E3253 Addressing air quality and traffic management issues through the management of parking behaviour on the highway (WL)

Outline proposals which are intended to improve air quality by ensuring nitrogen dioxide (NO2) targets are met in the shortest possible time through a major shift to mass transport, walking and cycling in order to secure the safer movement of pedestrian traffic on the highway by reducing the public health risks posed to them by air pollution. This will facilitate the achievement of strategic outcomes of local transport policy by reducing congestion and vehicle intrusion into neighbourhoods, and particularly residential neighbourhoods. Whilst the measures proposed are designed to improve air quality and meet traffic management and pedestrian safety purposes it is also anticipated they will also significantly reduce the level of emissions that drive climate change.

E3271 RULE 15 Keynsham Land Acquisition (WL)

An opportunity has arisen to acquire approx. 70 acres of land in Keynsham that would facilitate the early delivery of adopted transport policy, as set out in the Joint Local Transport Plan 4, that is required to address existing congestion issues and likely to be required before new homes could come forward. The site is currently in the greenbelt and not allocated, but in the future could form part of a wider area, that through comprehensive development could deliver 1500+homes. The enabling infrastructure would help to alleviate existing traffic congestion in Keynsham, enable delivery of wider public transport improvements as well as unlock access to the site and support the new development. The Council is seeking grant from WECA's Land Acquisition Fund (LAF) to acquire the land
