To prevent crime and disorder	yes	<p>The premises are situated within the High St at Midsomer Norton.</p> <p>The premises were subject to an expedited review on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2014 at which hearing this committee placed a number of interim conditions on the licence.</p> <p>A covert Policing operation was run at the Wunderbar between 2/11/2013 and 8/3/2014.</p> <p>The objective of the operation was to:</p> <p>To provide intelligence and evidence in relation to the illegal activities of the criminal fraternity in Norton – Radstock, namely the supply of controlled drugs, the handling of stolen goods and any associated acquisitive crime.</p> <p>To provide intelligence and evidence in relation to licensing breaches and any associated anti-social behaviour.</p>

A scoping Profile containing licence details management/DPS for the Wunderbar. There is also an overview of all calls. Recorded crimes and intelligence reports received from, or directly related to, the Wunderbar, over a period of nearly 12 months ( 01.04.2013 – 25.03.2014 ) There is a summary for each crime ( Guardian incident) recorded at Wunderbar and each call (webstorm log) received by the Police during this period. ( see Fig 1) During the operation a considerable number of deals of class A,B and C drugs were made to covert Police officers at Wunderbar.

In the premises itself there were 9 occasions where drugs were purchased by covert officers. In the immediate vicinity there were 2 occasions where drugs were purchased by covert officers and a further 10 occasions on the High Street in Midsomer Norton.( see area map) The type of drugs predominately supplied during the operation were MDMA and cocaine, which are both Class A controlled drugs.( see Fig 2)

As a result of this operation there are 6 suspects that have supplied controlled drugs of various classifications within the Wunderbar premises, There has been a further suspect who has supplied drugs in the street outside of the premises.

The criminal investigation may take some considerable time to finalise.


There has been a gross failure to promote the licensing objectives in respect of the prevention of crime. The licence holder and manager have been made aware of Police concerns in relation to drugs at the premises. On Friday 17<sup>th</sup> January 2014 Sergeant Cannon expressed his concerns to the management as a result of which door supervisors were employed.( See Fig 3 ) There has been occasions where drugs have been openly taken in full view of bar staff and dealing in full view of door supervisors with no intervention.( see statement of Natalie George) this demonstrates a total disregard for the licensing objectives and a lack of duty of care to other customers and suggests this is the norm. The management need to take steps to rid the premises of this activity and culture in support of the residents of the area and to further the licensing objectives. The conditions

CCTV shall be installed to the satisfaction of the Police and maintained in good working order. All cameras shall record continuously during trading hours and for one hour afterwards. The time and date shall be displayed on the recordings. Recordings shall be maintained for a period of 31 days and made available to the Police or Licensing Authority for evidential purposes on request. If the CCTV equipment fails, the Police and Licensing Authority must be informed as soon as possible and immediate steps shall be taken to effect a repair. A notice shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises advising that CCTV is in operation.</li> <li>2. An incident book shall be maintained at the premises with all incidents of crime and disorder and any ejections by door supervisors shall be recorded. The incident book shall be completed on a daily basis regardless of whether any incidents have taken place. The incident book shall be retained on completion for 12 months and shall be made available to the Police and Licensing Authority.</li><li>6. A personal licence holder shall be on the premises during all opening hours.</li><li>7. All staff will be regularly trained in matters concerning illegal drug use and sale of alcohol and records kept of such training. **28.10.2011 – PS461 CANNON.** Entered premises via rear garden which was quite busy with customers mostly seated at tables. Inside we were met by Lucy Milner, one of the premises licence holders and manager. DPS James Bull was not available.

Part B summary of licence displayed at the bar and part A available upon request. The number of customers in the basement this evening was much less than on previous licensing visits. Some of the clientele looked very young, but were not under-age. Lucy advised us that she remains vigilant, and constantly requests ID.

With the exception of the mandatory conditions, there is only one condition attached to this licence and that is "no live music after 23:30".

No licensing issues during this visit.

## SECTION TWO - Premises Summary

The Wunderbar is a live music cellar bar situated on the High Street in Midsomer Norton. The High Street is notorious for anti-social behaviour and violent crime linked to the Night Time Economy, especially on the weekends, due to the number of licensed bars/clubs and takeaways in close vicinity to each other.

The licence for Wunderbar is held by Mr James Bull 13.01.65 and Miss Lucy Milner 17.09.83 BULL held the licence with Stewart Black from 2005-2009 when he was removed and Lucy Milner was added .

Mr James Bull is the DPS for the premises.



### **SECTION THREE - Intelligence Summary**

From 2006 to date there have been 13 intelligence reports submitted which have been directly linked to Wunderbar on Guardian. 4 of these within the last year relate to drug use and dealing at the premises (Cannabis and Ketamine).

Historic intelligence reports suggest underage drinking, nominals of concern to the Police frequenting the premises and breaches of licence.

## SECTION FOUR - Incident Overview and Summaries (Guardian)

There have been 4 reported offences at Wunderbar between 01/04/2013 and 25/03/2014. Two offences for possession of cannabis, 1 theft of a mobile phone and 1 assault.

I have used the other licensed premises in Midsomer Norton as a comparable for violent crime figures. These premises are mainly located on the High Street in Midsomer Norton. They are :

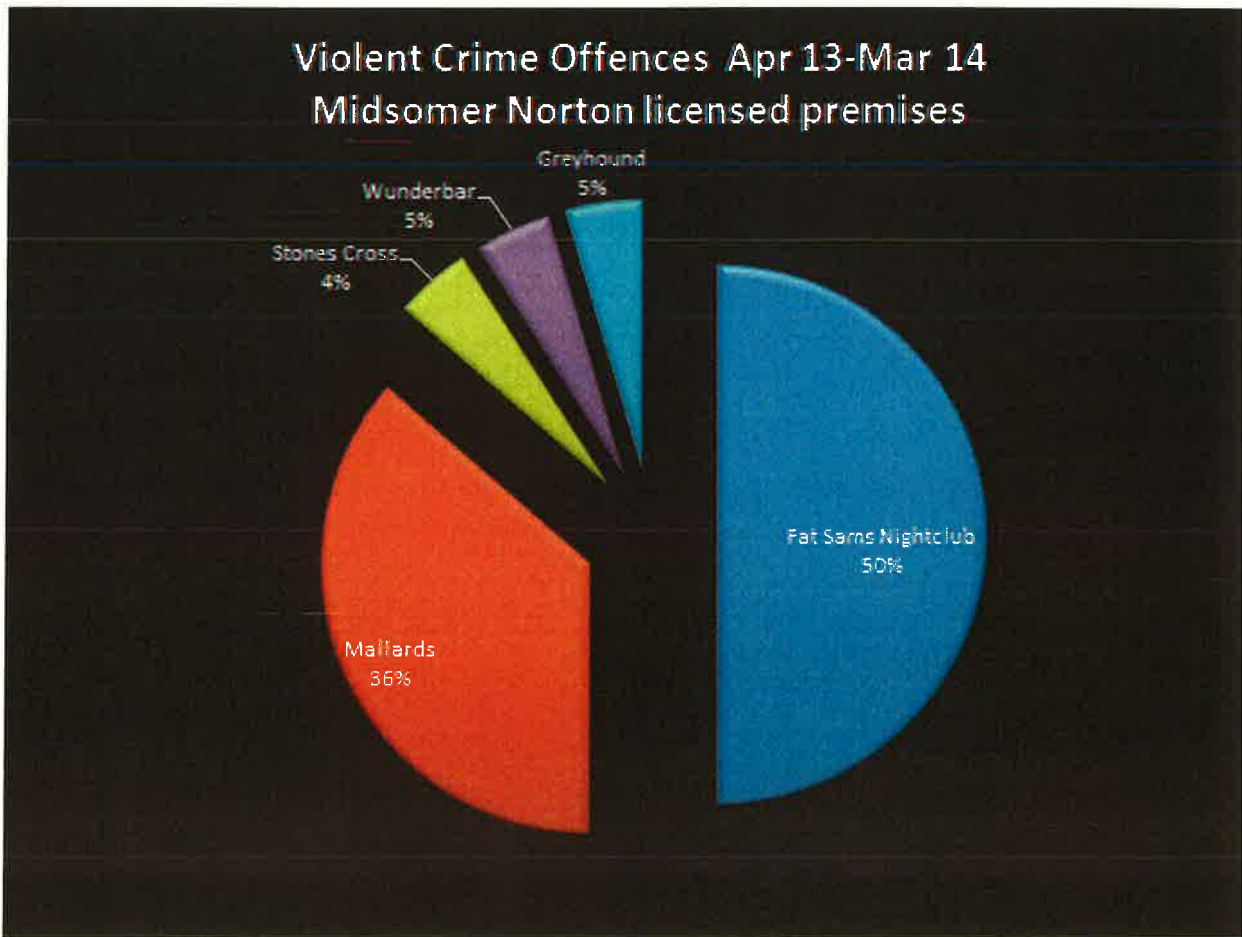

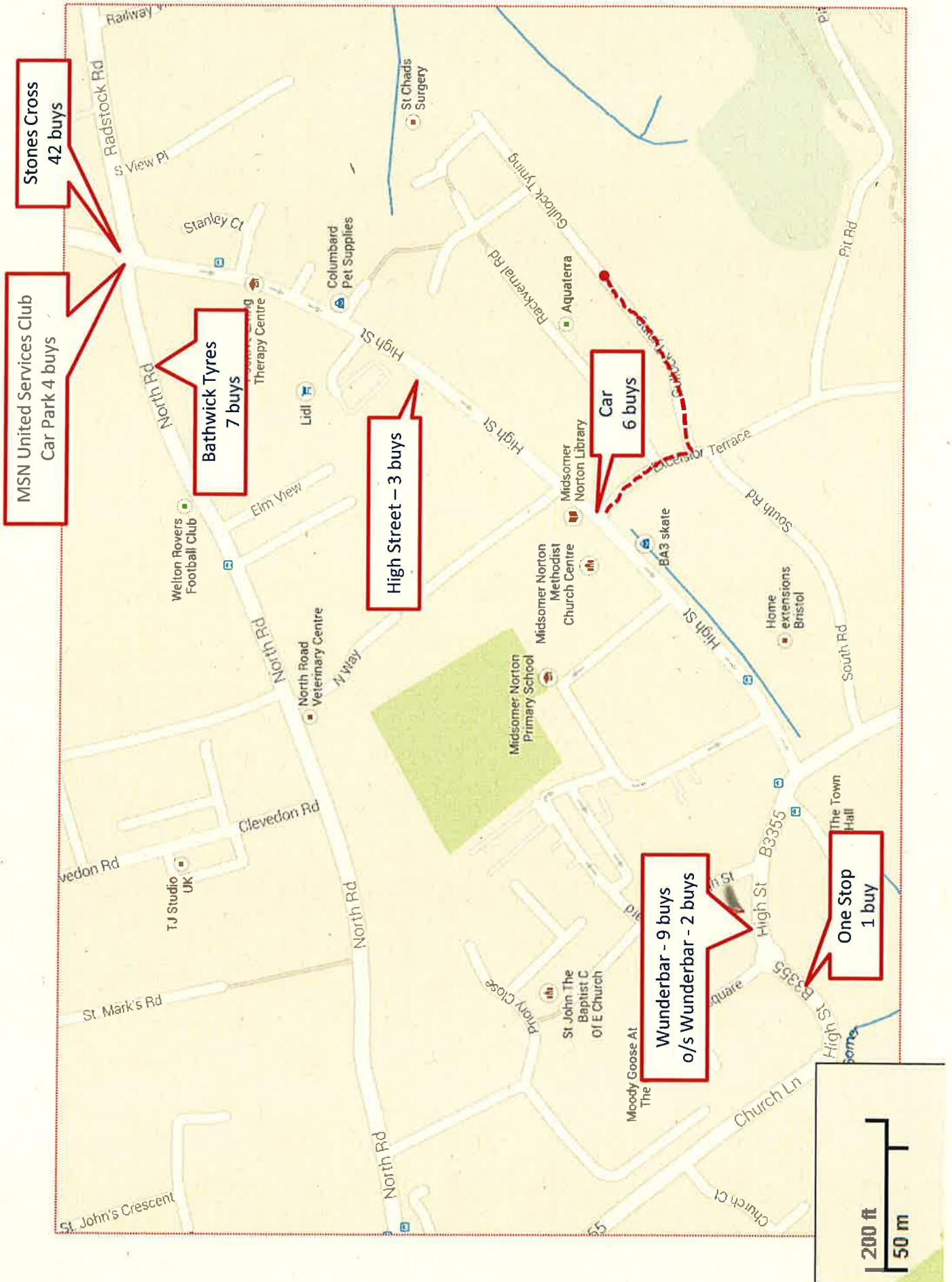

I am Police Constable Natalie GEORGE, shoulder number 2543 of the Avon and Somerset Constabulary based at Bath Police Station working within the District Focus Team.

Between October 2013 and April 2014 I have been the deputy officer in the case for Operation Henotic.

Operation Henotic has been a covert operation its objectives have been:

- To provide intelligence and evidence in relation to the illegal activities of the criminal fraternity in Norton-Radstock, namely the supply of controlled drugs, the handling of stolen goods and any associated acquisitive crime.
- To provide intelligence and evidence in relation to licensing breaches and any associated anti-social behaviour.

These objectives are inextricably linked to the Police and Crime Commissioner's commitment to:

- Reducing the impact that anti-social behaviour has in our communities.
- Preventing and reducing burglary and the fear of burglary.

As deputy officer in the case for Operation Henotic my role has been to collect and collate the information, evidence and intelligence provided by the undercover Police officers. To ensure that all exhibits, statements and evidence are recorded and processed accordingly.

As the deployment phase of the operation has now concluded I have been preparing the suspects case files in preparation for their arrest and anticipated remand in custody.

As a Police officer working on the uniform response team I was stationed in Radstock for approximately five years and have had knowledge of the Wunder Bar, High Street, Midsomer Norton. It has a previously had incidents reported to the Police involving its patrons taking drugs whilst on the premises.

During the course of Operation Henotic, I have read the undercover Police officers pocket note books, where they have recorded their evidence and have full knowledge of the incidents and evidence that they have obtained.

They have recorded not only the evidence in relation to the offences of supplying controlled drugs, but they have also recorded evidence in relation to blatant drug use and drug supply within the Wunder Bar, which had been carried out by its patrons openly in full view in public areas, both within the bar area and the rear smoking area.

The undercover Police officers have conducted 70 deployments into the Midsomer Norton area between Friday 1<sup>st</sup> November 2013 and Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2014.

In total there have been 6 suspects that have supplied controlled drugs of various class classifications within the Wunder Bar premises; there has been a further suspect who has supplied drugs in the street outside of the Wunder Bar.

There have been 9 drug supplies to the undercover Police officers during the Operation from within the Wunder Bar and a further 2 drug supplies outside in the street.

Of the 9 drug supplies in the Wunder Bar the following drugs were purchased:

- 3 supplies of cocaine, which is Class A.
- 4 supply of MDMA, which is Class A.
- 1 supply of MDMC, which is Class B.
- 1 supplies of ketamine, which is Class C.

These 9 drug supplies took place on the following dates:

- Two supplies on 13/12/2013
- Two supplies on 14/12/2013
- One supply on 20/12/2013
- One supply on 22/12/2013
- One supply on 09/01/2014
- One supply on 10/01/2014
- One supply on 17/01/2014

Of the 2 drug supplies outside in the street, the following drugs were purchased:

- 1 supply of cocaine, which is Class A.
- 1 supply of MDMC, which is Class B.

These 2 drug supplies took place on 11/01/2014 and 24/01/2014.

The type of drug predominantly supplied during the operation was MDMA and cocaine, which are both Class A controlled drugs.

This was the drug most frequently offered for supply by the suspects and also was often seen being used by patrons of the Public House.

The small zip lock bags that are used to contain the cocaine and other drugs, where often seen by the undercover Police officers empty and discarded, throughout the Wunder Bar.

On one occasion the undercover Police officers witnessed a male patron of the Wunder Bar in the rear smoking/garden area, use a shelf to snort white powder, believed to be cocaine. As the patron did this a member of the bar staff walked passed and made a comment, similar to,  
"That wasn't very discreet."

However no attempt was made by the bar staff to deal with this situation more robustly.

On another occasion, when there were door staff employed at the Wunder Bar, a suspect openly dealt to the undercover Police officers, within view of the door staff, the suspect was not in the least deterred by the presence of the door staff.

I am Police Sergeant 461 CANNON currently based at Radstock Police Station.

On Friday 17<sup>th</sup>. January 2014 evening I was on patrol in full uniform carrying out licensed premise visits in the Midsomer Norton area along with PC 3964 GRAHAM, BANES licensing Officer Kirsty MORGAN and BANES councillor David DIXON.

At about 1030hrs. the same evening we parked the Police vehicle at the rear of the WUNDERBAR licensed premises situated in the High Street Midsomer Norton and approached the rear gate of the premises in POWYS ORCHARD. As I approached I could clearly smell what I recognised as cannabis smoke coming behind the gate and emanating from the rear garden of the pub. The rear gate was locked. I then entered the WUNDERBAR through the front entrance from the HIGH ST. with PC GRAHAM and immediately spoke to the licensee Lucy MILNER who was working behind the main bar. I asked her to accompany me and PC GRAHAM to the garden at the rear of the premises which she did. On entering the rear garden I was conscious of a strong smell of cannabis that appeared to be coming from a group of young adults sitting at a table in the garden. I pointed this out to Lucy MILNER. PC GRAHAM then spoke to the group and he asked two males to accompany him to the rear of the garden in order for him to conduct a search under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971. I spoke to the rest of the group at the table and conducted similar searches of two other males. My searches proved negative. I then went

and joined PC GRAHAM having given suitable words of advice to the male I had just searched and a 16 year old who was sitting near them. I was made aware by PC GRAHAM that he had issued a Fixed Penalty Notice for possession of cannabis to one of the males he had searched. The search of the second male had proved negative.

As a result of our findings that substantiated our suspicions of cannabis being smoked in the garden of the pub I then spoke to Lucy MILNER and advised her that she needed to have better control of the pub, in particular the garden area. I explained that we had received information in the past that cannabis was being smoked in the garden and I was very concerned having found evidence of such activity and that officers would be paying closer attention to the premises in the future. If the Police found offences being committed in the future, this could affect her license. I also pointed out that the BANES Licensing Officer having been present would be noting this for the licensing records.

At about 8.45pm on Fri 31<sup>st</sup>. January 2014 I was on duty when I carried out a follow – up visit to the WUNDERBAR. On arrival I spoke to Lucy MILNER and she escorted me around the pub showing me that she now had doorstaff working at the front and rear of the premises to assist in controlling customers as a result of my previous visit. There were no offences being committed on the premises on this occasion.
