1 THE ISSUE

1.1 An application has been received for the variation of an existing Premises Licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of Domino's Pizza.

2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the sub committee determine the application to vary the licence.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 There are no financial implications arising from this report.

4 THE REPORT

- 4.1 An application has been received for the variation of a Premises Licence.
- 4.2 The current Premises Licence permits the following licensable activities:
 - 1) Late Night Refreshment between the following hours:

Every Day

23.00 to 01.30 the following morning

2) The **Opening Hours** for the premises are as follows:

Every Day

23.00 to 01.30 the following morning

3) The licence is subject to the following conditions:

- CCTV to be installed and maintained in full working order. CCTV images will be retained for a minimum period of 60 days. CCTV footage will be made available to the Police on request.
- The premises shall have an alarm system which includes panic buttons linked to the local police station.
- Notices to be displayed prominently asking customers to leave quietly and to respect neighbours and their property.
- No more than 5 delivery vehicles are to be in use after 23:30 hours on Sundays and after 01:00 hours Monday to Saturday.
- After midnight, no mopeds are to be used for deliveries.
- All drivers are to have a notice in their car stating "Do not slam car doors, rev engines or play loud music".
- The name and contact number of the store manager is to be displayed in a position where it can be clearly seen by the public without having to enter the store.
- There will be regular rubbish patrols during trading hours and following closure in order to clear away any litter associated with the premises.
- 4.3 The **Variation** application seeks to:

extend the terminal hour in respect of Late Night Refreshment and closing time every day from 01:30 hours **to** 05:00 hours every day.

- 4.4 A site plan is attached at Annex C.
- 4.5 The Licensing Act 2003 (Section 4) states that it is the duty of all Licensing Authorities to carry out their functions under the Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - a) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.
 - b) Public Safety.
 - c) The Prevention of Public Nuisance, and
 - d) The Protection of Children from Harm.

Each objective is of equal importance; there are no other licensing objectives so these four are of paramount consideration at all times. When considering applications/representations/notifications the Licensing Authority will have regard to these licensing objectives.

- 4.6 The Licensing Authority may vary and grant the application with or without additional conditions.
- 4.7 The Licensing Authority can refuse the variation or part of the variation as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 4.8 The Licensing Authority may not however do anything to reduce the effect of the rights guaranteed by the existing premises licence.

- 4.9 Section 4(3) Licensing Act 2003 states that the Licensing Authority should also have regard to the Council's Licensing Policy, the Statutory Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and the Licensing Act itself, and in particular to:
 - a) Paragraphs 3, 5, 6, 9,10, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 23, 24, 28, 30, 33, 35, 36, 37, 41 to 44 inclusive of the policy.
 - b) Chapters 8, 9 and 10 of the Statutory Guidance (as revised October 2010)
 - c) Sections 4, 9, 10, 13, 34, 35, 36, 182 and 183 of the Act.
- 4.10 The Licensing Authority recognises that Licensing and Planning are separate regimes. Where an application is granted by the Licensing Authority which would require planning permission this would not relieve the applicant of the need to obtain that permission. It will still be necessary for the applicant to ensure that he/she has **ALL** the necessary permissions in place to enable them to run the business within the law.
- 4.11 If the application is refused the applicant may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates Court.

If the application is granted the person making the relevant representation may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates Court.

On appeal the court may either dismiss the appeal; substitute the decision appealed against for any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the court. The court may make such order for costs as it thinks fit.

- 4.12 In accordance with the requirements of the Act the applicants served copies of the application upon the Police, the Fire Authority, Environmental Health, Development Control, Trading Standards, and the Child Protection Agency. No representations have been received from any of the Responsible Authorities.
- 4.13 The applicant is required to place a notice at the premises for a period of 28 days starting the day after the application is made and place an advert in a local newspaper within 10 working days of submitting the application to the licensing authority.
- 4.14 A representation has been received from Environmental Health in relation to the prevention of public nuisance objective (Annex D). It raises concern that the applicant's proposals are likely to increase the noise nuisance experienced by local residents to date.
- 4.15 Representations have been received from three interested parties living within the vicinity of the premises, in relation to the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective (Annex E).
- 4.16 This report has not been sent to the Trades Union because they would have no involvement in this application.

5 RISK ASSESSMENT

5.1 A risk assessment related to the issue and recommendations has been undertaken, in compliance with the Council's decision making risk management guidance.

6 EQUALITIES

6.1 An Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA) has been completed. No adverse or other significant issues were found.

7 CONSULTATION

7.1 In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licence and Club Premises Certificate) Regulations 2005, the applicant has given notice of the application to all the relevant Responsible Authorities and has advertised the application in the manner prescribed, both at the premises and within a local publication.

8 ISSUES TO CONSIDER IN REACHING DECISION

- 8.1 When reaching a decision, the licensing authority must carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives.
- 8.2 Consideration must be given to the Human Rights Act 1998 and the "convention rights".

9 ADVICE SOUGHT

9.1 The Council's Monitoring Officer (Divisional Director – Legal & Democratic Services), s.151 Officer (Divisional Director – Finance) and the Divisional Director have had the opportunity to input to this report and have cleared it for publication.

P Describe any additional steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives as a result of the proposed variation:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

With the exception of staff still undergoing training, all staff will be trained in those aspects of their job relating to the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance, and will be aware of those aspects of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 which relate to their role within the business

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

We will not employ any staff unless they have been properly trained in those aspects of their job which may have an impact on crime and disorder. The only exception will be for staff still undergoing training, providing that they are closely supervised when serving customers

CCTV does cover the store inside and outside plus footage shall be kept for a minimum of 60 days, this footage will be made avaible to the Police if they request it at any time

The extended hours will increase natural surveillance of the local area resulting in reduced incidents and opportunities for crime and disorder

c) Public safety

The public Safety side of our business is governed by the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 and in general we well not be doing anything extra to satisfy the requirements of the Licensing act 2003. We will take care not to leave dangerous items such as dinner knives and glass containers within the reach of customers at night, when some of them may have consumed alcohol elsewhere before entering the premises

The premise is covered by CCTV and the alleyway at the side of the store is well lit

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The sale of heated food on our premises does not cause any noise problem in itself.

Our customer door does not bang shut, and that any alert used to signal that the door has been left open does not create a noise problem for neighbours.

1. Relevance of Licensing Conditions:

The store will ensure that the conditions of the Premises Licences are strictly adhered to. The store will be operated to encourage customers to leave as quietly as possible and deliveries to be made as quietly as possible.

2. Notices at Exit:

Highly visible notices are placed at the entrance asking customers to leave quietly and to respect neighbours and their property

3. Delivery vehicles:



- No delivery vehicles will be mopeds after midnight.
- All drivers have a label in their car stating "Do not slam car doors, rev engines or play loud music;
- Any member of staff found to be contravening any of the above policies or otherwise creating a nuisance will be subject to the Company's disciplinary procedures;
- 4. Internal noise:
- No music is played in the store
- All doors and windows are kept shut except for access and egress;
- 5. The name and contact number of the Store Manager is displayed in a position where it can be seen by the public without having to enter the store.

6. Rubbish:

The store sends out a 'Rubbish Patrol' during trading and following closure. They pick up bottles and food wrappings in a designated area. (These are very likely to be from sources other than the store – but they will be collected and disposed of.)

On rare occasions this patrol may be faced with the result of antisocial behaviour such as vomiting and urination. This will be cleared by use with a mop and bucket containing a disinfectant solution and this is unssociated with our use but the cause of third party premises, we are merely benefitting the local area by clearing up the mess.

7. Staff:

Consideration will be given to procedures for staff departures at the end of the evening.

8. Training:

Training at all levels will be conducted to ensure understanding and implementation of this plan.

e) The protection of children from harm

The sale of heated food has no direct relevance to protecting children from harm and we will discharge our responsibilities under the Licensing Act simply by being good citizens.



Dear Sir or Madam

I live . I am generally affected by all sort of activities and disturbance coming from the London road. This affects rooms at the front of the house. The back of my property is also facing Snowhill estate and the premises of Dominoes are only a few meters away. I have therefore a direct interest to summit my objections to the variation of the opening hours of Dominoes Pizzas so that the shop is not allowed to open until 5:00am at any day of the week.

I would like these objections to remain anonimous to the applicants.

My main concerns are the following:

- Noisecoming from the London Rd travels easily to the top of Thomas Street as it is amplified and reverberates in Thomas street against the buildings. We are affected by traffic noise and pollution during the day because of the traffic on the London road. At night it is quiet and the traffic is almost none existant. It is also a residential area and the noise at present is kept minimal in the night and we would not expect the Council to encourage this to change. The late opening of the Dominoes shop will automatically generates more traffic and noise from customers whether because of their cars or simply walking along the London Road into the shop, talking among friends or on the phone in the middle of the night. Can anyone also believe, particularly in the hot summer months that customers will wait inside the shop to get their pizzas and food cooked? It is very more likely they will be waiting just outside of the shop chatting amongh friends or on the phone. Unfortunately we will be directly affected by this noise, not once but all night througth and all week which is unfair, particularly in an area that is residential.
- Dominoes record on customers' parking their cars is not a good one. Custumers cars or delivery trucks have been spotted parked on the pavement, just in front of the shop, on double yellow line, blocking the traffic and the pavement for pedestrians. Trees have been planted just outside Dominoes but it has not solved the problem; it just moved it away from the shopfront to a few meters away just in front of Caroline House where customers or Dominoes HGV are now stopping along the London Road. Please can you picture this happening in the middle of the night for customers to go on buying pizzas, parking their cars on the pavement, doors opening and shutting closed, radio and musics on (windows opened in the summer months!), security locks beeping, switching on/off engines etc. As it is happening already now during the day, it is hard to believe that Dominoes staff will be able to police their customers to reduce further noise polution that will happen from now on in the middle of the night as well as in the day? Will staff be able leave the premises and the shop to "tell off" their customers outside? Do they have any authority to do so anyway?
- My other concern is the affect the late openings will have on the rooms at the back of my house where the children are sleeping. Dominoes shop is a very short distance away from the house. I am particularly concerned because we open the windows in the spring and summer months at night; the pollution from the traffic on the London road is too high to do it during the day. It is also better to do it at night because as hay asthma sufferers, the pollen level is much lower at night. Despite what Dominoes management may have told you already, there is some irritating noise generated at the back of the



shop, from the delivery cars or moppeds, coming and going (usually in a rush so the noise is not kept to a strick minimum), beeps to open/locking the cars, doors being slammed, switching on/off engines etc. There is also mobiles ringing, the inevitable chats/cigarette break outside at the back that is affecting all local residents. It is also very likely that in the summer months customers will be waiting for their pizzas and food to be prepared, not inside Dominoes shop but standing outside the front door in the alleyway, while having a talk or a chat on the phone. Finally there is the constant humming noise of the kitchen equipments such as fridge, ventilation etc. that we will be hearing from the bedrooms all night while at the moment this noise is sort of covered by the buzz of the city or the high level day traffic noise of the London Road. So how does this noise coming from Dominoes cannot not affect the quality of our life and our sleep? When will the kids be able to have a rest at night while the noise carries days and night?

- The localcommunity has worked very hard to improve the area and fight crime or any nuisance at night. Good things have happened to improve the area but there is still a lot to be accomplished and this positive trend can easily be derailed. Considering the history of the place and of the London Road, giving an opportunity for people to gather in the middle of the night in this particular location would be particularly unwise as well as very inconsiderate to the local community and in my view would be a dangerous thing to do. Should the variation of the opening hours is accepted it is also likely to antagonise the already very fragiled relationship that exists between the Council and its local residents. Bearing in mind the general state of the public finances will the local Police have the resources to face with additional troublesome situations or complaints from residents?
- Dominoes attitude is not acceptable. At local meetings, the local community has already expressed dismay at the shop behaviour and the relationship (of absence of it) with the residents and we have already clearly voiced our opposition to late openings. It is a pity that Dominoes is reiterating one more time an application for late opening and that we are forced once more time to express our strong feelings to object it. I hope that the points I made above will be taken into consideration so that Dominoes's application for a variation of their license to be able to open late at night, all day until 5:00am is rejected.
