The Issue	To approval capital funding for the purchase of waste & recycling collection containers.
Decision Date	6 th January 2017
The decision	The Cabinet Members agree that the capital budget up to a maximum of £1.34M be spent on waste & recycling containers
Rationale for decision	The Cabinet has previously agreed, In Autumn 2017 to implement wheeled bins where practical, to containerise waste to reduce litter issues, and to increase the number of recycling containers it currently provides. Capital funding is required to purchase these waste & recycling containers.
Financial and budget implications	A provisional allocation of up to £1.34M has been made within the Council's capital budget.

How consultation was carried out	Officers have presented the proposals to the Bath City Forum, Somer Valley Forum, Keynsham Forum, Chew Valley Forum, Bathavon Forum and the Parish Liason Forum.
	Focus groups will be formulated from each service area to determine the outline specifications for tendering. The bids received will be evaluated by operational staff, supervisors, management and the redesign project team.
Other options considered	The only other consideration would be to have no receptacles provided for the every other week refuse collections, or district wide use of re-usable rubbish bags. However, the Cabinet decision in July 2016 confirmed the future use of wheeled bins, collected every other week, as the service to be provided, and is the most established method of efficiently and safely collecting waste. Containerising waste will also reduce the litter on streets and increase recycling.
