The Issue	The Enforcement Policy 2018 articulates how Housing Services will adopt the principles of good enforcement practice and how the Service will liaise with individuals and organisations who do not comply with the requirements of the Housing Act 2004 and other relevant housing legislation.

The decision	The Cabinet Member agrees that the Housing Services Enforcement Policy 2018 is adopted.
Rationale for decision	An enforcement policy is consistent with the requirements of the Regulators Code and aims to ensure that the Council operates in an open, proportionate, consistent and helpful manner. It is also a prerequisite for the use of Civil Penalties.
Financial and budget implications	There are no additional resource implications arising from this report. However, following changes introduced by the Housing and Planning Act 2016 the Council can, in certain circumstances, apply a financial penalty as an alternative to a prosecution for certain offences.
