1 THE ISSUE

1.1 The extension of the existing Highway Maintenance & Improvement Works Term Contract by one year beyond its contracted term with Skanska Infrastructure Services.

2 **RECOMMENDATION**

The Cabinet Member is asked to;

- 2.1 Agree the Contract Extension from the 1st April 2018 to the 31st March 2019.
- 2.2 Agree the issuing of a Voluntary Ex Ante Transparency Notice ("VEAT") in the Official Journal of the European Union.

3 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCE, PROPERTY, PEOPLE)

- 3.1 Negotiations with Skanska Infrastructure Services have not identified any significant resource implications beyond the annual Contract Clause 77 Adjustment of Contract Rates and Prices applied on the 1st April each year.
- 3.2 The contract and works agreed will be managed within the available budget envelope, inclusive of relevant savings targets around highways maintenance.

4 STATUTORY CONSIDERATIONS AND BASIS FOR PROPOSAL

4.1 European procurement legislation will be addressed through the issuing of the VEAT Notification to the Industry.

5 THE REPORT

- 5.1 The current Highway Maintenance & Improvements Works Contract with Skanska Infrastructure Services was originally awarded to Atkins Highway Services following competitive tender with a commencement date of 1st October 2008. In September 2013 Skanska secured the Atkins Highway Operations holding and the contract was transferred.
- 5.2 The Original Contract term was set at five and a half years with up to four years extensions option. Following negotiation the contract was extended to its full term of nine and a half years for completion on 31st March 2018.
- 5.3 Bath & North East Somerset Council are currently working jointly with North Somerset Council in procurement of future Highway Service Contracts.
- 5.4 Bath & North East Somerset Council are entering a Devolution arrangement with neighbouring West of England Authorities, Bristol City Council and South Gloucestershire Council.
- 5.5 Due to changing arrangements of Devolution, Bath & North East Somerset will be taking the opportunity to consider future procurements options for highway services so will look to delay the commencement of its new Highway Maintenance & Improvement Works Contract by one year to 1st April 2019.
- 5.6 In order to ensure transparency, given the close working to date with North Somerset Council in procurement of future Highway Service Contracts and in combination with upcoming changes around Highways as a result of Devolution this decision is being brought forward as a member decision.

6 RATIONALE

- 6.1 The VEAT Notice will allow other interested Highway Service operators to lodge any valid objections to the proposed one year contract extension within a set time period. Outside of this period no further objections will be considered.
- 6.2 Independent legal advice has been sought from external Solicitors who confirm the approach being taken through this decision is reasonable given the changes facing the Council as a result of Devolution.

7 OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

7.1 Members considered procuring a new contract when the current contract expires but felt that extending the contract by one year allowed the Council more time to consider the implications arising from Devolution.

8 CONSULTATION

8.1 The Cabinet Member and Section 151 Finance Officer have reviewed and input into this report.

9 RISK MANAGEMENT

9.1 A risk assessment related to the issue and recommendations has been undertaken, in compliance with the Council's decision making risk management guidance.
