Rationale for decision	Implementing a sound Business Continuity Plan enables resources to be prioritised in the time of a crisis and indirectly contributes to improving service planning on an ongoing basis. This contributes to creating a more resilient community and indirectly to the outcomes of the Community Strategy and Corporate Improvement Priorities.
