums to share good practice and engage in wider discussions. This collaborative approach is designed to secure involvement of stakeholders and local residents.

3. Aims and Objectives

- 3.1 The overall aim is to provide a mechanism for collaboration between communities and public bodies; including Bath and North East Somerset Council and members of the Public Services Board; in order to improve local engagement, join up services and foster communication so local people receive better outcomes.
- 3.2 The objectives are to:-
 - Involve residents and organisations by seeking their views and encouraging them to participate in improving their quality of life
 - Identify common issues across this area and debate local priorities
 - Discuss how organisations, including this Forum, will work most effectively together to respond to the local priorities and take action where appropriate Page 13

• Influence wider policy developments and encourage meaningful conversation

4. Key principles

- 4.1 All voting and non-voting members of the Bathavon Forum agree to follow the five key principles of the Connecting Communities programme which are:-
 - To **listen** always being open to ideas.
 - To **prioritise** making sure local needs come first.
 - To **join up** working in partnership with our local communities.
 - To work collaboratively helping communities find the best way to tackle local issues.
 - To share ideas building on what works.

5. Membership

- 5.1 Each member must agree to the aims and objectives and key principles set out in 3 and 4 above.
- 5.2 The core membership of the Forum will be:-
 - Officer representatives from the following services:-
 - Avon and Somerset Constabulary
 - Avon Fire and Rescue Service
 - Curo
 - NHS Bath and North East Somerset
 - Bath & North East Somerset Council
 - B&NES Healthwatch
 - All B&NES elected ward members in the Bathavon Forum area
 - Representatives from all the Parish Council in the Bathavon Forum area
- 5.3 Further members may be drawn from voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations and local business, within the area of benefit as defined in 1.2
- 5.4 Representatives from the Valley Parish Alliance will be invited to attend the meeting and other representatives from neighbouring local authorities or partnership bodies may be invited to attend meetings if appropriate.
- 5.5 Organisations must demonstrate their understanding of local needs and have a willingness to work together to support the aims of the Forum.
- 5.6 Meetings of the Bathavon Forum shall be open to the public. A notice of every meeting will be placed on Bath and North East Somerset Council's web meeting diary. All members of the Bathavon Forum will be requested to promote all meetings to

- encourage wider engagement. Members of the public may speak/participate at the Chair's discretion.
- 5.8 An organisation may apply to become a member of the Bathavon Forum and this shall be considered at the Forum AGM, subject to a maximum number of 50 members.
- 5.9 The Secretarial support role will be carried out by Bath & North East Somerset Council, Strategy and Performance Service.

6. Role of the Chair and Vice Chair

- 6.1 The Chair and Vice Chair will be elected from the voting membership set out above. They shall act independently and work on behalf of the Forum for the wider benefit.
- 6.2 The Chair and Vice Chair will meet with the relevant officers of Bath and North East Somerset Council to propose agendas, discuss how issues might be resolved and report to the Forum as appropriate.

7. Working Methods

- 7.1 The Bathavon Forum will meet at least three times a year, one of which meetings shall be an Annual General Meeting.
- 7.2 A minimum number of ten members should be in attendance at any meeting where a vote is required.
- 7.3 If there are not enough members in attendance, the meeting will be adjourned for thirty minutes deeming the reconvened meeting as being quorate, irrespective of the number of people who are in attendance.
- 7.4 Agendas and papers for meetings will be circulated a minimum of seven calendar days before a meeting. A record of each meeting will be taken.
- 7.5 Members of the Forum will be invited to submit Agenda items to the Chair in advance of the meeting.
- 7.6 Every member of the Bathavon Forum shall be accorded the same degree of respect, dignity and consideration by all other members, irrespective of people's protected characteristics: age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex and sexual orientation and with regard to equalities legislation.

8. Agenda Planning

- 8.1. The Bathavon Forum will adopt a core agenda for ordinary meetings as follows:-
 - Welcome, Introductions and Apologies
 - Minutes of the Last Meeting
 - Matters Arising
 - Standing Items (eg Community Safety, Transportation)
 - Parish and Community Items
 - Consultation Items (eg Council, Police, CCG etc)

9. Area profile

9.1 The Bathavon Forum will establish and keep updated an Area Profile and an Action Plan that aims to inform the priorities for the Forum.

10. Annual General Meetings

- 10.1 The Bathavon Forum will hold an Annual General Meeting each year or within fourteen months of the anniversary of the inaugural meeting.
- 10.2 The Bathavon Forum will elect a Chair and Vice-Chair at its first inaugural meeting. These positions will be held for one year and thereafter elections will take place at the Annual General Meeting.
- 10.3 At the first inaugural meeting and subsequent AGM meetings, the Bathavon Forum shall:
 - i. Elect the Chair and Vice Chair
 - ii. Review the Terms of Reference
 - iii. Agree additional membership as necessary subject to 5.3 and 5.8
 - iv. Agree an Agenda Plan and Meeting Schedule
 - v. Agree any other working arrangements required for the Forum
 - vi. Consider how to engage more widely
 - vii. Showcase initiatives and share good practice within its own area and within the area across Bath and North East Somerset
- 10.4 The election of the Chair or Vice Chair will be available to only those existing members of the Forum. The existing Chair and Vice Chair may seek re-election.
- 10.5 Nominations for the Chair and Vice Chair may be received prior to and at the AGM. This includes self-nominations for both positions.

11. Voting

- 11.1 The Bathavon Forum will seek to work through the development of consensus.
- 11.2 Decisions, including alterations to the Terms of Reference, will be made by a simple majority vote, subject to the quorum of the meeting (see 7.2 above).

12. Working Parties

- 12.1 The Bathavon Forum may establish from time to time working parties that will be responsible for undertaking specific topics as necessary.
- 12.2 Members of the working parties may co-opt individuals or organisations to join, in an advisory capacity, to support their objectives.
- 12.3 A record of working party meetings will be taken and reported back at the Bathavon Forum meetings.

13. Dissolution

- 13.1 A proposal for dissolution of the Bathavon Forum will require the approval of the minimum number of representatives as set out in 7.2.
- 13.2 All funds, documents and possessions shall be disposed of in accordance with the wishes of the majority of voting members.

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Connecting Communities Draft Action plan 2015


1. About Connecting Communities

Local residents are able to use different methods to inform the Council and public sector partners about the delivery of services. However, what has been lacking is a joined-up approach to planning services for future needs and no consistency when engaging with local communities.

The 'Connecting Communities' programme is an initiative designed to help public service providers understand the needs of the diverse range of people and communities that make up Bath and North East Somerset. The approach has been built around five key principles:

- Listen
- Prioritise
- Join-up
- Work with you and;
- Share ideas

The programme has divided Bath and North East Somerset into five distinct geographical areas: Bath, Bathavon, Chew Valley, Keynsham and Somer Valley.



Each area is supported and represented by a local 'Forum' with the aim of improving engagement between public services and local communities, as well as encouraging local people and communities to talk to each other, share skills/ideas and work together where appropriate.

The Forums aim to bring together the right people at the right time. They do not replace the rights of parish councils and key stakeholders to input into statutory consultations. However they do provide a mechanism for discussion, influence and prioritising what matters most.

2. Progress so far

The development of each Forum is at different stages. This is due to previous partnership arrangements in place, a legacy of regeneration partnerships and local representation on the 'Local Strategic Partnership'. Bath and Bathavon Forum are currently being developed and will be formally established by Autumn 2015.

A rationalisation of other meetings has also taken place. Parish Cluster meetings, which were designed only for Parish Councils to attend and PACT meetings, run by Avon and Somerset Constabulary, have now been disbanded. Issues raised at these meetings can now be raised at the informal session run at the start of each Forum meeting.

A series of workshops was held in July 2015 for Bathavon, Chew Valley, Keynsham and Somer Valley. The aim of these was to help the Forums consider different ways of working together, a better understanding of what partners can offer and review the influence and effectiveness of the Forums for the future.

The outcomes of the workshops have been worked up into a series of action plans (see Section 4 below 'Action Planning') and draw together previous discussions held by previous partnership arrangements. The action plans will help each Forum focus on what really matters most and help them work together to solve these issues.

3. About each Forum

A series of area profiles have been developed for each of the five areas. This brings together the key facts from the 2011 census data. Each profile provides a snapshot of the local population, how it lives and its characteristics and helps provide a better understand of the area. As new data becomes available each profile will be updated to reflect the current situation.

Bath - The Bath Area consists of sixteen electoral wards. Unlike North East Somerset, the Bath Area does not have parishes or parish councils. It has a resident population of 88,859. It lies 12 miles south-east of Bristol, near the southern edge of the Cotswolds, in a valley of the River Avon, designated as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Bathavon - The Bathavon area consists of 3 electoral wards and 21 parishes and has a usual resident* population of just over 12,600. Geographically it surrounds Bath City and borders South Gloucestershire to the North, Wiltshire to the West and Mendip to the South. The area is largely rural and home to a number of villages. Chew Valley - The Chew Valley Area consists of four electoral wards and 14 parishes, and has a resident population of about 9,983. The Chew Valley lies to the west of Bath and North East Somerset, and has strong links to Bristol. It is a large rural area and identified as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. One of its key features is the Chew Valley Lake, an important site for wildlife which has been dedicated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest and a Special Protection Area. Keynsham Area - Keynsham Area consists of seven electoral wards; one town and seven parishes, and has a resident population of about 24,692. It lies to the north of Bath and North East Somerset, and has strong links to both Bristol and Bath. The largest of the areas, Keynsham, is a market town, which serves a number of the nearby villages. One of its key features is that the physical geography is influenced by the two rivers, Avon and Chew, which converge to the north of the town. Historically the rivers were used as a transport corridor, now the A4 from Bath to Bristol provides the principle vehicular route for the area. Further information can be found at:

Somer Valley - Somer Valley Area consists of eight electoral wards; two towns and six parishes, and has a resident population of about 39,848. It lies to the south of Bath and North East Somerset and has close links with Mendip. The area has strong historical characteristics from a Medieval Market town to the transformation during the industrial revolution. The strength in community and historical identity remains strong. The industrial landscape has been returned to countryside, and the former Somerset and Dorset Railway route provides a cycling route for access to Bath and Frome. 4. Action Planning

A series of workshops were held in July 2015 for Bathavon, Chew Valley, Keynsham and Somer Valley Forum areas. The workshops were run and managed by Independent Facilitators, Rowena Harris and Diana Godwin.

Each workshop included a briefing by Cllr Tim Warren, Leader of the Council and Cabinet Member for Communities and Cllr Martin Veal, Cabinet Member for Community Services about the Council's priorities and future financial challenges.

The workshops were divided into three parts and Forum members were asked to participate in each.

- 1. **What's already happening?** inform others in the area about things planned or sharing best practice.
- 2. What issues concern you now and what ideas do you have to make a change? issues that matter most and ideas to make a change. These were sorted into a series of topics.
- 3. **Action planning** put forward proposals that they wished to discuss further within a small group and agree actions to take forward outside of the meeting.

Detailed notes and actions agreed at each workshop were written up by the Facilitators.

A number of priorities that were identified had a common theme across all Forums areas - the need for increased information sharing and improved community engagement. These are summarised as follows:-

Future formats for Forum meetings

- Increase community involvement in the Forum including local residents and young people
- Training and development for new Parish Councillors & Clerks
- Improve communication between: public services and parish councils; police and residents; parishes council and residents; utilities, highways and the local community and across Forum areas

Other shared issues raised across all the Forum areas included:

- **Children & Young People:** improve the provision of services and facilities for young people.
- **Development and Infrastructure:** ensure the impact of development maintains the identity of the towns, villages and rural setting and ensure sufficient improvements to infrastructure.
- Environmental, Sustainability and Climate Change: encourage sustainable energy better understanding of the benefits and opportunities for environmental sustainability initiatives.
- Health & Wellbeing: increase access to and information about services available.
- **Transport**: the need for affordable and accessible public transport; more community transport solutions; reduction in speeding and volume of traffic and; improved engagement in highway maintenance programmes.

It is recognised that whilst these priorities and common issues are shared across all Forum areas, the action needed may differ dependent upon the needs of each Forum and therefore have been dealt with separately in each Action Plan.

There was one priority that requires discussion across the whole area; the need to improve communication, training and development for new parish councillors and clerks. The action required is detailed below:-
