Dear Highways,

I circulated your Draft Highway Structural Maintenance Programme to my Councillors, two of which made the following observations below. Please could you forward the information appropriately.

The local knowledge of the first comment may be of particular interest, and should you wish to enquire further about the location of said gullies, I know just the man to assist, so do get back to me. It does seem ridiculous they were covered over?

Cllr 1:

"Camerton Hill is to have Carriageway resurfacing. They will be wasting our money unless they find and re-instate the two gullies that were covered over during resurfacing approx' 10-12 years ago. The lack of them causes unusual water flow which washes away areas of any newly applied surface dressing, during rainy times and within days. I have reported this for many years at almost ever CPC meeting. They were situated between the school entrance and the school crossing on the left hand down hill section. Their exact location should be on record with the powers that be. Having lived in Camerton for in access of thirty years, and having traversed that section of road daily for approx' eleven months per year, every year, to me and others the changes were clearly

evident. They were installed for a reason in the first place, what a surprise to find one day after a 'patch it and scarper' cover-up job they vanished possibly never to see the light of day again."

"Re the highways maintenance, I see there is no mention of Red Hill which needs attention in some places and Weeksley Lane which is half ours and half Timsbury, its the POTHOLES that we have to dodge."

Thank you for your email, I can confirm that the Highway Structural Maintenance Programme 13/14 relates to sites that will feature in our capital improvement programme for the coming financial year (April 13 to March 14). The list is prepared taking into account a number of factors and is prioritised within the set grant funding available. If the sites the Parish have concerns about do not appear in next year's programme I would expect that they would feature on the priority list and may well be addressed in future programmes. In the meantime the concerns raised have been noted and these roads are routinely inspected by our area highway inspector at least twice a year and any safety related works will be managed under our revenue programme of works. In response to your email I can confirm:

The drainage programme which you are dealing with Kath on is the revenue funded drainage programme and relates to smaller drainage schemes. The capital programme listed on the 13/14 structural maintenance programme relates to larger scale drainage improvement works. Kath will be able to give you a better indication on priorities against budget available once these have been confirmed for next financial year.

The section of Tunley Road listed on the resurfacing programme is a section from close to the A367 towards Tunley to finish in the vicinity of Manor House Bends an area in which we have undertaken a lot of revenue patching in recent years.
