1 EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURE

The Democratic Services Officer read out the procedure.

2 ELECTION OF VICE-CHAIR (IF DESIRED)

RESOLVED that a Vice-Chair was not required on this occasion.

3 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE AND SUBSTITUTIONS

There were none.

4 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were none.

5 TO ANNOUNCE ANY URGENT BUSINESS AGREED BY THE CHAIR

There was none.

6 LICENSING PROCEDURE

The Chair explained the procedure to be followed for the meeting.

7 LICENSING ACT 2003 - INTERIM STEPS FOLLOWING SUMMARY REVIEW APPLICATION FOR THE BLUE ROOMS, ROYAL YORK HOTEL, 1 YORK BUILDINGS, GEORGE STREET, BATH BA1 2EB

Applicant for Review: Avon and Somerset Police, represented by Inspector Steven Mildren and Martin Purchase (Liquor Licensing Officer)

Premises Licence Holder: Technov Ltd, represented by David Holley (Licensing Agent), Kambiz Shayeganzadeh (Director) and Blair Ruddick (DPS)

The Licensing Officer summarised the application. She explained that an application had been received from the Police for a summary review of the premises licence, together with a certificate, signed by the Chief Superintendent, stating that, in his opinion, the premises were associated with serious crime. The Licensing Officer confirmed that, after receipt of such an application, a hearing had to be held within 48 hours to consider whether it is necessary to take any interim steps to prevent

serious crime, serious disorder, or both from occurring on the premises and that the review must be determined with 28 days.

Inspector Mildren stated the case for the Police. He said that the premises had been targeted in a covert operation between November and December 2012. During that time, undercover officers had been sold class A drugs on a number of occasions and five individuals had been arrested and four had been charged with drugs offences. In addition to the drug offences, the premises had, since February 2012, been associated with a disproportionate level of other crime and disorder. In the view of the Police, there had been a significant failure, by the licencee, to promote the licensing objectives. He had met Mr Shayeganzadeh on 27 September 2012 to discuss concerns.

A Member asked whether Inspector Mildren had a log of incidents associated with the premises. Inspector Mildren replied that he did not have this with him at the moment, but would be able to provide it as part of the application for summary review, at the full review hearing. A Member asked whether those who had been arrested for drugs offences were employed at the premises. Inspector Mildren replied that he did not wish to discuss this in public session, but would be willing to do so in exempt session. It was

RESOLVED that the Sub-Committee having been satisfied that the public interest would be better served by not disclosing relevant information, in accordance with the provisions of section 100(A)(4) of the Local Government Act 1972, the public be excluded from the meeting for this item of business because of the likely disclosure of exempt information as defined in paragraph 3 of Part 1 of Schedule 12A of the Act as amended.

Having received the information from Inspector Mildren, the Sub-Committee **RESOLVED** to return to open session.

In response to questions from Mr Holley Inspector Mildren stated:

- he had met Mr Shayeganzadeh in 2010 and September 2012 to discuss concerns about crime and disorder associated with the premises; he had discussed specific incidents and informed Mr Shayeganzadeh about undesirable people entering the premises and spoken about promoting the licensing objectives
- he did not have a list of specific incidents with him today

In response to questions from Mr Smith, Inspector Mildren stated:

- he thought there had been breaches of the licence; the fact that many people had emerged from the premises extremely drunk suggested that drink had been sold to intoxicated people which is unlawful
- there had been a total of 14 Class A drug sales during the covert operation; it would not be appropriate to comment on what night of the week these sales had been made

Mr Holley stated the case for the licencee. He said that comments had been made about things that for which little specific information had been provided. There was, he submitted, not much detail in the Police application. However, by the time of the full review hearing the licenceholder would have had the chance to investigate specific complaints and there would be a more informed discussion. The trigger for this emergency hearing had been the sale of Class A drugs. The licence holder admitted that there had been issues with drugs at the premises in the past. About 18 months ago a known drug dealer had tried to enter the premises. Mr Shayeganzadeh had notified the Police and had himself stood guard on the door to prevent this person entering the premises. On one occasion he had come to the premises immediately after being notified that this person was present.

Mr Holley said that the Blue Rooms had had a 24-hour licence since 2006. The premises comprised two levels; a basement and sub-basement area, and the activities taking place on the premises required a good deal of supervision. He put questions to Mr Ruddick, the DPS. In reply Mr Ruddick stated that;

- random drug searches had recently been introduced at the premises
- he had been at the premises for five years and was not aware of any previous problems with drugs there
- an increased level of supervision of the toilets had been introduced
- there were internal and external radio communications
- the electronic recording of all searches made at the premises was being considered
- two security staff were deployed on the stairs between 22.00 and 00.00 (midnight) even though only one was required under the licence
- a new "winding-down" procedure had been introduced whereby the subbasement level was closed half an hour before the rest of the premises

Mr Holley then put questions to Mr Shayeganzadeh. In reply he stated that;

- he held a number of other premises licences and had always been concerned that his establishments should be properly run
- he had written to Inspector Mildren and had subsequently had a meeting with him accompanied by his daughter; he had been concerned that many incidents occurring in George Street were being wrongly attributed to the Blue Rooms because the premises were open late
- he had always been against drugs and taken pictures of individuals he knew were involved in drugs and given them to the Police; he and his door staff had been threatened by people involved with drugs

- he felt that the Police wanted the Blue Rooms to be shut down because it was a nightclub; he also felt that the Police should control what was happening in George Street more effectively
- a year ago he had introduced extra CCTV cameras at the premises and the toilets were now covered by cameras; images could be relayed to the CCTV system from his mobile phone
- he had never received anything in writing from the Police challenging the operation of the premises

Mr Smith asked the licence holder whether he had been aware of any allegations about drugs prior to November 2012. Mr Holley replied that the house policy on drugs had already been explained. Recently, random drug searches had been introduced and extra security staff appropriately briefed had been deployed. They ensured that, for example, handbags were not left lying around. Mr Shayeganzadeh added that customers were monitored to check whether drugs deals were taking place.

Mr Ruddick said that it would be helpful if the Police worked with the management of the premises. If the Police shared information about known drug dealers they could be kept under observation and refused admission. There are known drug dealers in the community, but the Police had never provided any information about them. Mr Shayeganzadeh insisted that the drug deals that had triggered today's hearing were atypical; they had not happened before and had not happened since.

A Member asked why, despite the preventative measures in place, the offences had occurred. Did he agree that there had been a gross failure to promote the licensing objectives, as the Police had stated? Mr Holley replied that he understood that the five arrests for drug offences had taken place at various addresses. Inspector Mildren emphasised that all the arrests related to offences committed at the Blue Rooms.

A Member suggested that there was a discrepancy between Mr Shayeganzadeh's statement that there had been previous problems with drugs at the premises with Mr Ruddick's statement that he had not been aware of any drug problems during his five years as DPS. Mr Ruddick replied that what Mr Shayeganzadeh had actually said was that some time ago an individual involved with drugs had tried to enter the premises, not that there had previously been problems with drugs on the premises. Mr Shayeganzadeh confirmed this. Members expressed scepticism that a large number of incidents occurring in George Street were erroneously being attributed to the Blue Rooms. Mr Shayeganzadeh insisted that this was the case and that was why he had written to the Police. Mr Ruddick said that more steps were now being taken to increase the management's awareness of any potential problems with drugs.

The Chair asked whether body searches would be carried out on customers. Mr Ruddick replied that there would not be body searches, but searches of handbags etc. Mr Smith asked whether the first time that management at the Blue Rooms was aware of problems with drugs was when they had been served with the application for today's hearing.

Mr Shayeganzadeh replied that the first time he had been aware of any problems with drugs was when the local paper had contacted him after arrests had been made.

Replying to further questions from Mr Smith, Mr Shayeganzadeh and Mr Ruddick stated that:

- female members of door staff were employed
- on the busiest night 6 security staff were employed, but usually 4; 2 at the top of the stairs and the rest circulating inside the premises
- toilet attendants were not employed
- CCTV was monitored constantly; 8 cameras had been added because re "blind spots" had been identified in the premises; the installation of the additional cameras had commenced in October 2012 and had been completed in December; the monitoring of CCTV was shared between Mr Ruddick and other staff

Mr Purchase said that the improvements in CCTV had been done at the request of the Police following incidents at the premises.

The parties were invited to sum up.

Mr Holley said that that communication between the premises and the Police was continuing. The management felt bitter disappointment at what had happened. The licencee was offering to have the improvements in anti-drug measures, such as random searches, frequent checks of the toilets and frequent radio checks, to be made licence conditions. The Police were invited to re-inspect the CCTV system. The CCTV system now covered the car park. It was important that the premises should be able to provide proof of searches and checks carried and it was best that such they should be registered electronically. The first time that management became aware of issues relating to drugs was in November 2012 and no complaint about drugs had ever been received from the Police. The licence holder was sure that the additional measures that had been introduced would allow effective control of any potential problems.

Inspector Mildren stated that the summary review application had been made solely because of the drug offences. Information received had led to a covert investigation. However, the premises were associated with a high level of other serious crime and disorder problems, evidence of which would be submitted for full review hearing.

The Sub-Committee adjourned and then reconvened to ask the licence holder which was the busiest night at the premises. Mr Ruddick replied that Thursday was the busiest night with 300-350 customers. Fridays and Saturdays were the next busiest with 180-220 customers.

Following a further adjournment, the Sub-Committee **RESOLVED** that it was necessary to take interim steps to prevent serious crime from occurring on the

premises by the imposition of the following additional conditions on the licence with immediate effect:

- 1. All persons entering the premises will be searched for drugs, weapons or other illegal items on bothentry or re-entry.
- 2. Any persons refusing to be searched will not be permitted to enter the premises.
- 3. A female Door Supervisor will be employed at all times the premises are open to the public.
- 4. A minimum of 8 Door Supervisors on Thursdays and 6 Door Supervisors on all other days, from opening to closing, will be employed at all times the premises are open to the public.
- 5. CCTV monitors will be watched at all times the premises are open. The person monitoring the CCTV will be in radio contact at all times the premises are open with a member of Door Staff and will report any illegal activities they see to the Door Supervisor.
- 6. The premises licence holder will invite the Crime Prevention Officer, from Avon and Somerset Constabulary, to the premises to advise on any measures needed regarding the supply, use and prevention of drugs.
- 7. Checks will be made of the male and female toilets on the premises every 15 minutes by Door Supervisors while the premises are open.

Whilst it is not possible to impose the following as a condition, the premises licence holder was informed that it would be expected that 3 Door Supervisors would be present at the entrance to the premises at all times the premises are open to the public.

REASONS

Members have today determined interim steps to be taken following an application made by the Avon and Somerset Constabulary for a summary review of a premises licence of The Blue Rooms, 1 York Buildings, Bath.

In doing so they have taken into consideration the Licensing Act 2003, Statutory Guidance, the Home Office Guidance on Summary Reviews, the Council's Policy and the Human Rights Act 1998.

The application was made on the basis of concerns of serious crime in respect of drug dealing on the premises and a number of arrests had been made and charges laid in the Magistrates' Court.

The Members listened carefully to the representations made by the Police, the premises licence holder and his agent and manager.

Members did only what was necessary to promote the licensing objectives in light of the representations made to them today. They decided that it was necessary and proportionate to take interim steps in the form of imposing conditions on the licence in order to ensure that the management and operation of the premises could be immediately improved in light of the representations made by the Police on serious crime.

Members noted that the premises licence holder had not been made aware of the supply, use and possession of drugs prior to the service of the review and had made genuine attempts to improve matters.


They decided not to suspend the licence but do want to send a strong message that the supply, use and possession of drugs will not be tolerated.

LICENSING COMMITTEE HEARING PROCEDURE ALCOHOL, LATE NIGHT REFRESHMENT AND ENTERTAINMENT REVIEW OF PREMISES LICENCE / CLUB PREMISES CERTIFICATE

- The Chair will introduce Members of the Sub Committee and Officers present and explain the procedure to be followed.
- The Licensing Officer will outline the nature of the matter to be considered by the Sub Committee.

In the following paragraphs where the term "party" or "parties" is used in addition to other terms this will mean anyone to whom notice of this meeting has been given.

- 3 (i) The Applicant for Review ("the Applicant"), or representative, addresses the Sub Committee. The Applicant may be asked relevant questions about the matters before the Sub Committee by the other parties, the Licence Holder and the Members.
 - (ii) The Applicant or representative, may call witnesses in support of the application and each witness may be asked relevant questions by the other parties and the Members
- 4 (i) Any other persons making relevant representations (or their representative) will take it in turn to address the Sub Committee and may be asked relevant questions by the other parties, the Applicant, the Licence Holder and the Members.
 - (ii) Any other persons (or their representative) may call witnesses in support of their representations and each witness may be asked relevant questions by the other parties, the Applicant, the Licence Holder and the Members.
- Any Responsible Authority [defined in The Licensing Act 2003 s.69(4)] making a representation will address the Sub Committee. The Responsible Authorities may be asked relevant questions by the other parties, the Applicant, the Licence Holder and the Members.
- The Licence Holder (or their representative) will address the Sub Committee. The Licence Holder may be asked relevant questions by the other parties, the Applicant and the Members.
- 7 The other parties will then be invited in turn to briefly summarise their points if they wish in the same order as before.
- 8. The Applicant will then be invited to briefly summarise the application.
- The Chair will invite the Sub Committee to move into private session to enable the Sub Committee to deliberate in private in accordance with Paragraph 14(2) of the Hearings Regulations 2005. The Sub Committee will only reconvene to resolve any points of uncertainty on the evidence already given. During their deliberation the Sub Committee will be accompanied *for advice only* by the Legal Adviser and the Committee Administrator. The Sub Committee may retire to a private room or alternatively require vacation of the meeting room by all other persons.

10	When the Sub Committee resumes, the Chair will announce the decision in public; this will include the reasons (or advise that the decision will be released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limit in this instance 5 working days).

Please Note:

- Where the Sub Committee considers it necessary to do so, it may vary this procedure.
- Decisions will generally be taken regardless of whether the Applicant is present. All notices and representations received from absent parties will be considered.
- Only in <u>exceptional circumstances</u> will the Sub Committee take into account any additional late documentary or other information produced by an existing party in support of their application/representation. This will be at the discretion of the Chair and with the agreement of all the other parties. No new representations will be allowed at the hearing.
- The hearing will take the form of a discussion However, the Sub Committee will allow all parties to ask questions of another party present, as set out above, but formal cross examination will be discouraged.
- The Sub Committee will disregard any information or representation given by a party which is not relevant to the Application and the Licensing Act 2003.
- The Chair will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to make representations. The amount of time will be at the discretion of the Chair, but in the interests of costs and efficiency will not normally exceed <u>twenty minutes</u>. This will include the time taken for the presentation and the summing up, but not the time taken for questions.
 - NB Where there is more than one party making relevant representations the time will be split between those parties. It is recommended that they arrive early to discuss the application with the other interested parties.
- The Chair may require any person attending the hearing who is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and refuse to allow that person to return, or only allow them to return subject to certain conditions. Any person so excluded will however be entitled to submit to the Sub Committee any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

Bath & North East Somerset Council is committed to taking decisions in an honest, accountable and transparent fashion, but on occasion may find it necessary to exclude members of the press and public based upon the legal framework given in the Local Government Act 1972 Schedule 12 (a). On these occasions decisions based on the above framework will be given.

1.1 An application and supporting certificate has been received from the Chief Officer of the Police for the summary review of a Premises Licence under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003, in respect of Blue Rooms, Royal York Hotel, 1 York Buildings, George Street, Bath BA1 2EB.

Representation from Review Applicant (Chief Officer of the Police)

Representation from the Circus Area Residents' Association

Representation from the Abbey Residents' Association

2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the Sub Committee determines the application for the review of the Premises Licence.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 There are no financial implications arising from this report at this stage.

THE REPORT

Section 21 of the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006 amended Section 53 of the 4.1 Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") by inserting Sections 53A to 53C inclusive. These provisions allow for a fast track procedure for an application, made by a senior Police officer, for the review of a premises licence that are licensed for the sale of alcohol and where the officer has provided a certificate that, in his opinion, the premises are associated with the serious crime, serious disorder or both.

4.2 On Monday 14 January 2013, the Chief Officer of the Police served on the Licensing Authority an application made under s.53A Licensing Act 2003, calling for the summary review of the premises licence pertaining to Blue Rooms, Royal York Hotel, 1 York Buildings, George Street, Bath BA1 2EB (Annex A).

The grounds for the summary review application relate to:

- serious crime and serious disorder associated with the premises;
- Class "A" drugs being sold to covert police officers on a "considerable" number of occasions during a covert police operation between November and December 2012;
- failure to promote the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder; and
- a disproportionate amount of serious violence positively linked to the premises.

The application was accompanied by a signed certificate as required under Section 53A (1) (b) of the Act.

4.3 The current premises licence is attached at Annex B and authorises:

Late Night Refreshment:

Monday to Saturday

23:00 - 05:00

Non Standard Timings:

From normal activity start time on New Year's Eve until normal activity finish time on New Year's Day.

The following conditions are attached to the current licence:

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised, by a person who holds a personal licence.
- Any individual employed to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- Substantial food and non-alcoholic beverages, including drinking water to be available throughout the permitted hours when the sale of alcohol is permitted.
- There shall be no discounted prices on alcoholic drinks and no "happy hour".
- The supervision enhanced CCTV system currently installed at the premises shall be maintained in working order and provided with recording facilities with tapes being retained for 30 days and made available to the police for investigative and evidential purposes.
- A copy of the premises licence and conditions attached thereto to be prominently displayed at the entrance to the premises for persons entering the premises.
- The mandatory conditions introduced April 2010.
- The mandatory conditions introduced October 2010.
- The existing CCTV system shall be maintained, including retention of recordings for 31 days and be produced for evidential reasons to any Police Officer who has reasonable grounds to so request.
- A capacity limit of 300 persons will be maintained with no more than 100 persons using the sub-basement area.
- Upon leaving the premises all persons shall be advised to do so quietly.
- A phone service to local taxi services will be offered and persons will be asked to remain in the foyer of the premises until the taxi arrives.
- Regulated Entertainment on the Basement Floor (entry level) shall cease at 23:30 hours each day.
- The premises shall be a member of any organisation that exists locally to assist in safer bars, clubs and the circulation of information from one premises to another.
- On days that the premises trades for the sale of alcohol after 12 midnight a
 minimum of two S.I.A. door-staff will be on duty from 30 minutes before the
 premises are open to the public until closure, one of whom shall be
 positioned at the top of the steps leading to the main entrance in George
 Street.
- Communication to exist between door-staff and the duty manager.

- 4.4 A site plan is attached at Annex C.
- 4.5 On receipt of the application, the Licensing Authority served copies of the application and signed certificate on the premises licence holder and relevant Responsible Authorities.
- 4.6 Under Section 53(2)(a) of the "Act", the Licensing Authority must within 48 hours of the time of receiving the application, consider under Section 53(B) whether it is necessary to take interim steps pending the determination of a review of the premises licence.
- 4.7 On Tuesday 15 January 2013, a meeting of the Licensing Sub Committee was convened to consider whether it was necessary to take any interim steps to prevent serious crime and/or serious disorder from occurring at the premises, prior to the review hearing (to be held within 28 days following the day after the application was received).
- 4.8 The meeting before the Licensing Sub-Committee was attended by the review applicant (the Chief Officer of the Police), the premises licence holder and his representative.
- 4.9 The Licensing Sub Committee decided it was necessary to take interim steps to prevent serious crime and serious disorder occurring at the premises and determined that the following conditions be imposed on the premises licence with immediate effect:
 - All persons entering the premises will be searched for drugs, weapons or other illegal items on both entry and re-entry.
 - Any persons refusing to be searched will not be permitted to enter the premises.
 - A female Door Supervisor will be employed at all times the premises are open to the public.
 - A minimum of 8 Door Supervisors on Thursdays and 6 Door Supervisors on all other days, from opening to closing, will be employed at all times the premises are open to the public.
 - CCTV monitors will be watched at all times the premises are open. The person
 monitoring the CCTV will be in radio contact at all times the premises are open
 with a member of Door Staff and will report any illegal activity they see to the
 Door Supervisor.
 - The premises licence holder will invite the Crime Prevention Officer, from Avon and Somerset Constabulary, to the premises to advise on any measures needed regarding the use, prevention and supply of drugs.
 - Checks will be made of the male and female toilets on the premises every 15 minutes by Door Supervisors while the premises are open.

Whilst it is not possible to impose the following as a condition, the premises licence holder was informed that it would be expected that 3 Door Supervisors would be present at the entrance to the premises at all times the premises are open to the public.

- The conditions and reasons for the decision in respect of the interim steps are attached at Annex D of the report.
- 4.10 Under Section 53B (6) of the "Act", a premises licence holder may make representations against any interim steps taken by the relevant licensing authority at any time prior to the review.
 - No representations have been made by the premises licence holder in respect of the interim steps imposed on 15 January 2013.
- 4.11 Under Section 53C (2) of the Act, the Licensing Authority must now hold a hearing to review the premises licence.
- 4.12 The Licensing Authority may, having had regard to the application, the signed certificate and any relevant representations, take any of the following steps (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a) Modify the conditions of the Licence
 - b) Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the Licence
 - c) Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor
 - d) Suspend the Licence for a period not exceeding three months
 - e) Revoke the Licence

Where the Licensing Authority takes a step mentioned in 4.12 (a) or (b), it may provide that the modification or exclusion is to have effect for only such period (not exceeding three months) as it may specify.

- 4.13 Under Section 53C(c) of the "Act" the Authority must ensure that any interim steps considered necessary in the period prior to the review hearing, cease to have effect on determination of the review.
- 4.14 Any determination made by the Licensing Authority does not have effect, until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision, or if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.
- 4.15 Section 4(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that the Licensing Authority will also have regard to the Council's Licensing Policy, the Statutory Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Licensing Act itself, and, in particular, to:
 - a) Paragraphs 3, 5, 6, 9, 10, 16, 17.1, 18, 20, 21, 22, 28, 33, 35, 36, 37, 41to 44 inclusive, 44 and 45.
 - b) Chapters 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 of the Statutory Guidance (as revised October 2012)
 - c) Sections 4, 8A, 9. 10, 13, 53A, 53B, 53C, 182 and 183 of the Act

4.16 An appeal may be made to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision by the Council by the applicant for the review, the holder of the premises licence or any other person who made relevant representations in relation to the application.

On appeal the court may either:

- dismiss the appeal;
- substitute the decision appealed against for any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority; or
- remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the court.

The court may make such Order for costs as it thinks fit.

- 4.17 The Licensing Authority displayed notices outside the review premises, in the public area of the Licensing Office at Lewis House, Manvers Street, Bath, BA1 1JG and on the Authority's website, for no less than 7 consecutive days following the day after the application was made. Representations were invited for a period commencing the first working day after the day on which the notice was published, and the date of the ninth subsequent working day.
- 4.18 A representation accompanied by detailed written evidence (Annex E) and a DVD in support of this representation was received from the Police.
- 4.19 A representation has been received from the Circus Area Residents' Association (Annex F) in support of the Police application.
- 4.20 A representation has been received from the Abbey Residents' Association (Annex G) in support of the Police.
- 4.21 Copies of all relevant, written representations together with the DVD supplied by the Police, accompanied the premises licence holder's notification of hearing letter.
- 4.22 This report has not been sent to the Trades Union because they would have no involvement in this application.

5 RISK ASSESSMENT

5.1 A risk assessment related to the issue and recommendations has been undertaken in compliance with the Council's decision making risk management.

6 EQUALITIES

6.1 There are no adverse or significant issues relating to this report.

7 CONSULTATION

7.1 In accordance with the requirements of the Act and Regulations, the Licensing Authority has given notice of the summary review to the Premises Licence Holder, the Fire Authority, Environmental Health, Development Control, Trading

Standards, Director of Public Health and the Child Protection Agency.

8 ISSUES TO CONSIDER WHEN REACHING A DECISION

When reaching a decision, the licensing authority must carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives, namely:

the prevention of crime and disorder;

the prevention of public nuisance;

public safety;

the protection of children from harm.

8.2 Consideration must be given to the European Convention on Human Rights and the Human Rights Act 1998.



A covert policing operation was run at the Blue rooms Nightclub between November 2012 and December 2012.

The objective of the operation was to:

- Destroy and dismantle organised Crime Groups affecting BANES communities
- Secure evidence in relation to the supply of controlled drugs by arrest, prosecution and conviction of offenders.
- To adopt a multi agency preventative approach to re-offending and reduction of anti-social behaviour attributed to drug use and licensing breaches.
- Through joint partnership working, provide drug treatment opportunities to drug users

During this operation, a considerable number of deals of Class A drugs were made to covert police officers. As a result of this operation five people have been arrested and 4 charged to court relating to the supply of Class A drugs. Those charged have been remanded in to custody pending trial. These premises appear to be habitually used for the purpose of Class A drug supply and use.

The criminal investigation may take some considerable time to finalise and therefore the summary review is a necessary step in promoting the Licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003.

It appears there has been a gross failure to promote the licensing objectives in respect of the prevention of crime and disorder.

Since February 2012 there have been numerous incidents of disorder, including serious assaults, public disorder, drunkenness, antisocial behaviour associated with the premises. These incidents have had a major impact on both victims, visitors to the city and residents living nearby.

Police evidence suggests that there is a disproportionate amount of serious violence positively linked to the premises.

Serious concerns exist with regard the overall management structure of the premises, and the failure to promote the licensing objectives in respect of the prevention of crime and disorder.

other event or process, or (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring; (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability). NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

From 1 October 2010:

- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures. 

Decision and Reasons

Members have today determined interim steps to be taken following an application made by the Avon and Somerset Constabulary for a summary review of a premises licence of The Blue Rooms, 1 York Buildings, Bath.

In doing so they have taken into consideration the Licensing Act 2003, Statutory Guidance, the Home Office Guidance on Summary Reviews, the Council's Policy and the Human Rights Act 1998.

The application was made on the basis of concerns of serious crime in respect of drug dealing on the premises and a number of arrests had been made and charges laid in the Magistrates' Court.

The Members listened carefully to the representations made by the Police, the premises licence holder and his agent and manager.

Members did only what was necessary to promote the licensing objectives in light of the representations made to them today. They decided that it was necessary and proportionate to take interim steps in the form of imposing conditions on the licence in order to ensure that the management and operation of the premises could be immediately improved in light of the representations made by the Police on serious crime.

Members noted that the premises licence holder had not been made aware of the supply, use and possession of drugs prior to the service of the review and had made genuine attempts to improve matters.

They decided not to suspend the licence but do want to send a strong message that the supply, use and possession of drugs will not be tolerated.

was run at the Nightclub between 1st November 2012 and 20th December 2012. During the course of this operation other premises were observed for drug dealing.

The objective of the operation was to:

- Destroy and dismantle organised Crime Groups affecting BANES communities
- Secure evidence in relation to the supply of controlled drugs - by arrest, prosecution and conviction of offenders.
- To adopt multi agency preventative approach offending and reduction of antisocial behaviour attributed to drug use and licensing breaches.
- Through joint partnership working, provide drug treatment opportunities to drug users

During this operation, no evidence of drugs was found at the other premises attended by officers. At the Bluerooms however, a considerable number of deals of Class A drugs were made to covert police officers. As a result of this operation

Bath has not experienced drug dealing in a licensed premises on this scale.

considerable time to finalise. A summary review is a necessary step in promoting the Licensing objectives as prescribed by the Licensing Act 2003. It appears there has been a gross failure to promote the licensing objectives in respect of the prevention of crime and disorder.

Since February 2012 there have been a number of incidents of disorder, including serious assaults, public disorder, drunkenness, antisocial behaviour associated with the premises. These incidents have had a major impact on both victims, visitors to the city and residents living nearby.

Police evidence suggests that there is a disproportionate amount of serious violence positively linked to the premises, in the scoping profile at Fig 2 Between July and December 2012 31% of all Violent offences in Bath Nightclubs were attributed to The Blue Rooms.

The incident profile for February 2012 to September 2012 is attached at Fig 3.and Fig 4 DVD evidence.

On 7th September 2012 I met in company with Martin Purchase (Police Licensing Officer) with Mr Kambiz SHAYEGAN he was in company with his daughter Isabelle SHAYEGAN who he stated was assisting in the management of the premises. I pointed out to him the incidents within the club and immediately outside, also that there were persons frequenting his club that he would not wish to be there, also the levels of drunkenness. Discussion took place re the measures he proposed taking. Written correspondence followed. (Fig 4) I had previously spoke with him on 8th September 2010 re concerns about the no of incidents (letter attached) (Fig 4)

The Licensing officer met with him on 28th March 2011 re the need for the CCTV system to be updated, this he agreed to do as a matter of urgency.

Serious concerns exist with regard the overall management structure of the premises, and the failure to promote the licensing objectives in respect of the prevention of crime and disorder. Drug dealing within licened premises on this scale brings with it high levels of seriouse and violent crime. The nature of patrons using such premises and their dealings often causing conflict and goes hand in hand with organised crime. The premises need a period of closure to purge itself of this type of activity and habitual drugs activity. The police are of the view that only a closure of the premises will resolve these serious issues and encourage the perpetrators to cease visiting the club for these

Evidence of Drug Dealing at the Blue Rooms Night Club, Bath

In response to intelligence relating to the supply of Class A drugs at the Blue Rooms, an undercover police operation was implemented, focused at those premises. The dates mentioned below are the only dates that police officers entered the premises as part of this operation, i.e. they visited the premises on 9 occasions in the two month period of the operation.

On 10/1/13, a follow-up operation was implemented where warrants issued under the misuse of drugs act were executed at the premises of the six persons who became subject of the undercover operation. Five of the six persons were arrested during the execution of the warrants. The sixth was not located at the time, but has since been arrested. The current status of those detainees is as below.

Thursday 1st November 2012

Undercover Police Officers entered Blue Rooms Nightclub in order to locate and purchase from drug dealers.

Whilst in the club, they spoke to a male. During their conversation the officers asked if he knew of anyone who would sell cocaine. The man spoke to another person Q. He stated that he only dealt in '100 OR 60 BAGS'.

A little later the officer spoke to Q by the dance floor and asked him "WILL YOU DO TWO GRAMS FOR £100, BETWEEN ME AND MY MATE?"

Q replied - "I DON'T NORMALLY DO LESS THAN £60 A GRAM, BUT WAIT HERE AND I WILL SORT YOU OUT"

The officer watched Q speak to another male and that male later dealt a bag of cocaine each to the two officers. He then informed the officers that he himself was 'RED HOT, I CAN GET YOU WHATEVER, COCAINE OR MDMA".

2240 Thursday 1st November 2012

Undercover Police Officers entered Blue Rooms in order to locate and purchase from drug dealers.

During the evening a police officer (1) struck up a conversation with U. He informed the officer that he was able to acquire Cocaine for them.

Another officer (2) spoke to another male. This male stated that he was looking to buy cocaine that evening and a short time later the officer saw him speaking to U in the downstairs area of the club. The male informed the officer that U was selling 'GRAM DEALS FOR £40'. They then both spoke with who U informed them that he had one and a half grams of Cocaine that he would sell for £60. The officer and the male then paid £30 each for the white powder powder identified later as cocaine.

NB Police were called to attend outside the club at 0340hrs on the 2nd November 2012, after U was assaulted by a male. U had been knocked to the ground and refused medical attention. He would not make a complaint. PC 4461 WILLIAMS attended the scene and spoke with him.

Thursday 1st November 2012

Undercover Police Officers entered the Blue Rooms Nightclub, George Street, Bath in order to locate and purchase from drug dealers.

Whilst in the club the officers spoke to a male who informed him that he could put them in contact with someone who could sell them drugs.

At 0055hrs on the 2nd November 2012, they were introduced to Z, who agreed to sell them two grams of cocaine for £100.

Police officer (1) handed Z £50 and he handed the officer a small clear bag containing white powder identified later as cocaine.

Z informed the officer that he would need to go and pick up the other half from outside the club.

At 0110hrs Z returned to the club. He spoke to police officer (2) and placed a small self sealing bag containing white powder in his right jeans pocket, identified later as cocaine. The officer then handed £50 to Z.

Thursday 15th November 2012

Undercover Police Officers entered the Blue Rooms in order to locate and purchase from drug dealers.



At 00:20 hours on Friday 16th November 2012, they were stood near to the bar when one of the officers (1) spoke to a male. The officer asked him if he had seen two individuals who he had previously engaged with.' The male directed him towards T. The officer spoke to T and he asked him -

"DO YOU WANT SOME COKE?"

The officer replied that he did and T informed him that he would sort him out later and walked off. At about 00:45hrs T approached the officer with another male and told him, "I COULD ONLY GET 1 GRAM" and asked for £50 which was handed over by the officer. T passed him two small packets containing white powder identified later as cocaine.

23.30 Thursday 29th November 2012

Undercover Police Officers entered Blue Rooms in order to locate and purchase from drug dealers.

Whilst in the Blue Rooms a police officer (1) spoke to N, in the outside smoking area. N confirmed that he was a friend of a person that the undercover officers had bought cocaine from the previous week.

The officer informed N that he was looking to buy some cocaine. N informed the officer that he had cocaine and he would sell it for £80 a gram. The officer informed him that this was too expensive and N agreed to sell for £60. N then passed the officer a self sealing bag containing white powder, identified later as cocaine.

Another officer (2) was also present and asked if N had anymore. He produced another white bag and sold this for £60 to the officer, again identified later as cocaine.

A third officer (3) requested a bag of cocaine from N and he stated that he needed to make a call. He then left the smoking area.

A short time later the first police officer saw N in the male toilets. He was talking to another person and was heard to tell this person -

"GIVE ... A BELL AND TELL HIM TO BRING SOME MORE SHIT [drugs] DOWN"

N informed police officer (3) that his 'mate' might have some and a short time later
he spoke to officer (3) on the dance floor and on his request they went outside where
he sold the officer a bag of white powder for £60, identified later as cocaine.

23.00 Thursday 6th December 2012

Undercover Police Officers entered Blue Rooms in order to locate and purchase from drug dealers.

Police officer (1) entered into conversation with N. N asked him if he was "AFTER SOME COKE TONIGHT?". The officer said he was and that the others were too.

At 23:30 hours, whilst on the top dance floor, N indicated to the officer (1) to approach him. He told the officer he had 3 grams at £60 a gram. They negotiated a price of £55 per gram and he told the officer to follow him into the cubicle toilets. The officer handed £165 to N. In exchange N handed the officer 3 small bags of white powder, identified later as cocaine.

N later said to police officers (2) and (3), "IF YOU WANT ANYMORE, GIVE ME A SHOUT".

23.20 Thursday 13th December 2012

Undercover police officers entered Blue Rooms Night Club. Police officer (1) approached N in the club and N said to the officer "IVE GOT SOME GOOD STUFF FOR YOU BECAUSE YOU ARE A REGULAR CUSTOMER, LET ME KNOW IF YOU WANT IT".

At 23.32, all three officers went to the outside smoking area in the club. N asked police officer (1), "WHAT DO YOU WANT? A GRAM?"

The officer handed N £60 and he provided the officer with a clear plastic bag containing a white rock identified later as cocaine.



Police officer (2) then spoke to N, the officer handed over £60, in return he handed the officer £5 change and a clear seal bag containing white powder identified later as cocaine.

Results

The results from the undercover operation (incidents specifically linked to Blue Rooms) are as follows:

Offender 1 Charged 2 counts of supply controlled drugs (Class A) and 1 count of being concerned in offer to supply drugs (Class A). Remand in to custody until 11/2/13

Offender 2 Charged 2 counts of supply controlled drugs (Class A). Remand in to custody until 11/2/13

Offender 3 Charged 6 counts of supply controlled drugs (Class A). Remand in to custody until 11/2/13

Offender 4 Charged 1 count of supply controlled drugs (Class A). Remand in to custody until 11/2/13

Offender 5 Arrested on suspicion of 1 count of supply controlled drugs (Class A) and 1 count of being concerned in offer to supply drugs (Class A). Currently on police bail. Investigation ongoing

Offender 6 Arrested on suspicion of 1 count of supply controlled drugs (Class A). Currently on police bail. Investigation ongoing

Additional Observations by Undercover Police Officers

A police officer struck up a conversation with a member of bar staff in the Blue Rooms. The officer asked if a certain person [the officer had purchased drugs from this person the previous week] was in the bar. He said no. The officer asked about another person known to sell drugs in the Blue Rooms. The member of bar staff said, "AH I KNOW WHAT YOUR AFTER YOU WONT FIND ANY OF THAT SHIT [drugs] IN HERE TONIGHT, THE BOUNCERS ARE CLAMPING DOWN ON IT. IS BANNED AS HE WAS TOO BLATANT ABOUT IT, HE WOULD SPREAD IT OUR ALL OVER THE PLACE IN THE TOILETS"

A police officer struck up a conversation with a male in the Blue rooms. He stated that he had sold drugs to another person the previous week. That person had complained that the drugs were of inferior quality, and had assaulted him. As a result, he was not selling drugs this week, but would be selling them next week because it would be much better

quality. During the conversation the male stated he "SORTED EVERYONE OUT IN HERE WITH COKE". He had the appearance of being under the influence of a controlled drug. He was not drinking alcohol.

- A police officer made an enquiry with a male in the Blue Rooms regarding obtaining drugs. He said it would be £50 per gram. A while later he came back and told the officer that he had let them down as he could not get any cocaine.
- A police officer struck up a conversation with a male in the Blue rooms. This male knew a person known to the police officer who had previously been involved in the supply of drugs. The male asked if the officer wanted some sniff [drugs], and when told yes said he would go and get some. He later informed the officer that he could not get any, but gave the officer his telephone number and requested the officer call if wanted some on a later date.
- 23/11/12 No dealing observed in the Blue Rooms


This project provides an overview of all calls, recorded crimes and intelligence reports received from, or directly related to, The Blue Rooms Night Club, 1 York Buildings, Bath, over a period of just over 4 months (01/09/2012-15/01/2013).

There is a summary for each call (webstorm log) received to the Police relating to The Blue Rooms and each crime (Guardian incident) recorded at The Blue Rooms.

In order to ensure that an accurate representation was generated, Web storm logs and Guardian were searched under the 3 locations of 'The Blue Rooms', '1 York Buildings' and 'George Street' as research revealed some logs/incidents recorded with the location of George Street and York Buildings actually related directly to The Blue Rooms.

The Blue Rooms is situated on George Street which is notorious for anti social behaviour and violent crime linked to the Night Time Economy, especially on the weekends, due to the number of licensed bars and clubs in the vicinity.


Between July and December 2012 the majority of Violent Offences in Bath Nightclubs occur at the Blue Rooms (31%).




Overview of all Incidents relating to The Blue Rooms

The majority of the calls in this period were received from members of the public. The breakdown of informant type is shown below.









Crimes reported at The Blue Rooms

There have been 20 reported offences at The Blue Rooms between 01/09/2012 and 15/01/2013. The offence types are detailed in the chart below. 8 of these offences have a linked webstorm log.



5 of these 19 offences relate to one incident on 07/09/2012 when a large fight broke out inside the club and spilled out onto George Street resulting in 5 arrests for violent crime and public order.

The majority (77%) of thefts reported in The Blue Rooms are mobile phones.

In summary the majority of calls received to The Blue Rooms within the period 01/09/2012 and 15/01/2013 are on The Blue Rooms' themed nights. The peak time for calls is 0045-0315hrs.

Of the offences reported for The Blue Rooms nearly half are theft (mainly mobile phones), 35% are assault offences and 15% are public order offences.

Between 2006 to date there have been 143 intelligence reports submitted which have been directly linked to The Blue Rooms on Guardian.

21 of the recent intelligence reports are concerning the supply of class A drugs - cocaine at the premises.

These have come from a variety of sources including previously reliable sources.

The Blue Rooms Research Summary.

This project provides details of all calls, recorded crimes, and intelligence reports received from, or *directly* related to, The Blue Rooms Night Club, Bath, over a period of six months.

The research has been divided up accordingly and each section begins with a brief overview of the data gathered. There is also a summary of the licence details for the premises at the start of the report.

In order to ensure that an accurate representation was generated, data was sourced from Guardian and Assist. Web Storm logs were trawled under the three locations of 'Blue Rooms', '1 York Buildings' and 'George Street' as many logs were found to be inaccurate in terms of location provided and some logs that had initially been started under the location of George Street actually related directly to The Blue Rooms when the main body of the text was read through.

At the end of the report are some statements from Police Officers who have attended incidents at the Blue Rooms. These statements highlight the various inadequacies associated with the premises in terms of staff professionalism and cooperativeness, levels of intoxication of club goers, and the extent of various fights and assaults in and outside the club.

A DVD has also been compiled providing evidence of the various problems the club poses on police, members of public and nearby residents and businesses.

Overview of all Incidents Relating to Blue Rooms

This overview combines the research generated from Assist logs for all calls received to The Blue Rooms under the three locations of 'The Blue Rooms', '1 York Buildings' and 'George Street'.


In summary, the most salient findings are that assaults are the highest occurring incident at the locality. The busiest nights in terms of police attendance at the club are Fridays and, not surprisingly, Tuesdays, which offer two for one deals on drinks.


Disturbance/ nuisance calls to the premises are also disproportionately high and it has been commented on by a number of officers that support from door staff following 'kicking out' time is minimal at best, resulting in large crowds of intoxicated club goers gathering on George Street. Often, this results in fights, and inevitably incurs excessive noise and disturbance to local residents and businesses after 03:00 in the morning.



Calls Recorded on Assist Under Search Parameters 'George Street Bath' between 7th March 2012 and 7th September 2012

The following tables summarise calls recorded on 'Assist' relating to incidents on George Street, Bath, that occurred between the dates of 07/03/2012 and 07/09/2012.

Under these search parameters, 79 calls were received to the location of George Street, and of these incidents, twelve were directly related to The Blue Rooms nightclub.

Although the location in the location field is originally given as George Street for these twelve incidents, the main text in the log later specifies the location as The Blue Rooms, or directly outside The Blue Rooms.

These incidents primarily relate to disorder directly outside the premise, where fights take place between customers, large numbers of clubbers gather and create excessive noise and public order offences.

Of particular note, Incident 2 highlights the lack of assistance officers receive from door staff when dealing with large numbers of people in the near vicinity of the Blue Rooms who have left the premise and are gathering in a way that is dangerous to road users of George Street and also where there is the potential for disorder to occur.

Incident 9 paints a worrying picture of the professionalism of the door staff when dealing with customers, whereby two bouncers are arrested for assault and subject to the RJ process.

Sergeant O'Brien on patrol on George Street 0310hrs

 Saw crowd of over 80 persons leaving the club. They were wandering in the road disrupting traffic. Many were very drunk. There were pockets of disorder amongst them. There were no members of door staff in attendance until they were summed via a telephone call made by the police communications dept. Other officers attended and it took twenty minutes to disperse the crowd.

7/9/12 0031hrs. Constables Bishop and Claridge on Patrol George Street

- Flagged down by member of Blue Rooms staff who stated a
 male was unconscious in the club having been bottled. A
 number of males were leaving the club they were angry and
 argumentative and had to be separated from each other. A

 from the Blue Rooms continued to be aggressive towards the

Whilst I was engaging with the males I noticed a female laid on the floor in the doorway of WAGAMAMAS restaurant. She had been ejected from the BLUE ROOMS nightclub and was vomiting on the pavement. There was a small group of people around her assisting her and I therefore carried on dealing with the reported incident.

PC BISHOP returned to DRAPER and arrested him on suspicion of assault ABH. DRAPER was handcuffed by PC BISHOP and placed in the rear of the police vehicle. I stood next to the vehicle while PC BISHOP went back to the larger group in order to obtain details for statements. The atmosphere became volatile at this stage with members of the larger group approaching the police vehicle and threatening DRAPER. It was clear from their language that they felt aggrieved that one of their friends had been assaulted. In addition DRAPER was goading the other males by laughing at them and pressing his face up against the window. I had to push a number of males away from the vehicle in order to prevent further offences. By this time we had requested further units to support us as we were heavily outnumbered and some individuals were becoming aggressive toward DRAPER and TURNER who was stood next to me.

PC BISHOP called my name and I saw him pointing at TURNER stating he needed to be arrested as well. I therefore approached TURNER at 00:45 and said "MY COLLEAGUE HAS STATED THAT YOU HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN THE INCIDENT THEREFORE I AM ARRESTING YOU ON SUSPICION OF ASSAULT ABH". I placed him in handcuffs, front stack and cautioned him to which he nedded. I now had two prisoners to control and I placed TURNER against the police vehicle while we waited for further units to attend.

PC 785 PINKARD and PC 2794 MAGEE attended and TURNER was handed over to PC MAGEE and placed in their police vehicle. Inspector 881 MOORE also attended and

A number of angry males were exiting BLUE ROOMS onto GEORGE STREET, initially PC CLARIDGE and I attempted to calm the parties down and were keeping the arguing parties separate, most of the anger was being directed at DRAPER

A male, who would not give his details, was taken out of the nightclub by door staff and I heard the door staff tell the male to sit on the floor as he had been knocked out in the club. I approached this male and asked who had assaulted him in the club, the male saw DRAPER and identified him as assaulting him.

Following this information at 00.40 hours I approached DRAPER and said "You have beer identified as being responsible for assaulting a male in BLUE ROOMS, possibly knocking him unconscious, I am therefore arresting you on suspicion of assault". I then cautioned DRAPER to which he replied "WHAT ARE YOU ON ABOUT, I'M THE ONE WHO'S BEEN ASSAULTED LOADS OF THEM FUCKING STARTED ON ME".

I handcuffed DRAPER in a front stack position, double locking the cuffs and placed him in the rear of the patrol vehicle. DRAPER continued to protest his innocents. He was slurring his words, had blood shot eyes and had foam around the corners of his mouth. His breath smelt of intoxicating liquor, in my opinion he was drunk.

There was still a large amount of males on GEORGE STREET outside of BLUE ROOMS, being aggressive, shouting and swearing. I called for more units in order to deal with the disorder and to establish exactly what else had occurred.

I approached the male who said DRAPER had assaulted him, he gave his details as Jon .

WILLIAMS of BATTLESBURY BARRACKS, however, he then became evasive and wouldn't provide any further details.

At some point during the incident I saw a member of BLUE ROOMS door staff carry a female out in his arms and leave her in the door way immediately to the left of the night club as you look at it. Initially I thought she may have been injured, however, it turned out she was very intoxicated. She was just left in the doorway slumped, she was conscious and breathing. I was later informed by PC CLARIDGE that this female was being sick.

Tempers continued to flare and other units and an ambulance arrived on GEORGE STREET. Angry males were trying to get at DRAPER whilst he was in the rear of the patrol vehicle and so we continued to keep them at bay. DRAPER remained in the rear of the patrol vehicle, however, he was banging on the window and kissing the window in order to antagonise the other males.

Another male came out of the nightclub, I approached him to see if he could help with my enquiries. As I was speaking to him he saw DRAPER in the patrol vehicle and identified DRAPER as being responsible for assaulting his friend Ryan TAYLOR by hitting him with a champagne bottle. He also pointed out the male PC CLARIDGE was with in the blue and white stripy shirt and advised me he was involved in the assault. I informed PC CLARIDGE of this and he arrested TURNER.

As more units arrived to deal with the large hostile group of males all angry at DRAPER I sat in the patrol vehicle with DRAPER. DRAPER continued to taunt the males, kissing the window and laughing at them shouting "YOUR MATE GOT KNOCKED OUT!" he continued to repeat this comment.

DRAPER was escorted to BATH custody (SE/2657/12) whilst he was being booked in as well as the scratches on his torso I also noticed that he had a small cut to the left side of his head above his temple.

entry to the club. This male was not being aggressive but was being persistent. The man in the black hooded top asked if we could move him on. PC HANCOCK and I engaged the male in conversation in an attempt to move him away. As we did so, the male in the black hooded top said to the other male, "IF YOU'VE GOT MY PICTURE ON THAT PHONE, I PUT IT ON THE GROUND AND STAMP ON IT."

This was aggressively said. It provoked a reaction from the male. I negotiated for the male to leave.

I then turned my attention to the male in the black hooded top and asked if he worked at the Blue Rooms. He stated that he did. I asked where his SIA badge was. He reached to his pocket and removed it claiming to have forgotten to put it on. I explained that he must wear it as part of licensing conditions.

I then challenged him about the aggressive and provocative way he dealt with the male outside. He became aggressive towards me detailing that the male had threatened to use his photo to have him beaten up. I had never heard anything like this mentioned.

I asked for his name and he was reluctant to give it. He said his name was Rich Phillips. I explained how he had been unprofessional and provocative, he over spoke to the point I had to raise my voice to be heard by him. PHILLIPS was clearly annoyed at having been challenged. At that point PC HANCOCK and I commenced a period of foot patrol along George Street and down Milsom Street. As we walked along Milsom Street I saw an extremely drunk male walking towards me with a female. He could hardly stand and was bouncing along the walls to balance himself. He had a bald head and was wearing a distinctive checked shirt. I spoke to the female who stated that she was taking him home as he was too drunk.

About 15 minutes later PC HANCOCK and I returned to the Blue Rooms. When we were stood there I was aware of a male leaving the club. He walked up the stairs and then fell up them. He was not assisted by the door staff. This man then attempted to enter the street. He held on to the metal railings but then literally span slowly around still holding on, ending up on the floor. He was absolutely drunk. He could hardly stand and had lost his balance. Again the door staff did not assist. The man's friends tended to him and removed him.

A short time later I was surprised to see the male in the checked shirt and the female who we'd passed earlier in Milsom Street, leave the club. We attempted to engage him in conversation but he was so drunk that he could not talk.

I was not impressed with the situation as the safety of the customers appeared to have been compromised. The door staff member did not portray himself as a professional or competent to me.


drunkenness was so extreme that she fell back down again. The entire group of about ten people were all drunk, and one was eventually given a Notice to Leave, by PC BOX.

Shows a male from the Blue Rooms come out of the club. He is seen to push a female down the stairs. The male was arrested and charged with an offence of common assault. Also shows several people hanging around outside of the premises. No attempts by door staff to move these people away.

Shows a male come out of the club. He is very drunk and argumentative. He assaults a member of door staff. He is subsequently arrested and charged with assault.

The Circus Area Residents Association (CARA) has been established since 1987, and our membership consists of over a hundred households. George Street forms one of the boundaries of this area, and we have members living there and very close by.

We are writing in support of the Police application.

Residents living in the vicinity regularly complain about noise nuisance and antisocial behaviour emanating from late night licensed premises in George Street, including the Blue Rooms. This includes shouting, street urination and vomiting, as well as vandalism. In addition residents have seen evidence of public drug taking. George Street has a disproportionately high rate of violent crime and disorder; police statistics show that in the year to September 2012 some 12% of reported violent crime in the city took place here.

Residents often see acts of antisocial behaviour - some of it violent - and public nuisance, much of which is not reported. Most of this comes directly from the operation of the night time economy. George Street has a large number of licensed premises; many of these operate very late at night and in the early hours of the morning, the Blue Rooms being one of the largest.

The crowds outside the Blue Rooms are a regular cause of noise and disturbance to both residents and visitors, and elderly residents have been intimidated by the crowds a number of whom appear intoxicated blocking the pavement, which often means they feel forced to leave the pavement and walk in a busy street, which is patently unsafe.

A considerable number of households in the George Street area are adversely affected by the night time economy. Drugs and drug taking in the early hours are becoming much more noticeable thereabouts. Most residents know about the reported findings on which the Police recommendations to the committee are based. They will feel that it is absolutely essential that the committee support the Police in dealing with what seems to be a focal point of both crime and disorder and public nuisance.

Founded in 2000, the Abbey Residents Association (TARA) has about three hundred members including a number in the area surrounding these premises, indeed our chairman lives in George Street. TARA seeks to improve conditions for those living in the city centre.

We are writing in support of the Police application.

George Street is a focus for drink fuelled antisocial behaviour. Residents and tourists regularly complain about noise nuisance generated by the trading practices of local late night licence premises, including the Blue Rooms.

Residents are routinely exposed to noise, street urination and defecation as well as acts of vandalism. In addition residents have often observed evidence of public drug taking. George Street is a focus for violent crime and disorder with police statistics appearing to show some 12% of reported violent crime in the city taking place is this one street. Residents regularly witness violence and anti-social behaviour, a good proportion of which goes unreported.

Much of this crime and disorder is directly attributable to the operation of the night time economy. George Street has the greatest density of licence premises in the city centre; a sizable proportion of these have very late night/early morning hours of operation. The Blue Rooms is one of the largest of these.

Residents and visitors regularly report being disturbed by noisy crowds outside the Blue Rooms and many elderly residents report feeling intimidated by the crowds who often obstruct the pavement. Many of those on the pavement and in the basement corrodor outside the Blue Rooms give every appearance of being drunk. We have observed people leaving other premises on George Street, which have earlier closing hours, and going into the Blue Rooms to finish their night many of these also show signs of intoxication. No doubt they are in part attracted by the sort of drinks deals advertised on the Blue Room's Facebook site an example of which is:

"Drinks deals threw out the night starting with 99p jäger bombs,"

A large number of families live in and around George Street and are impacted by the operation of licenced premises. Drugs and drug taking have become an increasingly visible feature of the night scene in this area.

Most residents are aware of the reported findings which form the basis of the Police recommendations to the committee and will feel that it is vital that the committee support the Police in tackling what, on the basis of what has been reported, is a centre of crime and
