Proposed Parking Restrictions – North Road, Combe Down

Decision maker/s	Cllr Caroline Roberts, Cabinet Member for Transport
The Issue	Whether to install double yellow lines along North Road, to act as a visibility splay for the redevelopment of the Rockery Tea Gardens
Decision Date	1 st November 2013
The decision	The Cabinet Member agrees that the proposal should not go ahead.
Rationale for decision	The existing situation is seen to help the residents and visitors to the site. The cars help to slow down traffic on the road, making it safer for residents to use their driveways, while also providing a barrier to protect pedestrians walking along the pavement. The parking is also used by visitors to Rainbow Woods and the Skyline Walk, so can be said to encourage outdoor activities and exercise.
Financial and budget implications	No financial impact, as the installation would have been carried out by the developer of the Rockery Tea Gardens.
Issues considered	Social Inclusion; Customer Focus; Sustainability; Human Resources; Property; Young People; Health & Safety.
Consultation undertaken	Ward Councillor; Cabinet colleagues; Staff; Other B&NES Services; Service Users; Local Residents; Community Interest Groups; Other Public Sector Bodies.
How consultation was carried out	Internal and external consultations were carried out using e-mail, notices in the local press and erected on site. Information was available to view in Council offices, as per the agreed process.
Other options considered	The police suggested mirroring the restriction on the opposite side of the road, but this would have caused even more upset for the locals, and not had any impact on the visibility from the site.
