The facilities at Victoria Park are quite limited, there is not much space and nowhere for children who are learning. If you are a beginner and not one of the older boys it is not a good place to skateboard.

At our local park - Alice Park - we are not allowed to skateboard on the footpaths and the only other bit of tarmac is the cycle track, which is for children much younger than me who are learning to ride a bike.

I sometimes skateboard on pavements, but you are not really allowed to and its dangerous with people and cars. There is nowhere safe for me to practice skateboarding.

I like skateboarding because its stops me staying inside and watching TV or playing computer games and I get to be with my friends. I also know lots of teenager's like skateboarding and want a skatepark because it gives them somewhere to go to be together and it's a sport they actually think is cool.

I want a skateboard park as I want somewhere to go where I can use my energy make my body strong and really test my skills as well as being with a group of other skateboarders.
