1 THE ISSUE

- 1.1 An application has been received for the Variation of an existing Premises Licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of The Greyhound, 1 High Street, Midsomer Norton, BA3 2LE (Annex A).

2 RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 That the sub committee determine the application to vary the licence.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 There are no financial implications arising from this report.

4 THE REPORT

- 4.1 An application has been received for the variation of a Premises Licence.

- 4.2 The current Premises Licence permits the following licensable activities:

- 1) **Sale of alcohol** for consumption **on and off** the premises between the following hours:

Monday to Wednesday 11:00 – 00:00

Thursday 11:00 – 00:30

Friday and Saturday 11:00 – 01:00

- 2) **Regulated entertainment** by way of the performance of **Live Music** and the provision of **Recorded Music** (indoors only) between the following hours:

Monday to Wednesday 11:00 – 00:00

Thursday 11:00 – 00:30

Friday and Saturday 11:00 – 01:00

Sunday 12:00 – 00:30

- 3) **Regulated entertainment** by way of **Other Entertainment** within the Act between the following hours:

Monday to Wednesday 11:00 – 00:00

Thursday 11:00 – 00:30

Friday and Saturday 11:00 – 01:00

Sunday 11:00 – 00:30

Non standard timings:

A further additional hour into the morning following every Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday for each May Bank Holiday, Spring/Whitsun Bank Holiday and every August Bank Holiday Weekend.

A further additional hour into the morning following every Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday for the Easter Bank Holiday Weekend.

A further additional hour every Christmas Eve and Boxing Day.

From normal activity start time on New Year's Eve until normal activity finish time on New Year'

- 4) The **opening hours** for the premises are as follows:

Monday to Wednesday 11:00 – 00:30

Thursday to Saturday 11:00 – 01:00

Sunday 12:00 – 01:00

Non standard opening times:

A further additional hour into the morning following every Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday for each May Bank Holiday, Spring/Whitsun Bank Holiday and every August Bank Holiday Weekend.

A further additional hour into the morning following every Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday for the Easter Bank Holiday Weekend.

A further additional hour every Christmas Eve and Boxing Day.

From normal opening time on New Year's Eve until normal closing time on New Year's Day.

- 5) The licence is subject to the **conditions** detailed in Annex 1 and Annex 2 of the current premises licence which is appended at Annex B of this report.

4.3 The variation applied for seeks:

- to extend the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol on a Friday and Saturday from 01:00 hours the following morning **to** 02:00 hours the following morning
- to maintain 30 minutes drinking up time following the last permitted sale of alcohol;
- to permit the premises to open at 08:00 hours every day;
- to remove the following duplicate condition:

"There shall be no discounted prices on drinks, no drinks promotions and no "Happy Hours"".

All other hours, licensable activities and conditions are to remain the same.

4.4 A site plan is attached at Annex C.

4.5 The Licensing Act 2003 (Section 4) states that it is the duty of all Licensing Authorities to carry out their functions under the Act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:-

- a) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.
- b) Public Safety.
- c) The Prevention of Public Nuisance, and
- d) The Protection of Children from Harm.

Each objective is of equal importance; there are no other licensing objectives so these four are of paramount consideration at all times. When considering applications/representations /notifications the Licensing Authority will have regard to these licensing objectives.

- 4.6 The Licensing Authority may vary and grant the application with or without additional conditions.
- 4.7 The Licensing Authority can refuse the variation or part of the variation as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 4.8 The Licensing Authority may not however do anything to reduce the effect of the rights guaranteed by the existing premises licence.
- 4.9 The Licensing Authority should also have regard to the Council's Licensing Policy, the Statutory Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and the Licensing Act itself, and in particular to:-
- a) Paragraphs 3, 5, 6, 9, 10, 15 - 20, 23.5, 24, 28, 30, 33, 35 – 37 & 41 - 44 of the policy.

b) Chapters 8, 9 and 10 of the Statutory Guidance (as revised on 28 June 2007)..

c) Sections 4, 9, 10, 13, 34, 35, 36, 182 and 183 of the Act.

4.10 If the application is refused the applicant may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates Court.

If the application is granted the person making the relevant representation may appeal within 21 days of the notification to the Magistrates Court.

On appeal the court may either dismiss the appeal; substitute the decision appealed against for any other decision which could have been made by the Licensing Authority, or remit the case to the Licensing Authority to dispose of it in accordance with the direction of the court. The court may make such order for costs as it thinks fit.

4.11 In accordance with the requirements of the Act the applicants served copies of the application upon the Police, the Fire Authority, Environmental Health, Development Control, Trading Standards, and the Child Protection Agency.

4.12 The applicant is required to place a notice at the premises for a period of 28 days starting the day after the application is made and place an advert in a local newspaper within 10 days for submitting the application to the licensing authority.

4.13 A representation has been received from the Police in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder objective (Annex D). The representation proposes that the following condition be added to the premises licence should it be granted:

“No alcohol will be consumed in any outside area after 12 midnight”

The applicant's solicitor has agreed in writing to this condition (Annex F).

4.14 Relevant representations have been received from interested parties living in or carrying out a business within the vicinity of the premises in relation to the following licensing objectives (Annex E):

- the prevention of crime and disorder;
- the prevention of public nuisance;
- public safety; and
- the protection of children from harm.

4.15 This report has not been sent to the Trades Union because they would have no involvement in this application.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children: (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act); (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less; (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring; (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability). NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

From 1 October 2010:

4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied

having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures. NB THIS CONDITION DOES NOT APPLY TO OFF SALES.

Admission of children is restricted in accordance with the recommendation by the British Board of Film Classification.

If the film has not been classified the restriction of children must be approved by the Licensing Authority.

("Children" means any person under 18 years).

Any individual employed to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Licensing Act 1964 Section 77 rules apply.

Music singing and dancing must be a licensable activity allowed on the premises; and



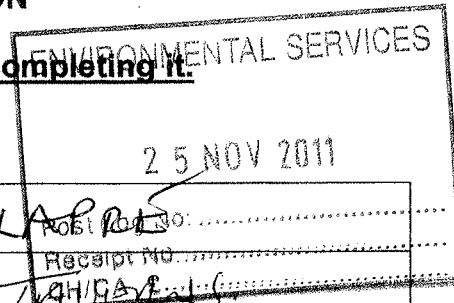



Dear Sirs

I write in opposition to the above application. As a Midsomer Norton Town Councillor I have been approached by many local residents that would be adversely affected by the increase in the operating hours of these premises.

I would firstly like to draw the Licensing Teams attention to the fact that although the notice may have been placed in the window of the premises when stated, the premises were covered in scaffolding until Friday 25th November and a pressure washer was being used to clean the exterior of the building. The notice was not easily visible until the scaffolding was removed and the spray of water ceased. I would expect the notice period to now be extended to allow local residents to be able to make proper representation.

I object to the application on the grounds as follows:-

Crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour. The level of late night drinking in the town is already unacceptable and recognised to be so by both the town and B&NES council. The town council has just begun a new initiative along with B&NES council to try and find ways to reduce this. An increase in late night drinking in the town will only increase the already very high levels of drunk and disorderly behaviour that blights the town during the weekends. Drug taking and violence has occurred in the vicinity of the premises on a regular basis. Local residents have witnessed this on numerous occasions and they have found the police presence unable to cope with the situation even now let alone increasing it any further. Increasing the operating hours will just compound the problem and encourage a greater number of people into the town. I have been informed by a local resident that on a recent occasion the ambulance service refused to attend an incident until police were there as they felt that Midsomer Norton High Street was not safe for the ambulance crew on a Saturday night.

Public Safety. The pavement area outside the Greyhound is narrow and right on a roundabout and the main road through the town. Groups of drunks trying to cross the road often play 'chicken' with the traffic outside the premises. This causes great danger to motorists as well as the participants. There is no safe crossing to the other side of the road and this area of the town is difficult to access as the pavement and road is narrow. There is no suitable place to pull in by car or taxi without holding up the flow of traffic.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance. Residents throughout Midsomer Norton are already affected by late night noise and anti-social behaviour from drunk and disorderly people returning home through residential areas after a late night drinking. This issue needs to be reduced and not increased. I have been contacted by residents all over Midsomer Norton in Priory Close, Withes Park and Charlton Park who are woken up in the early hours of the morning by noisy drunks returning home after a night partying. Litter is thrown into residents gardens, drunks urinate on their front doors and vomit is a regular sight on an early Sunday morning. Midsomer Norton does not have the infrastructure to cope with an increase in late night drinking. A further venue offering late night drinking will only encourage more people to come into the town and return home later. The venue is close to a large number of residential properties as well as right next door to the main parish church.

I trust that the above will clearly show why this application should be refused.

Please can you inform me of the date and time this application will go before the licensing committee.

As a ward councillor I speak to residents on their doorsteps, and a consistent topic of concern in Midsomer Norton is the loutish behaviour and unpleasant atmosphere in the town in the evenings. A number of people say they would not feel comfortable venturing into the public space of the town centre at this time.

Before the recent closure of the facility at the Greyhound for refurbishment I spent an evening observing the rowdyism and loutish behaviour for myself, from the vantage point of the Town Hall: people with beers in their hand holding up the traffic to chat (actually to shout) to their mates in a car; shouting to each other in language laced with obscenities which intimidates any sober and decent passers-by; scantily dressed women reeling along making screeching noises and pulling plants out of the planters; an idiot banging his head on the plate glass of Barons the Estate Agents; frequent public urination at Mansfield House and Hobbs the Gunsmiths. A lot of the unpleasantness in the public space was caused by pedestrian traffic between Moonjuice and the Wunderbar (Greyhound).

As a ward councillor I have found myself sympathising with Michael Goulds Estate Agents next to The Greyhound after their plate glass was smashed in. As a resident living just off the High Street I used to be woken regularly at 2.30 am by loud drunks making their way home.

While some of this behaviour continues, it has diminished of late, probably because we have enjoyed the services of only one night club for a couple of months. Meanwhile the Town Council is trying to do something about the whole situation, and a Community Alcohol Partnership is being set up led by the B&NES Community Safety department, with the cooperation of the Town Council and the police. If the pilot scheme in Midsomer Norton is successful, it may be rolled out across the Authority. This proposed extension in licensing hours would be a major setback to these efforts.

If we had a sophisticated clientele for nightclubs in Midsomer Norton this extension into the small hours in our town might be acceptable. We do not. The latest custom for homegoing revellers, for instance, is to push each other into hedges, damaging people's gardens and making their lives that bit more miserable.

You will hear representations from neighbours with details about the effect of the existing small hours licence, to 1am plus 30 minutes drinking up time. The proposed extension will push the disruption further into the middle of the night. At present I understand the police find it efficient to work with the staggered closing times of the local venues, with an hour's gap between The Greyhound and Fat Sams. The extension would make the exit more difficult to manage, I believe.

The evidence of the police will be crucial to this application, so I want to make public the fact that I had a conversation with the Beat Manager for Midsomer Norton, Tony Rogerson, on the morning of Sunday 27th November, and for whatever reason, the fact is that he had only just heard about the application. Because of the time constraint it may be that the police do not make an objection at this stage, so it is vital that a hearing occurs so that they have time to make a considered submission, if they wish and assuming the rules allow that.

I regret feeling compelled to make this objection, since in an ideal world this extension of licensing hours would be a simple economic boost for its projectors and for the community. Unfortunately, we have a culture which means that alcohol is accompanied by bad behaviour, and the downside of this application in my view easily outweighs the up.

I suppose the rules don't allow it, but from the public order point of view and in the interests of residents, if there is a competition issue, it would far better to take an hour off the closing time of Fat Sam's, than to extend by a further hour the supply of alcohol at the Wunderbar.

Midsomer Norton is a small rural town of 10,000 souls and the last thing it needs is another extension of alcohol supply into the middle of the night.

With regard to the application made by The Greyhound, Midsomer Norton, to extend their licensing hours, I wish to make a formal representation as I am objecting primarily to prevent public nuisance.

I apologise for the lateness of this objection but we were only made aware of the application a few days ago as the notice was not clearly displayed at the venue, therefore I am sure you can understand we have not had much time to prepare.

I am both a local business located in Midsomer Norton High Street, and a local resident of Midsomer Norton, I also operate the Norton Radstock & District Pubwatch Scheme whose aims are to protect patrons and local residents from issues of anti-social behaviour and risk to public safety.

Therefore my objections are based of the following issues:

Prevention of crime and disorder.

We experience issues of anti-social behaviour in the High Street on a weekly basis, these issue is compounded by the lack of Police presence in the area, particularly on Friday and Saturday nights when there is often no Police presence and in the case of an incident officers need to be drafted in from Keynsham or further afield, it can often take more than 1 hour for officers to attend. Due to a lack of Police presence a large amount of these incidents go unreported.

This issue will increase with the patrons exiting two High Street venues at 2:30am.

Public Safety.

The venue in question has converted the first floor to a Dance Floor, this does not meet current fire regulations, according to licensing has a capacity of 200 people and has only a single stairway access and therefore would endanger public safety, there have been no checks by planning to ensure meeting building regulations.

Prevention of public nuisance.

The venue has a large amount of residential properties and a Hotel located all within 20 metres of the building, my own property is in close proximity to this venue, there have been no noise reports or tests produced to measure ambient noise levels and the impact on local residents, there are no provisions for noise leakage such as sound insulation of windows, door sound control, and no provision for noise metering. In summary no attempt to meet the requirements of the Environmental departments regulations on Noise Control.

Local residents in close proximity to this venue regularly experience disturbances from people exiting this venue in the early hours.

As you are aware our venue has been required to meet building, fire and noise regulations to ensure that we operate in these hours safely and without impact on local residents, none of which have been applied in this application.

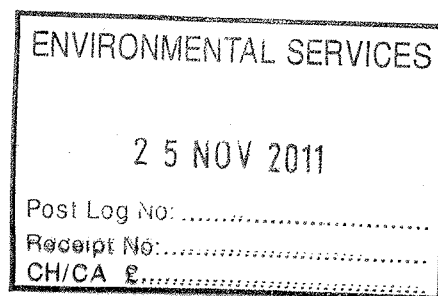

There is residential housing close to the premises and on the nearby routes taken by customers making their way home.

The principal reason for our representation is that residents already suffer problems of nuisance and disorder which cause disturbance late into the night as listed below, which deprives residents and their children of sleep and causes risks to health. The suggested extension of the opening hours would extend these problems into the early hours of the morning, 4 am and beyond, as customers gradually disperse. We regard this as totally unacceptable.


