The decision	The Cabinet Member agrees to launch consultation on the application for the Public Spaces Protection Orders for Bath and Midsomer Norton; agree for officers to prepare a consultation feedback report for further consideration by the Cabinet member and to note that in order to comply with statutory guidance any tri annual extensions should be a Cabinet decision unless or until Cabinet decides otherwise.
Rationale for decision	PSPOs will have effect and will result in increased enforcement powers for A&S Police and Council authorised officers.
Financial and budget implications	PSPOs have the potential to reduce long-term anti-social behaviour costs in terms of resourcing e.g. Police and council officer time, allowing these resources to be deployed elsewhere.
