#### 8 WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS

The Chair welcomed those present to the meeting and introduced the other members of the Sub-Committee and the officers in attendance.

#### 9 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE AND SUBSTITUTIONS

There were none.

#### 10 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

The Chair explained that she had previously carried out some casework for David & Jeanette Carr a number of years ago when she was a councillor in their area, but stressed that she did not consider this precluded her sitting on the panel and that she had not had any prior conversations with them regarding the application before the Sub-Committee today.

The Chair also informed those present that she had been copied in on an email from Councillor Sue Craig regarding The Provenist, querying Planning matters and making some observations in relation to the licensing application. She added that she had only acknowledged receipt of the email and had not discussed the application with Councillor Craig and had disregarded any observations made as Councillor Craig had not made a valid representation in relation to the application. The Chair indicated that she had an open mind in relation to the application and would not make her mind up until she had considered the report, all relevant factors contained within it and heard all points of view at the hearing.

#### 11 TO ANNOUNCE ANY URGENT BUSINESS AGREED BY THE CHAIR

There was none.

#### 12 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING - 25TH JUNE 2020

These were approved as a correct record.

#### 13 LICENSING PROCEDURE

The Chair explained the procedure for the meeting to all parties who were present.

The parties confirmed that they understood the procedure to be followed for the hearing.

## 14 PROVENIST, THE TRAMSHED, BEEHIVE YARD, BATH. BA1 5BB - APPLICATION - VARIATION OF EXISTING PREMISES LICENCE

The Senior Licensing Officer outlined the application from Provenist Limited to the Sub-Committee. She explained that it was to vary an existing premises licence to add the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises between the hours of 08:00 – 21:45 every day.

She stated that Provenist was a licensed café within Neptune, a furniture and kitchen retail establishment.

She informed the Sub-Committee that eight representations of objection had been received from interested parties within the statutory period.

She confirmed that none of the Responsible Authorities had made any representations relating to the application.

Ed Taylor, Head of Operations for Neptune stated the case for the applicant and was questioned by Members and the interested parties present.

Dr Jennifer Sleep, Mrs Valerie Lockley and David & Jeanette Carr stated the case on behalf of the interested parties and they were questioned by Members and the applicant.

#### **Decision and reasons**

Members have determined an application to vary the Premises Licence for Provenist, The Tramshed, Beehive Yard, Bath, BA1 5BB. In doing so, they have taken into consideration the Licensing Act 2003, Statutory Guidance, the Council's Policy, Human Rights Act 1998 and case law.

Members are aware the proper approach under the Licensing Act is to be reluctant to regulate in the absence of evidence and they must only do what is appropriate and proportionate on the information before them.

#### The Applicant

Ed Taylor Head of Operations at Neptune indicated that the purpose of the application is to try and get more covers for the business to enable them to continue

to trade with social distancing measures and government guidelines in place. He explained to members that the terrace is used currently as a show area for garden furniture from Neptune and it is intended with the licence that customers will be able to have lunch or breakfast with a glass of wine or half a pint of beer. The premises do not anticipate greater footfall if the licence is granted; will work with residents regarding concerns over access and have a meeting with residents scheduled next week to discuss issues arising.

Mr Taylor indicated to Members that the premises do not run alcohol promotions; they are not a pub or bar and there will be no sale of spirits. Mr Taylor indicated that the reason for off sales being sought to 9:45pm was to enable events to take place however, he would be agreeable to reducing the hours for off sales of alcohol to 6:00pm if that is helpful to residents.

#### **Responsible Authorities**

There were no representations received from Responsible Authorities.

#### **Interested Parties**

There have been eight representations from residents living in the vicinity of the premises objecting to consumption of alcohol within the external seating area on the basis that this will undermine the prevention of public nuisance and public safety licensing objectives.

Objectors expressed concerns regarding safety and access issues for residents – particularly disabled people - in relation to the external seating area. They indicated that use of the external area was problematic in any event but felt that it would be worsened as a result of customers drinking alcohol.

Furthermore, they were concerned by the nuisance they would be caused from noise generated by customers sitting in the external seating area and consuming alcohol as late as 9:45pm, given that they live in apartments above the premises.

#### **Members**

Members noted that this variation application was to add the sale of alcohol for consumption off premises to allow the operation of an alcohol delivery service and

for customers to consume alcohol purchased in the indoor café within the external seating area.

Members found that none of the Interested Parties had objected to off sales for the purpose of the operation of the alcohol delivery service; concerns and objections centred around the consumption of off sales in the external seating areas of the premises.

Whilst Interested Parties raised concerns in relation to planning issues Members reminded themselves that planning and licensing are separate regimes and that the onus is on the applicant to ensure that they have all necessary permissions in place to run their business within the law.

Members were mindful that any concerns raised regarding covenants between the landlord and tenant were a private matter and not the remit of the LSC for whom the licensing objectives are paramount.

Furthermore, members had sympathy with the Interested Parties for the concerns raised in relation to access for residents with disabilities. They reminded themselves again though, that the licensing objectives were paramount in their decision making for this application.

Members understood the concerns raised by the Interested Parties however, they did not find on the information before them that the proposed variation application would have a detrimental effect on the licensing objectives raised, which could not be adequately mitigated by the measures offered in the application. Members noted however, that the Interested Parties could call for a review of the licence at any time were there to be evidence that the licensing objectives were being undermined.

Accordingly, authority is delegated to the Licensing Officer to issue the licence with conditions consistent with the operating schedule which members found to be appropriate and proportionate in the promotion of the licensing objectives of prevention of public nuisance and promotion of public safety.

#### **Note**

Members noted that any business that provides goods, facilities or services to members of the public are required in accordance with the Equality Act 2010 to

make reasonable adjustments to ensure their premises are accessible to disabled people.

Whilst members did not take the forthcoming meeting into account in reaching their decision, they welcome the fact that the premises representatives are meeting with residents and encourage them to resolve the issues and concerns raised around access.

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# LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE LICENSING ACT 2003 PROCEDURE FOR HEARING AN APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE OR FOR A VARIATION OF A PREMISES LICENCE

The Chair will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to make representations that will not normally exceed <u>twenty minutes</u>. Where more than one party makes relevant representations this time will be split between the parties and where several parties make similar representations it is suggested one representative is appointed to avoid duplication.

The term "party" or "parties" will mean anyone to whom notice of this meeting has been given.

- 1. The Chair will introduce Members of the Sub-Committee, the Officers present and explain the procedure to be followed.
- 2. The Licensing Officer will outline the nature of the matter to be considered by the Sub-Committee.
- **3. (i)** The Applicant/Licence Holder, or representative, addresses the Sub-Committee who may be asked relevant questions by the other parties and Members.
  - (ii) witnesses may be called in support of the application who may be asked relevant questions by the other parties and Members.
- **4. (i)** Any party making relevant representations, or representative, will address the Sub-Committee who may be asked relevant questions by the Applicant, other parties and Members.
  - (ii) witnesses may be called in support of such representations who may be asked relevant questions by the Applicant, other parties and Members.
- **5.** Responsible Authorities making representation will address the Committee and may be asked relevant questions by the Applicant, other parties and Members.
- **6.** The other parties will be invited in turn to summarise their representations.
  - Responsible Authorities will be invited to summarise their representations
  - The Applicant/ Licence Holder will be invited to summarise the application.
- 8. The Chair will invite the Committee to move into private session to enable the Members to deliberate in private. The Committee will reconvene publicly if clarification of evidence is required and/or legal advice is required. The Committee may retire to a private room, or alternatively require vacation of the room by all other persons.

Whilst in deliberation the Committee will be accompanied by Legal and Democratic Service Officers for the purpose of assisting them in drafting their reasoning for the decision.

The Committee will reconvene the meeting and the Chair will announce the Committee's decision with reasons and advise that the decision will be released in writing within the statutory time limits or advise that the decision will be

released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limit, in this instance, 5 working days.


#### PLEASE NOTE:

- Where the Sub-Committee considers it necessary to do so, it may vary this procedure.
- In circumstances where a party fails to attend the Committee will consider whether to proceed in absence. Should a matter be deferred the deferral notice will state that the matter may proceed in a party's absence on the next occasion. In deciding whether to proceed all notices, communications and representations will be considered.
- Only in <u>exceptional circumstances</u> will the Committee take into account any
  additional late documentary or other information produced by an existing party
  in support of their application/representation. This will be at the discretion of
  the Chair and with the agreement of all the other parties. No new
  representations will be allowed at the hearing.
- The hearing will take the form of a discussion and parties will be able to ask questions as set out above. However, formal cross examination will be discouraged.
- The Authority will disregard any information or representation given by a party which is not relevant to the Application and the Licensing Act 2003.
- Where there is more than one party making relevant representations the time allocated will be split between those parties.
- Where several parties are making the same or similar representations it is suggested that one representative is appointed to avoid duplication and make efficient use of the allocated time.
- Where an objection is made by an association or residents group, a duly authorised person – as notified to the Licensing Authority – may speak on behalf of that association or group.
- The Chair may request that persons behaving in a disruptive manner should leave the hearing and their return refused, or allowed subject to conditions.
   An excluded person is however, entitled to submit the information they would have been entitled to present had they not been excluded.

Bath & North East Somerset Council is committed to taking decisions in an honest, accountable and transparent fashion. On occasion however, it may be necessary to exclude members of the press and public pursuant to the Local Government Act 1972 Schedule 12 (a). In those circumstances reasons for such decisions will be given.

#### 1 THE ISSUE

- 1.1 An application has been made under s.17 Licensing Act 2003 by Charles Simpson in respect of a premises licence for Pipley Barn Café, Brockham End, Lansdown, Bath BA1 9BZ.
- 1.2 Relevant representations have been received within the statutory period.

#### 2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 The Committee is asked to determine the application.

#### 3 THE REPORT

- 3.1 An application has been received for a new Premises Licence (Annex A).
- 3.2 The application proposes the following licensable activity:

The Sale of Alcohol for consumption on and off the premises:

Monday to Thursday

08:00 to 21:00 hours

Friday to Sunday

08:00 to 23:00 hours

3.3 The application proposes the following opening times:

Monday to Thursday

08:00 to 21:30 hours

Friday to Sunday

08:00 to 23:30 hours

- 3.4 The following measures have been offered by the applicant within the Operating Schedule to promote the licensing objectives:
  - Staff training. All staff to be trained in the prevention of underage sales
    to a level commensurate with their duties. The training should be clearly
    documented and signed and dated by both the trainer and the member
    of staff receiving it. The documentation shall be available for inspection
    on request by an authorised officer of the licensing authority or police.
  - The Premises Licence Holder shall require the Designated Premises Supervisor or in his/her absence other responsible person to keep an incident/refusal logbook in a bound book in which full details of incidents are recorded. The logbook is to be kept on the premises at all times and shall be produced to an authorised officer of the police or licensing authority when requested.
  - No regulated entertainment shall take place at the premises.
  - A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be adopted, implemented and advertised at the premises. An accepted form of photographic identification shall be requested before any alcohol is sold to any person who appears to be under 21 years of age. Acceptable proof of age shall include identification bearing the customers photograph, date of birth and integral holographic mark or security measure. Suitable means of identification would include PASS approved proof of age card, photo card driving licence and passport.
- 3.5 The plan of the proposed premises and a site plan are attached at Annex B.
- 3.6 The Licensing Act 2003 (Section 4) states that it is the duty of all Licensing Authorities to carry out their functions under the Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:

the prevention of crime and disorder;

public safety;

the prevention of public nuisance; and

the protection of children from harm

- 3.7 Each objective is of equal importance. As there are no other licensing objectives, these four are of paramount consideration at all times. When considering applications, representations or notifications, the Licensing Authority will have regard to these licensing objectives.
- 3.8 The Licensing Authority may grant the application with or without additional conditions.

3.9 Section 4(3) Licensing Act 2003 states that the Licensing Authority should also have regard to the Council's Licensing Policy, the Statutory Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and the Licensing Act itself, and in particular to:

Paragraphs 3-6, 8-10, 13-14, 17-24, 29, 33-36, 38-41 of the 2020 Policy.

Chapters 2, 8, 9 and 10 of the Statutory Guidance as revised April 2018;

Sections 4, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 16, 17, 18, 23, 182, and 183 of the Act

- 3.10 The Licensing Authority recognises that Licensing and Planning are separate regimes. Where an application is granted by the Licensing Authority which would require planning permission this would not relieve the applicant of the need to obtain that permission. It will still be necessary for the applicant to ensure that he/she has **ALL** the necessary permissions in place to enable them to run the business within the law.
- 3.11 If the application is refused the applicant may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates' Court. If the application is granted the person making the relevant representation may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates' Court. On appeal the court may either dismiss the appeal, substitute the decision appealed against for any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of in accordance with the direction of the court. The court may make such order for costs as it thinks fit.
- 3.12 In accordance with the requirements of the Act, copies of the application were forwarded to the Police, the Fire Authority, Environmental Health, Development Control, Trading Standards, Health Authority and the Safeguarding Children and Young Persons Team.
- 3.13 The applicant was required to place a notice at the premises for a period of 28 consecutive days starting the day after the application was made, and to place an advert in a local newspaper within 10 working days of submitting the application to the licensing authority.
- 3.14 Twenty-four representations of objection have been received within the statutory period from Other Persons all expressing concern that the applicant's proposals are likely to have a detrimental effect on the Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objective; three of these representations of objection also make reference to the Public Safety licensing objective (Annex C).
- 3.15 As relevant representations have been received, the Licensing Sub Committee must determine the application in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.

#### 4 STATUTORY CONSIDERATIONS

- 4.1 An Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA) has been completed. No adverse or other significant issues were found.
- 4.2 Consideration must be given to the Human Rights Act 1998 and the "convention rights".
- 4.3 The Sub Committee have been delegated authority to determine the application on behalf of the Licensing Authority in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.4 When reaching a decision, the Licensing Authority must carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives.

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#### 5 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCE, PROPERTY, PEOPLE)

5.1 The costs of processing licences are covered by the fees charged. The fee for this application is £100.00.

#### 6 RISK MANAGEMENT

6.1 A risk assessment related to the issue and recommendations has been undertaken, in compliance with the Council's decision making risk management guidance.

#### 7 CLIMATE CHANGE

7.1 The licensing objectives do not require the applicant to specify steps to mitigate the impact of climate emergency. However, the applicant is encouraged to consider locally sourced ingredients and to reduce single use plastic in the operation of their business.

#### 8 OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

8.1 None.

#### 9 CONSULTATION

- 9.1 The Council's Monitoring Officer (Director Legal & Democratic Services and Council Solicitor), Section 151 Officer (Director of Finance) and Head of Building Control and Public Protection have had opportunity to input to this report and have cleared it for publication.
- 9.2 This report has not been sent to the Trades' Union as they would have no involvement.

I live in Brockham End, which is a small cluster of houses at the head of a very steep valley. The shape of the valley seems to make sound amplify and echo, which means that we have to be more considerate of our neighbours and the local wildlife with regard to noise. Since opening on 09 May 2020 Pipley Barn has had a noticeable impact on the tranquility of this area. Whether it is a group of 20 people cheering at a juggling act, or a small group of musicians playing folk music, we can clearly hear it in our garden. During the winter, when the trees have dropped their leaves, or when the air is still and little else is happening at night, I believe the noise will be even more noticeable.

I appreciate that the cafe intends to be a "family orientated premise (that) appeals to walkers and to those who are appreciative of nature and wildlife." and I am supportive of them selling alcoholic drinks during the day. However, I am concened about the potential for increased noise nuisance, for myself and the neighbourhood, if an alcohol license is granted to supply alcohol for consumption both on and off premises late into the evening.

Whilst I am aware that Planning and Licensing are separate regimes, to promote the licensing objectives, I request that this licence is restricted to the hours of the Planning Permission provision (see application no:14/02484/FUL), where it was stated that "The café use hereby approved shall not be carried on and no customer shall be served or remain on the premises outside the hours of 09:00 and 16:00. These hours were a condition of the planning permission "to safeguard the amenities of nearby occupiers." According to planningportal.co.uk, 'amenity' is taken to mean "A positive element or elements that contribute to the overall character or enjoyment of an area. #### Prevention of Public Nuisance

The premises are in a sensitive rural area directly on the Cotswold Way, and adjacent to Pipley Wood, where walkers, cyclists and golfers come to enjoy a peaceful location. This will be significantly altered if alcohol is served all day long and raises particular concerns about public nuisance due to:

- Noise: as this is a quiet rural location where the amenity of the area is likely to be adversely affected by increased noise associated with the sale of alcohol and the risk it additionally attracts people who are not interested in preserving the peaceful nature of the location.
- Hours of licensing: The proposed hours (08:00 to 23:00 on Friday to Sunday and 08:00 to 21:00 Monday to Thursday) are excessive and very likely to cause disturbance at unsocial hours for neighbours at Brockham End, the golf course and the wider community who enjoy this peaceful recreation space. I am aware the Licensing Committee do not take planning matters into consideration. However, it is notable that when planning was granted recently for the conversion of the barn to a café and bunkhouse there were planning conditions imposed that the café should only operate between the hours of 09:00 and 16:00 "to safeguard the amenities of nearby occupiers". I would expect a similar consideration should be applied here as a minimum to include a restriction in the licensing hours to prevent public nuisance and protect the amenity of the location for nearby occupiers and the many people who walk, cycle and otherwise exercise there, as well as the wildlife in Pipley Wood.

#### **Public Safety**

The premises are in a remote location and lack any vehicle access - they are served only by a bridleway. Therefore, I would expect the emergency services to have concerns about locating and accessing the site. The potential need for the emergency services to attend the site are heightened if alcohol is served all day long.
