

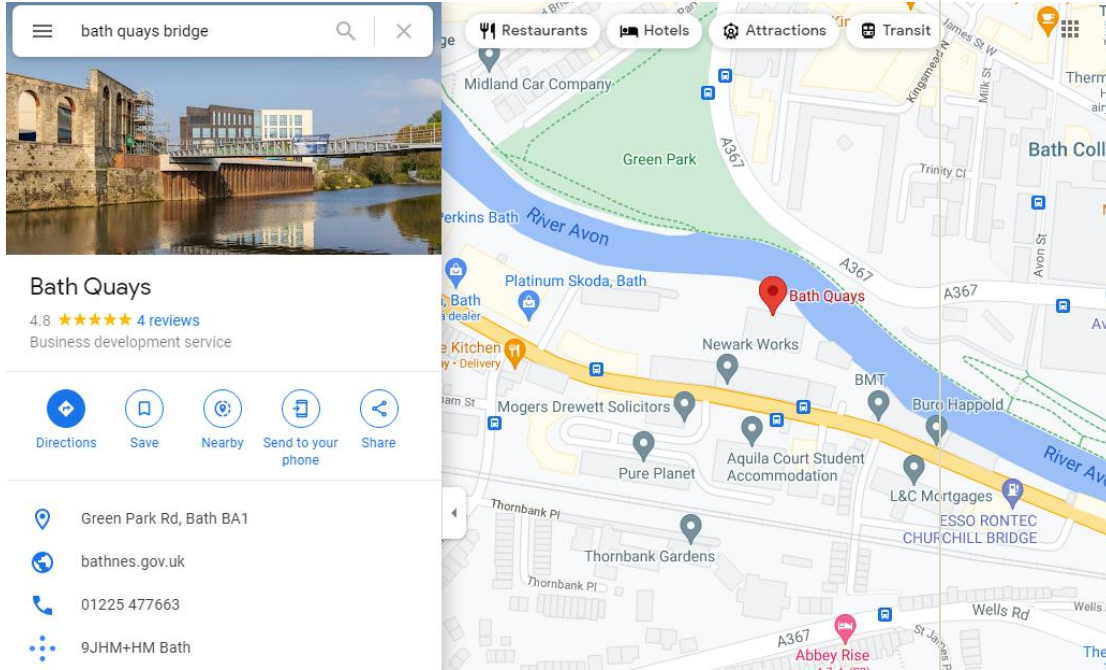

2.	<p>WECA Transport Planning</p> <p>This will be an opportunity to hear from WECA about Transport Planning along the A4 corridor between Bath and Bristol.</p> <p>Phil Wright - Public Transport Programme Manager, West of England Combined Authority (WECA) will be presenting to the forum and dealing with any queries that they may arise.</p> <p>Key Route Networks – devolution of powers - government consultation</p> <p>We would like to make you aware of a Government (Department of Transport) consultation currently taking place on Key Route Networks and the devolution of more powers and responsibilities for locally important roads to metro mayors and their combined authorities. <p>4.</p>	<p>Street Names for Bath Quays</p> <p>After a long interval with no new streets to name, I have some names for Bath Area Forum to consider for the Bath Quays South development.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The new road leading off Riverside Road and running between the river and Newark Works. Project delivery have suggested two possible names: Bath Quay and Foundry Lane, both references to the former industrial uses of the site. 2. The new bridge, already built, from this site across the river to the north bank. Project Delivery has not suggested any names, but I understand that the ward councillors have suggested Bayer Bridge, after the adjacent former Bayer corset factory. The design of the bridge with its curves and straight bracing pieces is a bit reminiscent of a corset! 	<p>Dave Dixon</p>
