Introduction

This report puts forward options for an increase in the price of primary school meals from 1 September 2010.

Recommendation

That the Schools Forum agrees a recommendation to the Cabinet member on the price of primary school meals from 1 September 2010.

Price of Primary School Meals

- 1. School meals increased in price by 2.7% from £1.85 to £1.90 in September 2010.
- 2. Since then demand for paid meals has increased by 4% (144 per day). Demand for free school meals has risen by 13% (116 per day). Total demand has risen by 6% to nearly 4,500 meals per day.
- 3. Demand for school meals dropped sharply in 2005-6, since when it has slowly crept back up and it is now back at the 2005-6 level.
- 4. Options for price increases are shown in the table below.

- 5. A 5 pence increase represents an additional cost of £9.50 a year for each child buying a meal every day. This would be broadly in line with inflation.
- 6. The increase in the number of free school meals that are now being provided probably demonstrates the impact of the economic recession. Conversely, increased demand for paid meals suggests that a moderate price increase may not be a serious discouragement to paying for meals.

7. The School Food Trust 2009 survey shows the following national and regional information.

^{*}the primary meals take-up figure for B&NES excludes the two primary schools that do not have a hot meals service. This figure would be 34.4% in 2008-9 if those schools were included.

- 8. The average cost of a primary school meal (kitchen staff and ingredients only) in 2009-10 was £2.04. The total average cost including service and Council overheads was £2.59 per meal. These costs were affected by some irregular factors including high equipment replacement costs and volatile food prices and the projection for 2010-11 suggests that the unit cost will be a few pence lower than this.
- 9. You are asked to recommend the increase, if any, in the price of primary school meals from 1 September 2010.
