### **E3445 Bath College SEND Residential Provision (WL)**

The proposal is to build a 12 bed residential unit linked to the SEND Wellow Centre at Bath College, Somer Valley site. The college are providing the land on which this is to be built. This would accommodate young people with special educational needs aged 16+. This is a stepping stone between living at home and moving to either supported living or independent living. The proposal is for 12 bedrooms each with en-suite plus a carers room, together with communal kitchen and living areas. The rationale for this provision is to offer a residential element in B&NES thereby preventing expensive out of area placements at independent residential colleges. There are many benefits to the young people remaining in their local area for example - local employment, social, economic and environmental reasons. A capital loan of £4m has been agreed in principle.

To provide Afghan and Ukraine households who have arrived in the UK via specified resettlement and relocation schemes with safe and suitable long-term accommodation. On 14<sup>th</sup> March the Council agreed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities to provide 22 units of such accommodation in return for funding.
