	 Approval is given for further capital expenditure of up to £90k on work needed to prepare and submit a Stage 1 Parks for People bid. £250K of the remaining capital funding previously allocated in the Council's capital programme for Sydney Gardens be approved to be committed as a contribution towards the £2.5million anticipated
	to be sought from HLF.
Rationale for decision	The investment to prevent decline in the Gardens is significant. A heritage lottery application would seem to be the most cost effective way to preserve the heritage aspects whilst bringing the park back to required standards of current and future park users. Capital investment is required to carry out essential works in the meantime whilst the funding bid is being prepared.
Financial and budget implications	£90K capital to prepare the funding bid and carry out essential capital works £250K capital to as 10% contribution towards a bid of £2.5 million – both of which are allocated provisionally in the Council's capital programme for 2015/16.
