The Issue	Housing Services provide statutory and non-statutory services where reasonable costs can be recovered. This policy has been updated and includes revised charges.
Decision Date	09 August 2018
The decision	The Cabinet Member agrees that the Housing Services Charging Policy 2018 is adopted.
Rationale for decision	Firstly, that it is either a statutory requirement or reasonable to make the charge. Secondly, that the costs are set at recovering some, or all, of our expenditure associated with the activity rather than making a surplus. Finally that the charges are articulated in a policy that is clear, accurate and freely available.
Financial and budget implications	Housing Services currently charge fees to recover the reasonable costs of providing a number of enabling, enforcement, licensing, housing register and homelessness services. These updated and revised changes ensure that the charges continue to be reasonable and appropriate.
