1 THE ISSUE

1.1 The purpose of this report is to an update to the Wellbeing Policy Development & Scrutiny panel on the Winter of 2013/14 and in particular the lessons learnt.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The Bath and North East Somerset and wider local health community received winter pressures funding of £4.4m in 2013/14 because we were assessed as being a challenged health and social care community based on historic performance against the 4 hour target. National monies in the region of £400m are anticipated for 2014/15 but at this stage the criteria for allocating these monies is unclear.
