Many who signed the petition agreed that "this is exactly what young people need here, there is nothing for them". They also asked where it could be built.?

According to BANES Play Policy "YOU", the Council have a strategy that promises to deliver:

"more safe and attractive outdoor play spaces near home"

In 2008 BANES was awarded £2.5 million pounds from the Department for Children, Schools and Families and renewed 32 play spaces including a successful skatepark in Midsomer Norton.

Larkhall, has a large population of children. Alice Park and Larkhall Rec are the only parks within walking distance for many children.

There is land close to Lambridge Training Ground which would support a skatepark.

What I am asking for tonight is the political will to turn this currently unused space into a vibrant skatepark for the local community.

Everyone mentions money. With political will, there is money. The National Lottery have funded other skateparks. There are plenty of successful models for raising funding to get skateparks built – there are foundations, trusts and charities in Bath, which would support a project of this nature if it was backed by BANES.

Why as a mother am I committing myself to such an uphill struggle to create a skatepark?

I have two sons and I can see how skateboarding affirms their courage, strength and resilience. It channels their youthful energy and aggression into something positive and meaningful.

When you fall, you get up and try again, it teaches you something about yourself.
