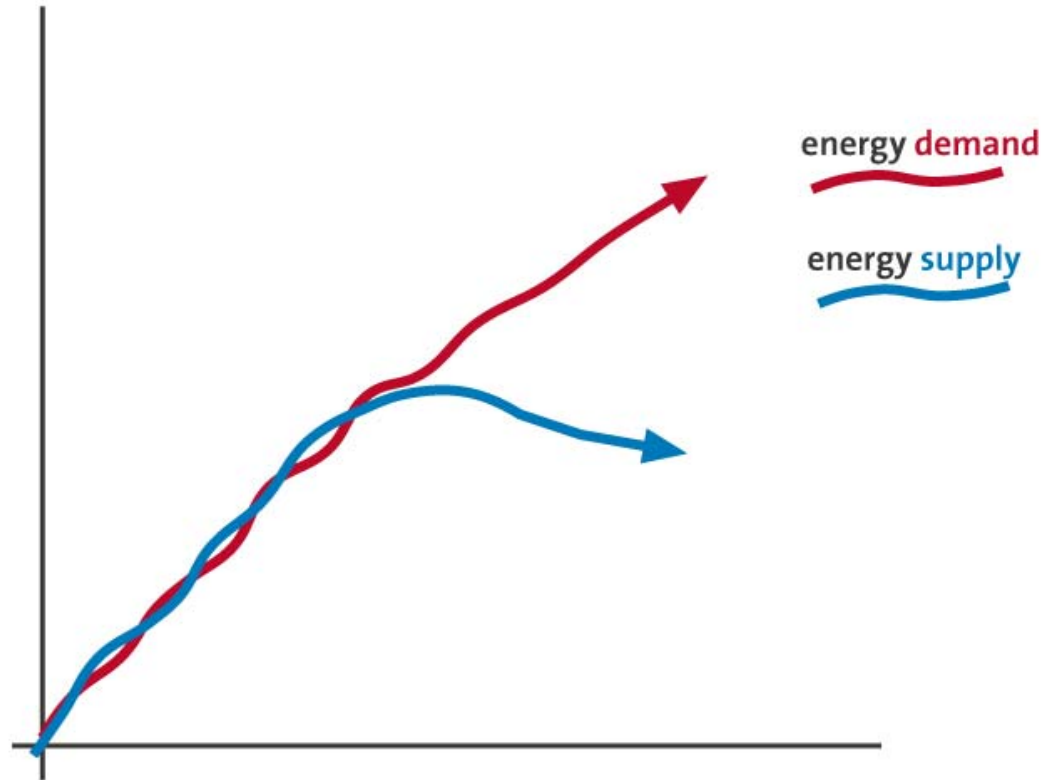

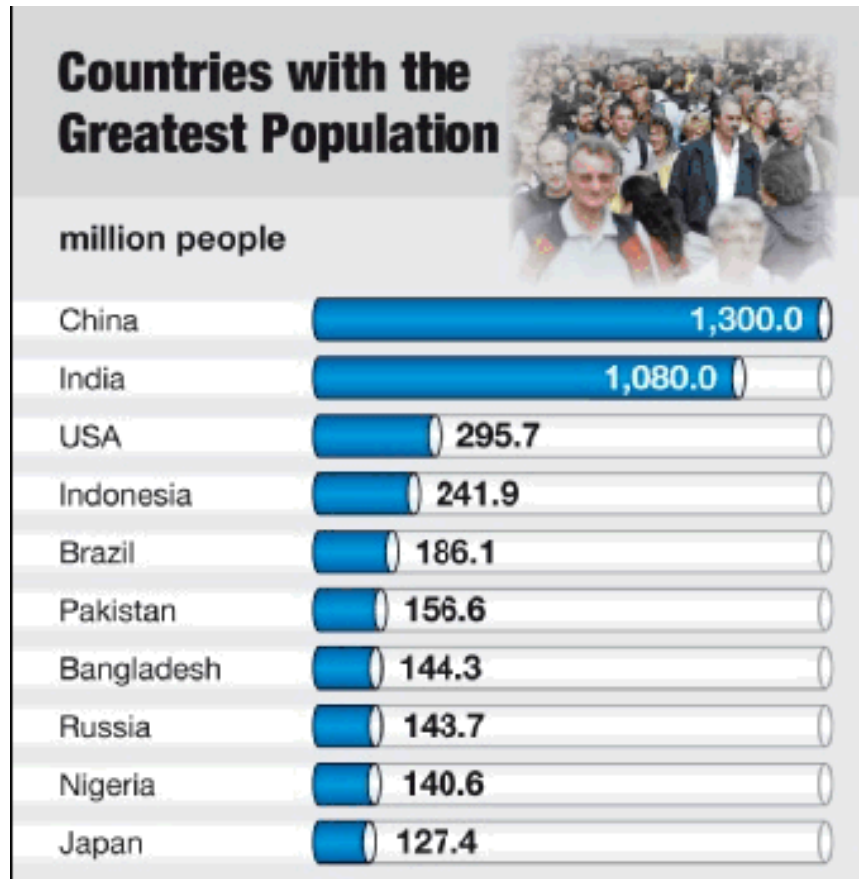

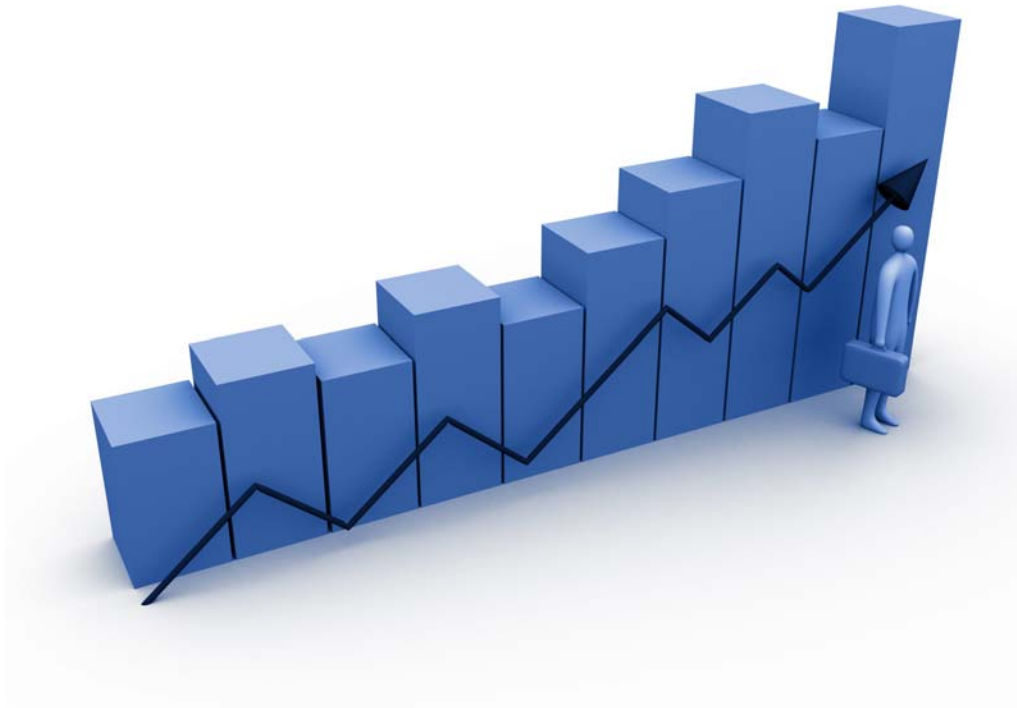

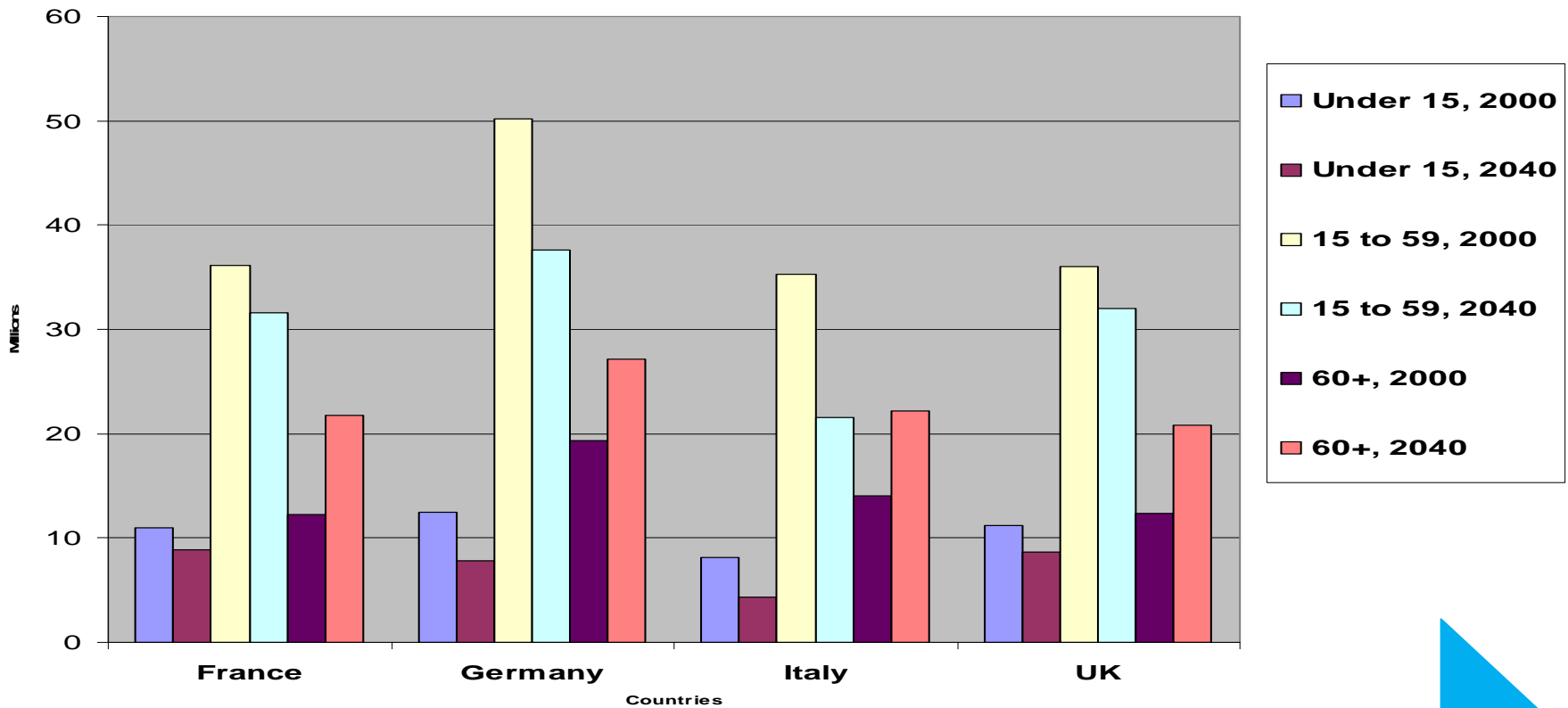

European Demographic Change

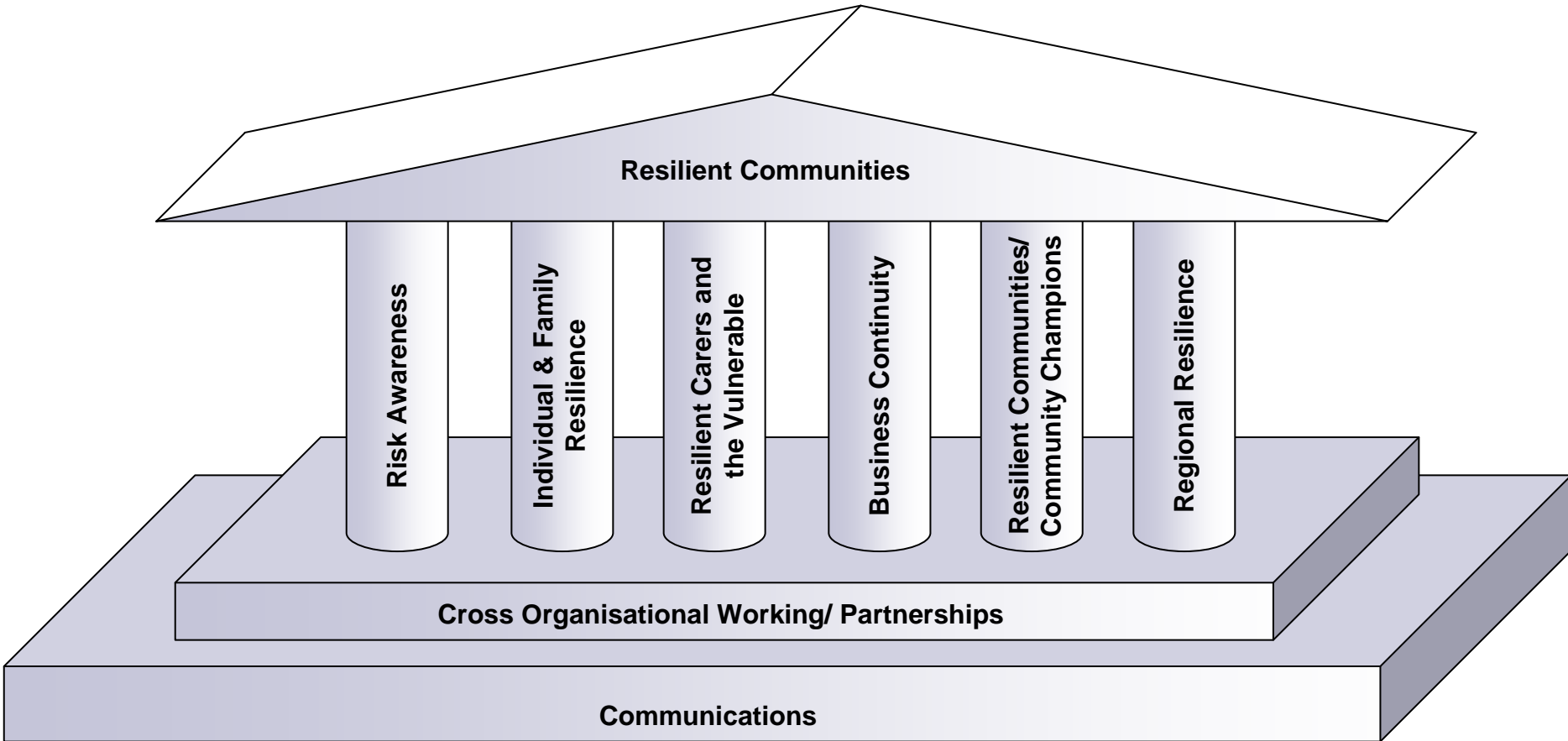


# How to respond
