1 THE ISSUE

1.1 An application has been received for the variation of an existing Premises Licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of **The Nest, 7 Bladud Buildings, Bath BA1 5LS** (Annex A).

2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the Licensing Sub-Committee determines the application.

3 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCE, PROPERTY, PEOPLE)

3.1 The costs of processing licences are covered by the fees charged. The fee for this application is £190.00.

4 STATUTORY CONSIDERATIONS AND BASIS FOR PROPOSAL

- 4.1 An Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA) has been completed. No adverse or other significant issues were found.
- 4.2 Consideration must be given to the Human Rights Act 1998 and the "convention rights".
- 4.3 The Sub-Committee has been delegated authority to determine the application on behalf of the Licensing Authority in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.4 When reaching a decision, the Licensing Authority must carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives.

5 THE REPORT

- 5.1 An application has been received to vary an existing premises licence (Annex A).
- 5.2 The current premises licence as detailed in *Annex B*, authorises the following:
 - 1) The Sale of Alcohol, for consumption on and off the premises:

Monday to Saturday: 10:00 - 02:00

Sunday: 12:00 - 22:30

2) Performance of dance, indoors only:

Monday to Saturday: 10:00 - 02:00

Sunday: 10:00 - 23:00

3) Exhibition of a film, indoors only:

Monday to Saturday: 10:00 - 02:00

Sunday: 10:00 - 23:00

4) Performance of Live Music, indoors only:

Monday to Saturday: 10:00 - 02:00

Sunday: 10:00 - 00:00

5) Performance of a Play, indoors only:

Monday to Saturday: 10:00 – 02:00

Sunday: 10:00 - 23:00

6) Other Entertainment within the Act, indoors only:

Monday to Saturday: 10:00 - 02:00

Sunday: 10:00 - 23:00

7) Late Night Refreshment, indoors only:

Monday to Saturday: 23:00 - 02:00

8) Non-standard timings for all licensable activities:

"From normal activity start time on New Year's Eve until normal activity finish time on New Year's Day"

"From normal opening times on Sunday's proceeding a Bank Holiday Monday until 02:00 Hours"

9). Opening hours:

Monday to Saturday: 10:00 - 02:30

Sunday: 12:00 - 22:50

Non-standard timings:

"From normal opening time on New Year's Eve until normal opening time on 1st January"

"From normal opening times on Sundays preceding a Bank Holiday Monday until 02:00 hours"

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

 Any individual employed to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

From 6 April 2010:

Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010

• (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children: (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act); (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less; (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring; (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity

of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one
 person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink
 without assistance by reason of a disability). NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT
 APPLY TO OFF SALES.
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

From 1 October 2010:

- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that
 an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of
 alcohol. (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to
 be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to
 produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their
 photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.
- Any individual employed to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- No open containers of alcohol shall leave the premises after 22:00 hours.
- An incident book shall be maintained at the premises in which all incidents of crime and disorder and any ejections by door supervisors shall be recorded. The incident book shall be completed on a daily basis and retained on completion for 12 months and shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.
- A register will be kept on the premises of each door supervisor showing their full name, full SIA badge number & time on and off duty. This register will be retained for 12 months and made immediately available for inspection by the Police and Licensing Authority.
- Staff will be trained regularly in matters concerning illegal drug use and sale of alcohol.
 Records will be kept of the training and made available to the Police and Licensing Authority on request.
- Challenge 21 policy will be implemented.
- Children will only be allowed on the premises until 18:00 hours.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- Noise from regulated entertainment shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance at the nearest noise sensitive premises.
- A CCTV system will be installed at the premises to the satisfaction of the police. The CCTV equipment shall be maintained in working order. The recordings shall be retained for 28 days and made available to the police immediately on request.
- SIA registered door supervisors will be on duty at the premises at the discretion of the DPS or when requested by the police or licensing authority on any such days of the week and between such times as considered necessary in order to promote the licensing objectives. Such measures are to be agreed in writing between the DPS and responsible authority. Door staff will supervise any queuing into the premises and persons leaving. All door staff will wear yellow fluorescent jackets whilst on duty.

5.3 The variation application seeks to:

• Extend the opening hours on Fridays and Saturdays by half an hour, to show:

Fridays and Saturdays: 10:00 - 03:00

• Extend the sale of alcohol timings on Fridays and Saturdays by one hour, to show:

Fridays and Saturdays: 10:00 - 03:00

• Extend the provision of recorded music on Fridays and Saturdays by one hour, to show:

Fridays and Saturdays: 10:00 – 03:00

Remove the condition

"All door staff will wear yellow fluorescent jackets whilst on duty"

- 5.4 A site plan is attached at *Annex C*.
- 5.5 The Licensing Act 2003 (Section 4) states that it is the duty of all Licensing Authorities to carry out their functions under the Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - a) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.
 - b) Public Safety.
 - c) The Prevention of Public Nuisance, and
 - d) The Protection of Children from Harm.

Each objective is of equal importance; there are no other licensing objectives so these four are of paramount consideration at all times. When considering applications, representations or notifications, the Licensing Authority will have regard to these licensing objectives.

- 5.6 The Licensing Authority may vary and grant the application with or without additional conditions if they consider it appropriate and proportionate to do so.
- 5.7 The Licensing Authority can refuse the variation, or part of the variation, for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 5.8 The Licensing Authority may not however do anything to reduce the effect of the rights granted by the existing premises licence.
- 5.9 Section 4(3) Licensing Act 2003 states that the Licensing Authority should also have regard to the Council's Licensing Policy, the Statutory Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and the Licensing Act itself, and in particular to:
 - a) Paragraphs 3, 5, 6, 9, 10, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 23, 24, 28, 30, 33, 35, 36, 37, 41 to 44 inclusive of the policy.
 - b) Chapters 8, 9 and 10 of the Statutory Guidance (as revised June 2013)
 - c) Sections 4, 9, 10, 13, 34, 35, 36, 182 and 183 of the Act.
- 5.10 The Licensing Authority recognises that Licensing and Planning are separate regimes. Where an application is granted by the Licensing Authority which would require planning permission this would not relieve the applicant of the need to obtain that permission. It will still be necessary for the applicant to ensure that he/she has **ALL** the necessary permissions in place to enable them to run the business within the law.
- 5.11 If the application is refused the applicant may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates Court.
 - If the application is granted the person making the relevant representation may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates Court.
 - On appeal the court may either dismiss the appeal; substitute the decision appealed against for any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the court. The court may make such order for costs as it thinks fit.
- 5.12 In accordance with the requirements of the Act the applicants served copies of the application upon the Police, the Fire Authority, Environmental Health, Development Control, Trading Standards, the Health Authority and the Child Protection Agency.
- 5.13 The applicant is required to place a notice at the premises for a period of 28 days starting the day after the application is made and place an advert in a local newspaper within 10 working days of submitting the application to the licensing authority.
- 5.14 A representation has been received from the **Avon & Somerset Constabulary** in respect of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder licensing objective. The representation states that the application is premature and overly ambitious because of concerns of drugs, crime and disorder, noise, drunkenness and anti-social behaviour associated in and around the premises (*Annex D*).
- 5.15 A representation has been received from Environmental Health Authority in respect of the Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objective. It details that the Environmental Protection department have received numerous (11) complaints from local residents concerning noise and anti-social behaviour from the premises. Investigations concluded that music levels did not constitute a Statutory Nuisance as defined in the Environmental Protection Act 1990 s79 1(g), however the levels did cause a nuisance and the following condition is attached to the premises licence:

"Noise from regulated entertainment shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance at the nearest noise sensitive premises".

(Annex E)

5.16 A joint representation has been received from **The Abbey Residents' Association** (TARA) and **The Circus Area Residents' Association** (CARA) in respect of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety licensing objectives.

The representation expresses concern that the granting of this application will undermine the aforementioned licensing objectives (*Annex F*).

- 5.17 The premises lies within the cumulative impact area. As representations have been received there is a presumption that the application will be refused unless the applicant can demonstrate that the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact already being experienced.
- 5.18 This report has not been sent to the Trades Union because they would have no involvement in this application.

6 RATIONALE

6.1 As relevant representations have been received the Licensing Sub-Committee must determine the application in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.

7 OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

7.1 None\

8 CONSULTATION

8.1 In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licence and Club Premises Certificate) Regulations 2005, the applicant has given notice of the application to all the relevant Responsible Authorities and has advertised the application in the manner prescribed, both at the premises and within a local publication.

9 RISK MANAGEMENT

9.1 A risk assessment related to the issue and the recommendations has been undertaken in compliance with the Council's decision making risk management guidance.

10 ADVICE SOUGHT

10.1 The Council's Monitoring Officer (Divisional Director – Legal & Democratic Services), s.151 Officer (Divisional Director – Finance) and the Divisional Director have had the opportunity to input to this report and have cleared it for publication.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

Fridays and Saturdays are our two busiest nights of the week, on both nights at 02:00 hours 300 people leave the premises, we are proposing to extend our licensable activity hours to allow the gradual disperse of customers as well as increasing business revenue. We have proposed a number of conditions which we believe will ensure that this application will not add to the cumulative impact.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Toilet checks will be carried out every 20 minutes on Fridays and Saturdays after 23:00hrs and a 'log book' will be kept and made available to police on request.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children: (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act); (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less; (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring; (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability). NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

From 1 October 2010:

- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied

having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

On two occasions I have conducted surface swabs at The Nest in order to establish levels of drug trace within the premise.

These swabs were later analysed on a GE Ion Trap Mobility Spectrometer. This device measures for most narcotic substances and interprets its results as a numerical reading.

A reading of 1-3 would be interpreted as trace contact only and would indicate that a substance has been transferred between surfaces.

A reading of 3-4 would indicate a higher level surface transfer or a low level direct transfer.

A reading of 4 plus would indicate direct contact with that substance on the surface.

On Thursday 28th November 2013 I visited The Nest as part of a multi agency licensing visit and conducted surface swabs. The results of that visit are presented below.

I also conducted research into the numbers of recorded incidents of suspected criminality reported during the sample period for George Street itself and the bars and nightclubs contained within the immediate vicinity of The Nest. I have included only incidents which can be linked to the night time economy and have excluded any incidents that can be associated with The Nest as these have been accounted for earlier in the document.

82 incidents of suspected criminality were recorded during the sample period. Of these 31 cannot be specifically linked to any one premise and have been recorded as having occurred on the street.

Furthermore 19 of these incidents have occurred in the period 0200-0500.

158 calls were made to police during the sample period which can be attributed to the night time economy, of these 86 were made during the period 0200-0500.

My name is Nigel Shire and I am an Evironmental Health officer working within the Environmental Protection service at Bath and North East Somerset Council.

During the past 8 months the Environmental Protection service has received numorous complaints (11) concerning noise and anti social behaviour from this premise.

The complaints received, detailed noise from music from the club and noise from patrons on the street to the front of the premise, whilst queueing to gain access or using the street for the purpose of smoking. All of the complaints made reference to activities causing nuisance throughout the operating times of the premise, but particularily after 00.00 and until 02.30. As part of my investigation noise monitoring equipment was installed at residents property to capture the alleged nuisance and on one occasion recordings indicated of licensing activities taken place outside of the permited hours for licensable activities.

Investigations concluded that although the music levels did not constitute a Statutory Nuisance as defined under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 s79 1(g), the levels did cause nuisance.

The existing premise license has a condition attached that states

"Noise from regulated entertainment shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance at the nearest noise sensitive premises"

The owners Rod and Max Johnson along with the manager Harry Cochrane attended Banes offices in Lewis house on 18.12.2013 to listen to recordings of the music levels taken at complainants residences using a sound level monitor and agreement to control the levels using an existing "limiter" was agreed. This was instigated on the 20.01.2014.

Subjective noise assessments were conducted prior to the extension of the use of the existing "limiter" within the stairwell of 6 Bladud buildings and afterwards, the conclusion was that after the installation of the "limiter" a significant improvement in respect of volume from music was experienced.

Other concerns identified by residents in the vicinity of The Nest included the noise from patrons on the street to the front of the premise. Under current legislation this service is unable to take action in regard to noise on the street, unless created by vehicles, machinery or equipment.

The applicant has offered several conditions to address the prevention of public nuisance:

My concerns are that unless the above are incorporated as conditions on the premise license then local residents may be subjected to increased levels of noise from both the premise music levels and

[&]quot;The smoking area will close at 02.00hrs."

[&]quot;There will be a no entry and no re-entry on Fridays & Saturdays after 02.00hrs"

[&]quot;Amplified live music will cease at 23.00 hours every day"

[&]quot;All recorded music to go through a noise level limiter"

patrons using the exterior area to the front of the premise.

Currently the noise level limiter has been independently set to reduce the impact of excessive music volume on residents, I would therefore propose that the noise level limiter be formally set at an agreed level with officers from the Environmental Protection Service to promote the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective.

The applicant has offered a condition that "signage will be displayed in the front windows of the premise asking people to keep noise levels down"

I would suggest that the doorstaff are required to assist in the controlling of noise on the street from patrons to support the signage and the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective.

Other concerns relate to the dispersal of patrons leaving the premises, the applicant has stated that the extension of the licensing activity hours if granted will allow the gradual dispersal of customers, I fail to see how the premise can guarantee this gradual dispersal. The likelihood is that customers will remain in situ until the proposed end of licensing activities and disperse on masse at 03.00. similar to the existing situation at 02.00.

The applicant has offered that a dispersal policy will be written and implemented on Fridays and Saturdays. This policy will need to be robust and detail measures to move customers on, control the volume and prevent any anti-social behaviour (foul language, violence, urinating..etc.). I would suggest that this policy also ensures that adequate doorstaff are on duty for a minimum of one hour after licensable activities cease in the outside area of the premise to promote the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective.


Therefore I would request that the licensing sub committee consider granting a temporary variation for a period of six months to enable the assessment and effectiveness of any control measures with respect to noise nuisance.

This representation is on behalf of both the Abbey Residents' Association (TARA) and the Circus Area Residents' Association (CARA) who both have members living near and affected by the trading of these premises

These premises are, as we understand it, subject to the cumulative impact policy.

The premises are very close to a number of noise and nuisance sensitive residential premises and both we, and as we understand it the local authority, have received numerous complaints regarding noise and nuisance associated with these premises and in particular from the noisy crowds who regularly stand outside. Many people in these crowds appear to us to be drunk. On one occasion we observed someone in a group leaving these premises with a pint glass of what appeared to be lager and walk up George Street to join his friend in the crowd outside Moles which led us to further question the management of crowds and drinking at these premises.

The offer at these premises is based on vertical drinking and often highly amplified music, see attached pictures.

These premises sit at the end of the George Street area. This area until recently was regarded as the worst area in Bath for drink fuelled anti-social behavior Hard work by a number of organisations and agencies and in particular by licencing officers and the licensing committee have started to turn this area around. This improvement has been achieved by encouraging more responsible proprietors and managers, more effective enforcement and much tighter better structured conditions. It would be regrettable if this progress was undermined by allowing a these premises to extend their hours of operations.
