1 THE ISSUE

1.1 This report brings a review of the policy and charging for the Street Naming & Numbering (SN&N) function for 2018/19 for consideration by Cabinet.

2 **RECOMMENDATION**

2.1 The Cabinet Member agrees to approve the revised Street Naming & Numbering policy & charges for 2018/19.

3 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS (FINANCE, PROPERTY, PEOPLE)

- 3.1 The policy and charge changes are in order to better reflect the service now being provided and to ensure that the costs of providing the service are better recovered and allocated in a fairer and clearer way. Charges for the Street Naming & Numbering function are not being universally raised across the board.
- 3.2 The income generated from charges is budgeted for within existing budgets, this proposal will enable these budgets to be achieved and there is no change to the cost resource requirements from this proposals, which are predominantly staff time; these costs are included within existing budgets.
