1 THE ISSUE

1.1 An application has been received for the Variation of an existing Premises Licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of **Jika Jika, 4 Princes Buildings, Bath BA1 2ED** (Annex A).

2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the sub committee determine the application to vary the licence.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 There are no financial implications arising from this report.

4 THE REPORT

- 4.1 An application has been received for the variation of a Premises Licence.
- 4.2 The current Premises Licence permits the following licensable activities:
 - 1) Sale of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises between the following hours:

Monday to Thursday 07:30 - 20:00Friday and Saturday 07:30 - 21:00Sunday 07:30 - 18:00

Non Standard Timings:

On no more than 12 occasions per year, for the Wine Club Members' Evenings where 7 day's notice has been given to the Police, the sale of alcohol may finish at 22:30 hours.

2) The opening hours for the premises are as follows:

Monday to Thursday

07:30 - 20:30

Friday and Saturday

07:30 - 21:30

Sunday

07:30 - 18:30

Non Standard Timings:

On no more than 12 occasions per year, for the Wine Club Members' Evenings where 7 day's notice has been given to the Police, the premises may remain open until 23:00 hours.

- 3) The licence is subject to the following conditions:
 - No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- Any individual employed to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- Notices to be displayed near the entrance advising that CCTV is in use on the premises.
- There will be no "bar" from which persons may consume alcohol.
- There will be no irresponsible drinks promotions.
- Alcohol may only be sold whilst menu based foods are available for sale.
- Wine Club evenings will be attended by members and bona fide guests only.
- Police to receive notification of members' evenings at least 7 days before the event.
- There shall be no draft beer/lager available.
- The collection of empty bottles etc. to take place between 09:00 hours and 17:00 hours only.
- All off sales of alcohol shall be in sealed containers unless it is to be consumed in the area covered by a valid Tables and Chairs Permit.

- Photographic identification will be required for proof of age.
- A record will be kept of refused sales, crimes reported, incidents, staff training records, training systems and refresher training.
- Staff training records will include a completed schedule of training, names of staff, dates of training, subjects tested and any refresher training.
- Training of all staff to be completed by a personal licence holder, an approved trainer or a person who holds a recognised award on the safe sale of alcohol.
- A CCTV system will be installed at the premises to the satisfaction of the Police. The CCTV equipment shall be maintained in working order and continually record when licensable activity takes place. The recordings shall be retained for 31 days and made available to the Police. All recordings will be produced containing the date and the time.
- Alcohol will only be served by waiter and waitress service to persons seated at the tables.
- The front of the premises to be clear of cigarette ends, glasses and bottles at the close of business every day.
- The extended hours for the wine club will be held on no more than twelve occasions a year.

4.3 The Variation application seeks to:

- Extend the terminal hour for the Sale of Alcohol to 23:00 hours Monday to Thursday; 23:30 hours Friday and Saturday, and 22:30 on Sunday. The variation also proposes that the premises will close 30 minutes after the proposed last sale of alcohol
- Add Regulated Entertainment by way of Live and Recorded Music indoors only from 19:00 to 22:30 on Monday to Thursday, 19:00 to 23:30 Friday and Saturday and 11:00 – 22:00 on Sunday in respect of Live Music and midday to 21:00 on Sunday in respect of Recorded Music.
- Provide Late Night Refreshment on Friday and Saturday evenings from 23:00 to 23:30.
- Delete all reference to "Wine Clubs" from the licence, currently detailed in the non standard timings and openings, Annex 2 and Annex 3, subject to the application being granted.
- Remove conditions relating to irresponsible drinks promotions and proof of age, as now covered by the mandatory conditions.
- 4.4 A site plan is attached at Annex C.
- 4.5 The Licensing Act 2003 (Section 4) states that it is the duty of all Licensing Authorities to carry out their functions under the Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - a) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.

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- b) Public Safety.
- c) The Prevention of Public Nuisance, and
- d) The Protection of Children from Harm.

Each objective is of equal importance; there are no other licensing objectives so these four are of paramount consideration at all times. When considering applications/representations /notifications the Licensing Authority will have regard to these licensing objectives.

- 4.6 The Licensing Authority may vary and grant the application with or without additional conditions.
- 4.7 The Licensing Authority can refuse the variation or part of the variation as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 4.8 The Licensing Authority may not however do anything to reduce the effect of the rights guaranteed by the existing premises licence.
- 4.9 The Licensing Authority should also have regard to the Council's Licensing Policy, the Statutory Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and the Licensing Act itself, and in particular to:
 - a) Paragraphs 3, 5, 6, 9, 10, 15 20, 23.5, 24, 28, 30, 33, 35 37 & 41 44 of the policy.
 - b) Chapters 8, 9 and 10 of the Statutory Guidance (as revised on 28 June 2007)...
 - c) Sections 4, 9, 10, 13, 34, 35, 36, 182 and 183 of the Act.
- 4.10 If the application is refused the applicant may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates Court.

If the application is granted the person making the relevant representation may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates Court.

On appeal the court may either dismiss the appeal; substitute the decision appealed against for any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the court. The court may make such order for costs as it thinks fit.

- 4.11 In accordance with the requirements of the Act the applicants served copies of the application upon the Police, the Fire Authority, Environmental Health, Development Control, Trading Standards, and the Child Protection Agency.
- 4.12 The applicant is required to place a notice at the premises for a period of 28 days starting the day after the application is made and place an advert in a local newspaper within 10 days for submitting the application to the licensing authority.
- 4.13 A representation has been received from the **Police** in respect of the **Prevention of Crime** and **Disorder** licensing objective (Annex D). The premises itself is situated within Bath's "Cumulative Impact Area".
- 4.14 A representation has been received from **Environmental Protection** in respect of the **Prevention of Public Nuisance** licensing objective (Annex E). The Environmental Health Officer has proposed three conditions for the Committee to take into consideration.

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4.15 This report has not been sent to the Trades Union because they would have no involvement in this application.

Alcohol may only be sold whilst menu based foods are available for sale.

Wine Club evenings will be attended by members and bona fide guests only.

Police to receive notification of members' evenings at least 7 days before the event.

There shall be no draught beer / lager available.

The collection of empty bottles etc to take place between 09.00 hours and 17.00 hours only.

All off sales of alcohol shall be in sealed containers unless it is to be consumed in the area covered by a valid Tables and Chairs permit.

Photographic identification will be required for proof of age.

A record will be kept of refused sales, crimes reported, incidents, staff training records, training systems and refresher training.

Staff training records will include a completed schedule of training, names of staff, dates of training, subjects tested and any refresher training.

Training of all staff to be completed by a Personal Licence holder, an approved trainer or a person who holds a recognised award on the safe sale of alcohol.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

A CCTV system will be installed at the premises to the satisfaction of the police. The CCTV equipment shall be maintained in working order and continually record when licensable activity takes place. The recordings shall be retained for 31 days and made available to the police. All recordings will be produced containing the date and time.

Alcohol will only be served by waiter and waitress service to persons seated at tables.

The front of the premises to be clear of cigarette ends, glasses and bottles at the close of business every day.

The extended hours for the wine club will be held on no more than 12 occasions a year.











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

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

George Street, Broad Street and Milsom Street

These streets are typical of Bath City Centre in the fact that they incorporate a mixture of residential properties, retail units and licensed premises in terraced Georgian buildings.

Licensed Premises

There are 33 licensed premises, listed on the Police database InnKeeper, in the area encompassed by George Street, Milsom Street and Broad Street as shown in Fig.1 below. It is 0.031 square kilometres in size.

23 of the premises would be considered as having a direct effect on the Night Time Economy (NTE) of Bath City Centre due to the type of business the licence is associated with.

InnKeeper shows the area of George Street, which includes Edgar Buildings and Princes Buildings, has 14 licensed premises; the highest concentration of the streets being scrutinized in this report.



Brief Overview of Incidents in the Area shown in Fig. 1

All calls received by the Police are classified based on the information received at the time of the call. Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) calls include those classified as rowdy/nuisance behaviour, harassment/threats, assault and public order.

The below overview includes incidents between 1st Sept 2010 and 29th May 2011 in the area shown in Fig. 1.

Number of ASB related calls received: 194

Number of separate incidents these calls refer to: 150

Number of crime reports recorded as a result of these calls: 72

Day of the week the Police are most often called: Saturday (as depicted in Fig. 2)

Calls to the area on Friday and Saturday nights represent 56.7% of the total calls in the period.

Time of day the Police are most often called: 0200 – 0300 hours (as depicted in Fig. 3)

Fig 4 depicts the following information:

91.4% of calls are received after 1800 hours (time at which retail premises close)

83.3% of calls are received after 2100 hours

63.1% of calls are received after midnight

The busiest time period in terms of ASB related calls to the area is between midnight and 0300 hours.






