All agencies review young people who may require support

All agencies to gain consent before presenting to panel

Transitions Operational Panel – meet 3 x per year – using agreed criteria will identify young people who are likely to need social care support into adulthood and determine at what time it would be of significant benefit for them to have a Transitions Assessment under the Care Act

Usually between 14–16 years

If eligible

If not eligible

Young person's details entered onto Transitions Database

Admin email adult transitions worker for allocation

Children's worker meets adult worker

- Signpost to local offer
- Set out why
- Clarify next steps i.e. if to be re-assessed

Introductions to be made by children's support if available

Transitions Assessment - Complete initial contact and leave information

Adult worker and health care make contact with young person and family. Check if CHCs reviewing required

Adult transitions worker attends school reviews, MDT meetings as co-worker and for advice

Usually between 16-17

If required Adult Transitions worker refers to relevant adult service, health, employment, day services etc

17 for looked after children

Adult transitions worker completes first full community care assessment

17.5 all other young people

Complete support plan, check all relevant referrals actioned; check all support services set up; take to panel if over £650

18th Birthday – all support in place with correct funding
