Dear Sir,

We object to B&NES Council's appropriation of the above land in connection to the Bath Transportation Package.

This now parking area was one of the original greens laid down by Bath Council when they constructed the Brassmill Lane Council Estate pre-war. As such it should remain for estate use.

Some years ago it was laid down for car parking for the adjacent rank. This was restricted solely to the four houses in the rank, with the car parking spaces marked with the individual house number. The most likely explanation for this is because the path in front of their rank was widened to narrow the road, presumably for road safety purposes. Across the road from the rank is a factory, and just father on the only entrance in and out of the big Brassmill Lane Trading Estate. So clearly it is apparent these four houses were assigned these parking spaces to compensate for not parking at the kerb in front of their houses. Only 62 has a back parking facility.

B&NES Council should not be allowed to appropriate this land as it is an original part of the Brassmill Lane Estate and an examination of the road situation in front of the rank clearly shows why Nos 62, 63, 64 and 65 Brassmill Lane were given car parking provision.
