# AGM Report 2021-2022 Connecting Communities Forums Bath and North East Somerset

#### Introduction

Our <u>Connecting Communities</u> programme is designed to help public services and local residents to work better together to address the issues and priorities of concern in the diverse localities within the local authority area.

The 'Connecting Communities' approach is built around five key principles:

- listen
- prioritise
- join-up
- work with you
- share ideas

To achieve this, the council has worked with partners, parishes and communities over many years to establish Area Forums to streamline and simplify local engagement. The current Forums are:

- Bath Area Forum
- Bathavon Area Forum
- Chew Valley Area Forum
- Keynsham Area Forum
- Somer Valley Forum

The purpose of the Forums is to improve local engagement, foster communication and provide a mechanism for collaboration between local communities and organisations, Bath and North East Somerset Council and public bodies so local people receive better outcomes.

They achieve this in various ways, for example by

- Ensuring their residents and organisations' are key players in improving the quality of life in the area;
- Identifying common issues across the particular area and debating local priorities;
- Creating space for constructive suggestions for improvement in relation to local priorities;
- Shaping responses to the local priorities and where appropriate, co-delivering them;
- Influencing policy developments so as to enable or empower better outcomes for local people;
- Acting as a 'Champion' on behalf of the forum area.

The Bath Area Forums is attended by Bath residents, their ward councillors, and relevant local community groups, organisations, and senior representatives of the service providing and decision-making public bodies. All Forum meetings are open to anyone to attend at any time.

The agendas for Forum meetings are planned to include a time and context appropriate balance of items the council and its partners want to share or would like feedback on; items the Forum members themselves wish to discuss and opportunities for local organisations to share information and best practice. The Forums are inclusive and provide grass roots engagement with residents and community organisations, not only for the council but also its partners such as the Police, Curo, health care providers etc. Feedback from the Forums plays a vital role in helping to shape local services. A 'one size fits all' approach does not always work in the diverse communities across our district which include very rural areas alongside a World Heritage City.

It's also important to recognise that the Forums are not defined by their meetings alone. The knowledge gained and shared, the contacts made and networks created all assist in strengthening our communities.

The Chairs and Vice Chairs of the Forums and the council's Community Engagement Team which supports the Forums, always welcome ideas for Agenda items and feedback on how to make the Forum as valuable to participants as possible (contact details for the team below).

#### 2021-2022 Overview

The Forums continued to meet regularly by Zoom in 2021 and 2022. A table at Appendix 1 details the meetings that took place; the topics covered and the links to the meetings on our YouTube Channel.

The table at Appendix 2 details the Chairs and Vice Chairs for each Forum during the period, the officer contacts at B&NES for the Forums and the new Place Team leads for each Forum area.

### Place Teams Initiative

Sophie Broadfield, Director of Sustainable Communities with the council, has established this internal means of:

- improving work planning
- ensuring consultation is more effective
- ensuring we listen to, and make use of, local knowledge
- identifying what local communities need

This has synergies with the role of the Forums and Sophie has assigned geographic areas based on the Forum boundaries to senior officers within her team to enable them, and the staff reporting to them, to improve their knowledge of these local areas.

#### Communications

The importance of receiving the latest information has never been more pertinent and we would encourage all Forum members to sign up to receive the <u>council's e-newsletter</u> to residents and the Connecting Communities Team's <u>Interagency e-bulletin</u> if they have not done so already. The council's <u>Newsroom</u> also contains its latest press releases.

The council's website has a <u>'have your say'</u> section, where you can find out about the latest consultations and other ways to contribute.

The council has its own <u>YouTube channel</u>, where you can look back at a range of meetings and webinars, including Forum meetings. Also a page for forthcoming and archived <u>webinars</u>.

Throughout the pandemic, Community Engagement Team has continued to hold regular <u>Interagency Meetings</u> which help community groups, charities and others to share information and to network. Again, these meetings are open to all and are currently virtual
