Summary	This report sets out information for the B&NES Health and Wellbeing Board to consider the impact of winter on the Bath Health Community and the RUH during 2013/14
Recommendations	The Board is asked to agree the conclusions and actions contained within the review.
Rationale for recommendations	<p>The impact of a poorly performing Urgent Care System (UCS) has far reaching consequences including patient experience, staff morale, provider relationships, NHS performance, NHS and social care funding. It was clear that previous approaches needed to be reevaluated and that we could no longer expect the UCS to function without significant change.</p> <p>The Bath Health Community – Winter Report 2013/14 explains the challenges faced by B&NES, the impact of this winter and the recommendations and conclusions from collective experience.</p>
Resource implications	The Bath LHC received winter pressure monies in 2013/14 of £4.4m which supported the local response. In 2014/15 national monies in the region of £400m are anticipated but how these monies will be distributed and targeted is not yet clear.
Statutory considerations	There is a range of guidance which the CCG and providers need to take account of when planning for service provision throughout
