Public Spaces Protection Orders for dogs on leads within Bath & North East Somerset Council owned cemeteries

The Issue	Cemeteries are places of remembrance and reflection, and it is essential to maintain their sanctity. However, issues with uncontrolled dogs off leads, fouling, and disturbances have been reported, causing distress to visitors, Council staff and undermining the dignity of these spaces. These situations create significant Health & Safety implications and risks particularly for the Council staff working within these areas along with cemetery visitors. PSPO's provide local authorities with the legal framework to enforce restrictions that prevent anti-social behaviour in public spaces.  The Council owned cemeteries concerned are:  Locksbrook Cemetery, Upper Bristol Road, Bath, BA1 3DQ Harptree Cemetery, West Harptree Road, East Harptree, Somerset, BS40 6BQ St. Michael's Cemetery, St. Michael's Road, Lower Weston, Bath, BA1 3BJ Smallcombe Cemetery, 6 Widcombe Hill, Bath, BA2 6DD St. James Cemetery, Lower Bristol Road, Bath, BA2 3BQ

The decision	The Cabinet Member agrees to approve the recommendation to go to full Consultation.
Rationale for decision	Introducing PSPO's to require dogs to be kept on leads in cemeteries is a proactive step toward ensuring these spaces remain safe, clean, and respectful for all visitors, council staff, contractors and the public alike. The initiative aligns with the local authority's commitment to enhancing community well-being and maintaining public spaces. Despite previous efforts including signage, staff engagement, and public communications, non-compliance and abuse toward staff have persisted, necessitating a formal enforcement tool.
