LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE LICENSING ACT 2003 PROCEDURE FOR HEARING AN APPLICATION FOR A NEW PREMISES LICENCE OR FOR A VARIATION OF A PREMISES LICENCE

The Chair will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to make representations that will not normally exceed <u>twenty minutes</u>. Where more than one party makes relevant representations this time will be split between the parties and where several parties make similar representations it is suggested one representative is appointed to avoid duplication.

The term "party" or "parties" will mean anyone to whom notice of this meeting has been given.

- 1. The Chair will introduce Members of the Sub-Committee, the Officers present and explain the procedure to be followed.
- 2. The Licensing Officer will outline the nature of the matter to be considered by the Sub-Committee.
- **3. (i)** The Applicant/Licence Holder, or representative, addresses the Sub-Committee who may be asked relevant questions by the other parties and Members.
 - (ii) witnesses may be called in support of the application who may be asked relevant questions by the other parties and Members.
- **4. (i)** Any party making relevant representations, or representative, will address the Sub-Committee who may be asked relevant questions by the Applicant, other parties and Members.
 - (ii) witnesses may be called in support of such representations who may be asked relevant questions by the Applicant, other parties and Members.
- **5.** Responsible Authorities making representation will address the Committee and may be asked relevant questions by the Applicant, other parties and Members.
- **6.** The other parties will be invited in turn to summarise their representations.
 - Responsible Authorities will be invited to summarise their representations
 - The Applicant/ Licence Holder will be invited to summarise the application.
- 8. The Chair will invite the Committee to move into private session to enable the Members to deliberate in private. The Committee will reconvene publicly if clarification of evidence is required and/or legal advice is required. The Committee may retire to a private room, or alternatively require vacation of the room by all other persons.

Whilst in deliberation the Committee will be accompanied by Legal and Democratic Service Officers for the purpose of assisting them in drafting their reasoning for the decision.

The Committee will reconvene the meeting and the Chair will announce the Committee's decision with reasons and advise that the decision will be released in writing within the statutory time limits or advise that the decision will be

released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limit, in this instance, 5 working days.


PLEASE NOTE:

- Where the Sub-Committee considers it necessary to do so, it may vary this procedure.
- In circumstances where a party fails to attend the Committee will consider whether to proceed in absence. Should a matter be deferred the deferral notice will state that the matter may proceed in a party's absence on the next occasion. In deciding whether to proceed all notices, communications and representations will be considered.
- Only in <u>exceptional circumstances</u> will the Committee take into account any
 additional late documentary or other information produced by an existing party
 in support of their application/representation. This will be at the discretion of
 the Chair and with the agreement of all the other parties. No new
 representations will be allowed at the hearing.
- The hearing will take the form of a discussion and parties will be able to ask questions as set out above. However, formal cross examination will be discouraged.
- The Authority will disregard any information or representation given by a party which is not relevant to the Application and the Licensing Act 2003.
- Where there is more than one party making relevant representations the time allocated will be split between those parties.
- Where several parties are making the same or similar representations it is suggested that one representative is appointed to avoid duplication and make efficient use of the allocated time.
- Where an objection is made by an association or residents group, a duly authorised person – as notified to the Licensing Authority – may speak on behalf of that association or group.
- The Chair may request that persons behaving in a disruptive manner should leave the hearing and their return refused, or allowed subject to conditions.
 An excluded person is however, entitled to submit the information they would have been entitled to present had they not been excluded.

Bath & North East Somerset Council is committed to taking decisions in an honest, accountable and transparent fashion. On occasion however, it may be necessary to exclude members of the press and public pursuant to the Local Government Act 1972 Schedule 12 (a). In those circumstances reasons for such decisions will be given.

1 THE ISSUE

- 1.1 An application has been received for the Variation of an existing premises licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of Common Room, 2 Saville Row, Bath BA1 2QP.
- 1.2 Relevant representations have been received within the statutory period.

2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 The committee is asked to determine the application.

3 THE REPORT

- 3.1 An application has been received to vary an existing premises licence as detailed in Annex A.
- 3.2 The current premises licence is detailed in Annex B.
- 3.3 The Variation application seeks to:
 - ADD the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises:

Monday to Thursday 10:00 to 02:00 the following morning

Friday and Saturday 10:00 to 03:00 the following morning

Sunday 12:00 to 02:00 the following morning

• REMOVE the following conditions attached to Annex 1 of the current licence:

There shall be no off sales.

Sales of intoxicating liquor to be limited only to bona fide members of a club existing on the premises and their quests.

- 3.4 The following measures to promote the licensing objectives have been offered by the applicant within the operating schedule:
 - Staff shall be trained on issues regarding the Licensing Act 2003, service
 of alcohol. A record of this training will be kept and made available for
 inspection as required by the Police or Licensing Authority;
 - The premises will maintain an incident and refusals register. This will
 remain at the premises and be made available to an authorised officer of
 the police or licensing authority on request;
 - All alcohol supplied for consumption off the premises will be sold in sealed containers with the exception of alcohol to be consumed within an area for which the premises has been granted a pavement licence, table and chairs permit or similar;
 - Signage requesting patrons to be considerate to neighbours and to leave the premises quietly, shall be clearly displayed at the entrance/exit; and
 - The premises will operate a 'Challenge 21' age verification policy and will display signs advertising this policy at the bar area.
- 3.5 There is no proposal within this application to increase the area from which licensable activities may currently take place. The proposal is to add the sale of alcohol for consumption off premises which if granted would enable the premises to operate an alcohol delivery service, provide traditional "off sales" and extend the temporary permission provided by the Business & Planning Act 2020. The latter makes provision to allow premises such as Common Room that do not have a dual licence, to be able to provide off sales at a time when the premises is also open for the sale of alcohol for consumption on premises, until a pre-cut off time of 23:00 hours, without the need to formally vary the premises licence.
- 3.6 A pavement licence has effect in respect of this premises until 23:00 hours Sunday to Thursday and until 00:00 hours on Friday and Saturday. The granting of this application would therefore permit alcohol to be consumed at the tables and chairs authorised by the pavement licence until midnight on Friday and Saturday; currently the temporary dispensation detailed in 3.6 lapses after 23:00 hours.

- 3.7 A plan of the licensed premises and site plan are attached at Annex C.
- 3.8 The Licensing Act 2003 (Section 4) states that it is the duty of all Licensing Authorities to carry out their functions under the Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - public safety;
 - the prevention of public nuisance; and
 - the protection of children from harm
- 3.9 Each objective is of equal importance. As there are no other licensing objectives, these four objectives are a paramount consideration at all times. When considering applications, representations or notifications, the Licensing Authority will have regard to these licensing objectives.
- 3.10 The Licensing Authority may vary and grant the application with or without additional conditions if they consider it appropriate to do so. The Licensing Authority can refuse the variation, or part of the variation, for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 3.11 The Licensing Authority may not however do anything to reduce the effect of the rights granted by the existing premises licence.
- 3.12 Section 4(3) Licensing Act 2003 states that the Licensing Authority should also have regard to the Council's Licensing Policy (as revised in 2020), the Statutory Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and the Licensing Act itself, and in particular:
 - a) Paragraphs 3-6, 8-10,13-14,15,17-23, 27,33-36,38-41 and 43 of the policy
 - b) Chapters 8, 9 and 10 of the Statutory Guidance (as revised April 2018);
 - c) Sections 4, 9, 10, 13, 34, 35, 36, 182 and 183 of the Act.
- 3.13 The Licensing Authority recognises that Licensing and Planning are separate regimes. Where an application is granted by the Licensing Authority which would require planning permission this would not relieve the applicant of the need to obtain that permission. It will still be necessary for the applicant to ensure that he/she has **ALL** the necessary permissions in place to enable them to run the business within the law
- 3.14 If the application is refused the applicant may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates' Court.
- 3.15 If the application is granted the person making the relevant representation may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates' Court.
- 3.16 On appeal the court may either dismiss the appeal; substitute the decision appealed against for any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority; or remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of

- it in accordance with the direction of the court. The court may make such order for costs as it thinks fit.
- 3.17 In accordance with the requirements of the Act copies of the application were served upon the Police, the Fire Authority, Environmental Health, Development Control, Trading Standards, the Health Authority and the Safeguarding Children and Young Persons Team.
- 3.18 The applicant was required to place a notice at the premises for a period of 28 consecutive days, starting the day after the application was made, and to publish a notice within a local newspaper within 10 working days of submitting the application to the licensing authority.
- 3.19 Three representation of objection have been received within the statutory period from other persons. These representations express concern that the applicant's proposals are likely to undermine the Prevention of Public Nuisance licencing objective. One representation also expresses concern in relation to the removal of the two Annex 1 conditions currently attached to the premises licence.

4 STATUTORY CONSIDERATIONS AND BASIS FOR PROPOSAL

- 4.1 An equality Impact Assessment (EqIA) has been completed. No adverse or other significant issues were found.
- 4.2 Consideration must be given to the Human Rights Act 1998 and the "convention rights".
- 4.3 The Licensing Sub-Committee has been delegated authority to determine the application on behalf of the Licensing Authority in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.4 When reaching a decision, the Licensing Authority must carry out its functions with a view to promoting the four licensing objectives.

5 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCE, PROPERTY, PEOPLE)

5.1 The cost of processing licences is covered by the fees charged. The fee for this application is £190.00.

6 RISK MANAGEMENT

6.1 A risk assessment related to the issue and recommendations has been undertaken in compliance with the Council's decision-making risk management guidance.

7 CLIMATE CHANGE

7.1 The licensing objectives do not require the applicant to specify steps to mitigate the impact of climate emergency. However, the applicant is encouraged to consider locally sourced ingredients and to reduce single use plastic in the operation of their business.

8 OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

- 8.1 None.
- 9.1 The Council's Monitoring Officer (Director Legal & Democratic Services and Council Solicitor), section 151 Officer (Director of Finance) and Head of Building Control and Public Protection have had the opportunity to input to this report and have cleared it for publication.
- 9.2 This report has not been sent to the Trades' Union as they would have no involvement.

The responsible person must ensure that: a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures i) beer or cider: ½ pint; ii) gin, rum, vodka or whiskey: 25ml or 35ml; and iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.





We have read the application and would like to comment that we have concerns that this sale of alcohol on exit of the Common Room venue wlll lead to additional nuisance to local residents.

The late license already creates congregations of clients and considerable noise at late hours when residents are asleep. Off sales is likely to encourage groups of drinkers to buy alcohol and then stay outside the venue after closure drinking and creating nuisance noise.

In the era of COVID-19 we believe people should be encouraged to leave the area and not be encouraged to linger in groups. This application would appear contrary to COVOD-19 guidelines and on this basis as well as the nuisance to residents issue mentioned should be turned down at this time.

The Circus Area Residents' Association wishes to object to the above licensing application on the grounds that it will cause additional public nuisance under the 2003 Act.

REPRESENTATIONS

These premises already have a pavement license, and our understanding is this enables them to conduct off sales from Sunday to Thursday up until 11 o'clock, and Friday and Saturday until midnight. This will continue until September 2021, or possibly later if additional forms of lockdown persist. Varying the licence to enable them to make off sales until the hours specified in the general license (02.00 Sunday to Thursday and 03.00 Friday and Saturday) therefore has no relevance to the stated objective "to enable us to diversify our activities in light of further lockdowns and trade restrictions." As already stated they already have this ability under the terms of the pavement license in these circumstances. To vary the existing license under normal circumstances is likely to cause additional public nuisance - there is already considerable noise late at night when these premises close. If their business case is correct, they are obviously anticipating a significant number of people arriving to undertake off sales. This will potentially cause a problem as some of them will arrive by car and that will create additional noise and disturbance in the residential streets adjacent. But other customers will arrive on foot and we already know that when people congregate outside these premises it creates noise pollution for neighbouring residential premises.

I note the following application and it raises a number of red flags.

Details: Variation: TO ADD the sale of alcohol for consumption off premises to the premises licence in line with the hours authorised for on sales: Monday to Thursday 10:00 - 02:00 Friday and Saturday 10:00 - 03:00 Sunday 12:00 - 02:00 TO REMOVE the following Annex 1 conditions that require: There shall be no off sales. Sales of intoxicating liquor to be limited only to bona fide members of a club existing on the premises and their guests. TO ADD additional conditions to promote the licensing objectives. The purpose of this application is to enable us to diversify our activities in light of further lockdowns and trade restrictions.

As we are all aware the Common Rooms has had a chequered history as to how the premises has been managed, its drug dealing, additional licensing restrictions and violence spilling onto George Street.

Permitting off-sales until 2am or 3am seems contrary to controlling such activity within the premises that has brought its own challenges over the past years. How this will be policed to members only is not stated? I also understand that such premises can have casual members so the term has no context. the original use was in place for a reason and this needs to be re-visited.

REPRESENTATIONS

I recognise this is a response to the current Covid rules. Like all similar businesses there are concerns over the current 10pm closing time and to apply for such an off-license will encourage customers to gather after 10pm and in my view is only a mechanism to undermine the current closing time law and encourage street drinking.

The premises creates a lot of noise for those living nearby the narrow high buildings create a lot of echo in vicinity. The 23:00 use of tables in this location will impact residents and needs to be earlier.

I do not believe that these off sales rules will be adhered to and have no confidence that the situation will be policed so to protect the residential amenity of local residents.

As I maintain, the original restrictions were in place for a reason and proper consideration of these is required if these are to be relaxed whether under Covid or otherwise.
