## Revisions to DIY Waste limits at the Council's Household Waste & Recycling Centres

The Issue	As part of the national Resources and Waste Strategy 2018, the Department for Environment Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) committed to ensuring waste regulations were clear and being consistently applied in relation to waste generated by small scale DIY construction activities by householders. As a result, the Controlled Waste (England and Wales) Regulations 2012 have been amended and those changes came into force from 31st December 2023. The purpose of this report is to align our recycling centre policies with the limits that are detailed in this revised legislation.

The decision	<ul> <li>The Cabinet Member agrees that the following to be implemented from 4<sup>th</sup> March 2024;</li> <li>The volume of DIY waste that will be permitted to be disposed of as household waste shall be no more than two 50 litre bags in a single visit, with no more than four single visits per household in any four-week period.</li> <li>That the implementation of all future waste legislative changes is delegated to the Director of Place Management in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Neighbourhoods.</li> </ul>	
Rationale for decision	The purpose of this report is to ensure we align with the legislation changes now applicable to England and Wales.	
Financial and budget implications	There are no specific budget implications associated with this change to align with legislation amendments. Householders with more than the permitted DIY waste volumes will be advised to hire a skip or to use a licenced waste removal company. Residents who have an urgent need to dispose of their waste can use the Council's trade waste disposal facilities by visiting the weighbridge in Bath and paying the published rates.
