High Littleton and Hallatrow Neighbourhood Development Plan

The Issue	Following the successful examination and referendum, this report seeks to make and bring into force the High Littleton and Hallatrow Neighbourhood Plan so that it will be used by the Local Planning Authority to help determine planning applications within the Neighbourhood Area.
Decision Date	14 June 2025
The decision	The Cabinet Member agrees to make and bring into force the High Littleton and Hallatrow Neighbourhood Development Plan, as part of the Development Plan for the High Littleton and Hallatrow Neighbourhood Area.
Rationale for decision	Following a successful examination and referendum, and in accordance with Section 38A(4) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 (as amended), the Council has a duty to make the Stanton Drew Neighbourhood Plan part of the Development Plan. This will mean that the Stanton Drew Neighbourhood Plan will have full statutory weight in decision making on planning applications.
