#### 1 EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURE

The Democratic Services Officer read out the procedure.

#### 2 ELECTION OF VICE-CHAIR (IF DESIRED)

**RESOLVED** that a Vice-Chair was not required on this occasion.

#### 3 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE AND SUBSTITUTIONS

Apologies were received from Cllr Gabriel Batt, for whom Cllr Bryan Chalker substituted.

#### 4 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were none.

#### 5 TO ANNOUNCE ANY URGENT BUSINESS AGREED BY THE CHAIR

There was none.

#### 6 MINUTES: 24 MAY 2012

These were approved as a correct record and signed by the Chair.

#### 7 LICENSING PROCEDURE

The Chair drew attention to the licensing procedure, copies of which had been made available to those attending the meeting.

# 8 APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE FOR PKT STORES, 11 FORTESCUE ROAD, RADSTOCK, BATH BA3 3PJ

Applicant: Mrs Kajinthiny Kanesarasa, accompanied by Mr Kanesarasa

<u>Responsible Authority:</u> Avon and Somerset Police, represented by Martin Purchase (Liquor Licensing Officer)

The parties confirmed that they had received and understood the licensing procedure.

The Licensing Officer summarised the application. She explained that the application was for a new premises licence conferring authority to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises every day from 06:00 to 23:00. A representation had been received from the Police on the ground that the application did not sufficiently promote the licensing objectives. The Police had proposed additional conditions, as detailed in paragraph 4.11 of the covering report. The applicant had agreed in writing to the imposition of these conditions on the premises licence.

The applicant stated her case. In reply to questions from Members Mr Kanesarasa stated:

- 2 staff were employed in the shop
- the minimum age for staff was 21
- staff would receive training on the sale of alcohol

Mr Purchase stated the case for the Police. He said that Mr and Mrs Kanesarasa were experienced in the sale of alcohol, because they owned other premises about a mile away which sold alcohol. He had been concerned about the lack of conditions to promote the licensing objectives contained in the Operating Schedule, which he thought probably arose from an oversight on the part of the applicant. He had a meeting with them to discuss the application at which he had proposed conditions to which they had readily agreed. In reply to a question from a Member he stated that he did not have concerns about the long hours proposed for the sale of alcohol, because he knew Mr and Mrs Kanesarasa and the manner in which they ran their other businesses.

The parties were invited to sum up, but said they had nothing to add to what they had already stated.

Following an adjournment, the Sub-Committee **RESOLVED** to grant the application, subject to the mandatory conditions for the sale of alcohol, the additional conditions proposed by the Police, and accepted by the applicant, and to the conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule. Authority was granted to the Licensing Officer to issue the licence accordingly.

#### **REASONS**

Members have today determined an application for the grant of a new premises licence for P.K.T Stores, 11 Fortescue Road, Radstock, Bath.

In doing so they have taken account of the Licensing Act, Human Rights Act, the Council's Policy and the Statutory Guidance.

Members are aware that the proper approach under the Licensing Act is to do only what is appropriate and proportionate to promote the licensing objectives in light of what is presented to them.

Members considered the relevant representations and took account of the evidence put before them. They were careful to balance the competing interests of the applicant and those of the Responsible Authority, i.e. the Police in reaching a decision.

Members noted that the Police had made representations based on the fact that the area was subject to incidents of crime and disorder and anti-social behaviour particularly in the evenings and were alcohol related. The Police considered that this type of premises tended to fuel crime and disorder and anti-social behaviour. It was also stated that the area was partly residential.

The Police considered that the application did not sufficiently forward the licensing objectives and therefore proposed that several conditions were imposed on the premises licence in order to promote the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder to which the applicant had agreed.


Members therefore granted the licence as applied for together with the mandatory conditions for the sale of alcohol, the conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule and the conditions proposed by the Police and agreed to by the applicant.

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#### **LICENSING ACT 2003**

# LICENSING COMMITTEE HEARING PROCEDURE ALCOHOL, LATE NIGHT REFRESHMENT AND ENTERTAINMENT

- 1. The Chair will introduce Members of the Sub-Committee and Officers present and explain the procedure to be followed.
- 2. The Licensing Officer will outline the nature of the matter to be considered by the Sub-Committee.

In the following paragraphs where the term "party" or "parties" is used in addition to other terms this will mean anyone to whom notice of this meeting has been given.

- 3. (i) The Applicant/Licence Holder ("the Applicant"), or representative, addresses the Sub-Committee. The Applicant may be asked relevant questions about the matters before the Sub-Committee by the other parties and the Members.
  (ii) The Applicant, or representative, may call witnesses in support of the application and each witness may be asked relevant questions by the other parties and the Members.
- **4. (i)** Any interested parties [defined in s.69(3)] making relevant representations, or representative, will take it in turn to address the Sub-Committee. You may be asked relevant questions by the other parties, the Applicant and the Members.
  - (ii) You (or your representative) may call witnesses in support of your representations and each witness may be asked relevant questions by the Applicant, the other parties and the Members.
- 5. Any Responsible Authority [defined in s.69(4)] making a representation will address the Committee. The Responsible Authorities may be asked relevant questions by the Applicant, other parties and the Members.
- **6.** The Applicant will then be invited to briefly summarise the application.
- 7. The other parties will then be invited in turn to briefly summarise their points if they wish in the same order as before.
- 8. The Chair will invite the Sub-Committee to move into private session to enable the Sub-Committee to deliberate in private in accordance with Paragraph 14(2) of the Hearings Regulations 2005. The Sub-Committee will only reconvene to resolve any points of uncertainty on the evidence already given. During their deliberation the Sub-Committee will be accompanied *for advice only* by the Legal Advisor and the Committee Administrator. The Sub-Committee may retire to a private room or alternatively require vacation of the meeting room by all other persons.
- **9.** When the Sub-Committee resumes, the Chair will announce the decision in public; this will include the reasons (or advise that the decision will be released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limit in this instance 5 working days).

#### **PLEASE NOTE:**

- Where the Sub-Committee considers it necessary to do so, it may vary this procedure.
- Decisions will generally be taken regardless of whether the Applicant is present. All notices and representations received from absent parties will be considered.
- Only in <u>exceptional circumstances</u> will the Committee take into account any
  additional late documentary or other information produced by an existing party
  in support of their application/representation. This will be at the discretion of
  the Chair and with the agreement of all the other parties. No new
  representations will be allowed at the hearing.
- The hearing will take the form of a discussion However, the Council will allow all parties to ask questions of another party present, as set out above, but formal cross examination will be discouraged.
- The Authority will disregard any information or representation given by a party which is not relevant to the Application and the Licensing Act 2003.
- The Chair will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to make representations. The amount of time will be at the discretion of the Chair, but in the interests of costs and efficiency will not normally exceed twenty minutes. This will include the time taken for the presentation and the summing up, but not the time taken for questions.
  - N.B. Where there is more than one party making relevant representations the time will be split between those parties. It is recommended that they arrive early to discuss the application with the other interested parties.
- The Chair may require any person attending the hearing who is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and refuse to allow that person to return, or only allow them to return subject to certain conditions. Any person so excluded will however be entitled to submit to the Sub-Committee any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.
- Bath & North East Somerset Council is committed to taking decisions in an honest, accountable and transparent fashion, but on occasion may find it necessary to exclude members of the press and public based upon the legal framework given in the Local Government Act 1972 Schedule 12 (a). On these occasions decisions based on the above framework will be given.

#### 1 THE ISSUE

1.1 An application has been received for the variation of an existing Premises Licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of The Trinity Inn, 49 James Street West, Bath BA1 2DA (Annex A).

#### 2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the sub committee determine the application to vary the licence.

#### 3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 There are no financial implications arising from this report.

#### 4 THE REPORT

- 4.1 An application has been received for the variation of a premises licence.
- 4.2 The current premises licence detailed in Annex B, permits the following licensable activities:
  - 1) Sale of Alcohol for consumption both on and off the premises between the following hours:

Monday to Saturday

10:00- 00:00 midnight

Sunday

12:00 - 23:30

2) **Regulated Entertainment** by way of the Performance of Dance, the Performance of Live Music, and Other Entertainment within the Act, indoors only, between the following hours:

Monday to Saturday

11:00 - 23:00

3) **Regulated Entertainment** by way of Recorded Music, indoors only, between the following hours:

Monday to Saturday

10:00 - 00:00

Sunday

12:00 - 22:30

### 4) Non-Standard Timings

A further additional hour into the morning following every Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday for each May Bank Holiday, Spring/Whitsun Bank Holiday and every August Bank Holiday Weekend.

A further additional hour into the morning following every Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday for the Easter Bank Holiday Weekend,

A further additional hour every Christmas Eve and Boxing Day.

From normal activity start time on New Year's Eve until normal activity finish time on 1 January.

5) The **Opening Hours** of the premises are:

Monday to Saturday

10:00 - 00:30

Sunday

12:00 – 00:00 midnight

## 6) Non-Standard Opening Times

A further additional hour into the morning following every Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday for each May Bank Holiday, Spring/Whitsun Bank Holiday and every August Bank Holiday Weekend.

A further additional hour into the morning following every Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday for the Easter Bank Holiday Weekend.

A further additional hour every Christmas Eve.

A further additional hour every Boxing Day.

From normal opening time on New Year's Eve until normal opening time on 1 January.

7) The licence is subject to the following conditions:

ANNEX 1 (mandatory)

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

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- b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
  - Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence;
- Any individual employed to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority;

#### From 6 April 2010

Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010

- 1. (1) The responsible person shall take all responsible steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 15 of the Act); (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less; (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not reoccurring; (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner. NB This condition does not apply to off sales.
  - 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability). **NB This condition does not apply to off sales.**
  - 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available. **NB This condition does not apply to off sales.**

#### From 1 October 2010:

4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to premises in relation to the sale of alcohol.(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that (a) where any of the following alcoholic drink is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whiskey: 25ml or 35ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures. **NB This condition does not apply to off sales.** 

ANNEX 2 (consistent with operating schedule)

- CCTV installed and maintained to cover the external drinking area. Recordings to be kept for a minimum of one month.
- The outside drinking area not to be used after 22:00 hours.
- No unaccompanied children allowed on the premises.
- No children allowed on the premises after 18:00 hours.
- No striptease, nudity or restricted films allowed on the premises.

ANNEX 3 (attached after hearing)

- The licence shall be subject to the condition that the entrance doors will be locked, and there will be no new admissions to the premises after 23:00 hours from Monday to Saturday and 22:30 hours on Sunday.
- Good Friday opening hours shall be 12:00 00:00

### 4.3 The **Variation** application seeks to:

**extend** the terminal hour in respect of Live Music, Recorded Music, Performance of Dance, Anything of a Similar Description and the Sale of Alcohol on Thursday, Friday and Saturday to 03:00 hours the following morning;

**extend** the closing time on Thursday, Friday and Saturday until 03:30 hours the following morning to allow 30 minutes drinking up time after the last proposed sale of alcohol;

permit the sale of alcohol from 10:00 hours on a Sunday morning;

permit opening from 10:00 hours on a Sunday

**add** the provision of Facilities for Making Music on Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 11:00 hours to 03:00 hours the following morning (indoors only);

**add** the provision of Facilities for Dancing on Monday to Wednesday from 11:00 hours to 23:00 hours and on Thursday to Saturday from 11:00 hours to 03:00 hours the following morning (indoors only);

**add** Late Night Refreshment on Monday to Wednesday until 00:00; on Thursday to Saturday until 03:00 hours the following morning and on Sunday until 23:30 hours;

**remove** the condition the outside drinking area not to be used after 22:00 hours;

**remov**e the condition no children allowed on the premises after 18:00 hours;

**remove** the condition the entrance door will be locked, and there will be no new admissions to the premises after 23:00 hours from Monday to Saturday and 22:30 hours on Sunday;

add the conditions offered by the applicant as detailed in the operating schedule;

amend the non- standard timings in respect of licensable activities to read:

On the Sunday of the May, Spring/Whitsun, August and Easter Bank Holiday weekends until 03:00 hours

On Christmas Eve and Boxing Day until 03:00 hours

From the start of permitted hours New Year's Eve until the end of permitted hours New Year's Day; and

amend the non- standard opening times to read:

On the Sunday of the May, Spring/Whitsun, August and Easter Bank Holiday weekends to 03:30 hours

On Christmas Eve and Boxing Day until 03:30 hours

FOR THE SAKE OF CLARITY PLEASE NOTE THAT THE ONLY OUTSIDE AREA THIS PREMISES HAS IS THE HIGHWAY. THE PREMISES HAS BENEFITED FROM A TABLES CHAIRS PERMIT TO ALLOW USE OF THIS AREA.

- 4.4 A site plan is attached at Annex C.
- 4.5 The Licensing Act 2003 (Section 4) states that it is the duty of all Licensing Authorities to carry out their functions under the Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
  - a) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.
  - b) Public Safety.
  - c) The Prevention of Public Nuisance, and
  - d) The Protection of Children from Harm.

Each objective is of equal importance; there are no other licensing objectives so these four are of paramount consideration at all times. When considering applications/representations/notifications the Licensing Authority will have regard to these licensing objectives.

- 4.6 The Licensing Authority may vary and grant the application with or without additional conditions.
- 4.7 The Licensing Authority can refuse the variation or part of the variation as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 4.8 The Licensing Authority may not however do anything to reduce the effect of the rights guaranteed by the existing premises licence.

- 4.9 Section 4(3) Licensing Act 2003 states that the Licensing Authority should also have regard to the Council's Licensing Policy, the Statutory Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and the Licensing Act itself, and in particular to:
  - a) Paragraphs 3, 5, 6, 9,10, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 23, 24, 28, 30, 33, 35, 36, 37, 41 to 44 inclusive of the policy.
  - b) Chapters 8, 9 and 10 of the Statutory Guidance (as revised April 2012)
  - c) Sections 4, 9, 10, 13, 34, 35, 36, 182 and 183 of the Act.
- 4.10 The Licensing Authority recognises that Licensing and Planning are separate regimes. Where an application is granted by the Licensing Authority which would require planning permission this would not relieve the applicant of the need to obtain that permission. It will still be necessary for the applicant to ensure that he/she has **ALL** the necessary permissions in place to enable them to run the business within the law.
- 4.11 If the application is refused the applicant may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates Court.

If the application is granted the person making the relevant representation may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates Court.

On appeal the court may either dismiss the appeal; substitute the decision appealed against for any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the court. The court may make such order for costs as it thinks fit.

- 4.12 In accordance with the requirements of the Act the applicants served copies of the application upon the Police, the Fire Authority, Environmental Health, Development Control, Trading Standards, the Director of Public Health and the Child Protection Agency.
- 4.13 The applicant is required to place a notice at the premises for a period of 28 days starting the day after the application is made and place an advert in a local newspaper within 10 working days of submitting the application to the licensing authority.
- 4.14 A **representation** has been received from the **Police** expressing concern that the applicant's proposals will undermine both the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance objectives, especially as the premises is situated within Bath's Cumulative Impact Area (Annex D).

The Police have proposed the following conditions to address their concern:

- A digital CCTV system will be fitted and maintained in consultation with the Police. The recordings will be of evidential quality and kept for a minimum of 31 days. They will be time and date marked and made available to the police on request. Notices are to be displayed at the entrance to the premises advising that CCTV is in operation.
- Where a risk assessment by the DPS identifies as necessary, and/or at the written request of the police or licensing authority, door staff will be on duty to supervise all patrons entering and leaving and to ensure the good order of the premises.
- 3 There will be no new entry to the premises after 00:30 each day.
- 4 There will be no live or recorded music after 12:00 midnight on any day.

- 5 All windows and doors (except for entry and departure) will remain closed during the performance of live music.
- 4.15 The applicant has agreed to the conditions and timings proposed by the Police (Annex E).
- 4.16 This report has not been sent to the Trades Union because they would have no involvement in this application.

#### **5 RISK ASSESSMENT**

5.1 A risk assessment related to the issue and recommendations has been undertaken, in compliance with the Council's decision making risk management guidance.

#### **6 EQUALITIES**

6.1 An Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA) has been completed. No adverse or other significant issues were found.

#### 7 CONSULTATION

7.1 In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licence and Club Premises Certificate) Regulations 2005, the applicant has given notice of the application to all the relevant Responsible Authorities and has advertised the application in the manner prescribed, both at the premises and within a local publication.


#### 8 ISSUES TO CONSIDER IN REACHING DECISION

- 8.1 When reaching a decision, the licensing authority must carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives.
- 8.2 Consideration must be given to the Human Rights Act 1998 and the "convention rights".

9.1 The Council's Monitoring Officer (Divisional Director – Legal & Democratic Services), s.151 Officer (Divisional Director – Finance) and the Divisional Director have had the opportunity to input to this report and have cleared it for publication.

#### Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Any individual employed to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

From 6 April 2010:

Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010

- 1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children: (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act); (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less; (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring; (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability). NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.



3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

#### From 1 October 2010:

- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

#### Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

CCTV installed and maintained to cover the external drinking area. Recordings to be kept for a minimum of one month.

The outside drinking area not to be used after 22.00 hours.

No unaccompanied children allowed on the premises.

No children allowed on the premises after 18.00 hours.

No striptease, nudity or restricted films allowed on the premises.



#### Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

The Licensing Committee granted the licence subject to the Mandatory and Operating Schedule conditions. In addition the licence will be subject to the condition that the entrance door will be locked, and there will be no new admissions to the premises after 23.00 hours from Monday to Saturday and 22.30 hours on Sunday.

Monday to Saturday 10.00 to 00.00 Sunday 12.00 to 23.30


